THE CONSTITUTION OF SRI LANKA 1972

Delegation Order under Section 119

I, Maithripala Senanayake, Minister of Irrigation, Power and Highways, do hereby order in terms of section 119 (1) of the Constitution of Sri Lanka that all powers of dismissal and disciplinary control of State Officers serving in the departments specified in the Schedule hereto the initial of whose consolidated salary scale is less than Rs. 6,720 per annum, as delegated by the former Public Service Commission prior to the present Constitution of Sri Lanka shall, with effect from 22nd May, 1972, and until other or further provisions are made, be deemed to be powers delegated to the same State Officers and under the same terms and conditions, mutatis, mutandis, as contained in the respective Delegation Orders and the Rules issued by the said Public Service Commission, subject, however to the following conditions:—

- (a) that such powers shall now be exercised in terms of the Rules of Discipline and such other and further instructions as may be issued from time to time by the Cabinet of Ministers or by me.
- (b) that a State Officer shall not exercise any power of dismissal or other punishment in any case where it is decided by me in terms of section 119 (1) of the Constitution that such powers of punishment as delegated to such State Officer shall be exercised by me.
- (c) that a State Officer aggrieved by an order relating to a disciplinary matter including an order of dismissal made under the powers delegated to me may appeal therefrom to the State Services Disciplinary Board or to me as may be necessary under section 119 of the Constitution

I do also hereby order that, subject to the Rules of Discipline issued by the Cabinet of Ministers or any further or other Orders issued by the Cabinet of Ministers or by me, powers of dismissal and disciplinary control not delegated by the former Public Service Commission, as aforesaid, but exercised by itself, shall now be exercised in respect of State Officers the initial of whose consolidated salary is less than Rs. 6,720 per annum by the Head of each Department specified in the Schedule hereto.

REGULATIONS made by the Minister of Fisheries by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 20 (11) and 33 of the Fisheries Ordinance (Chapter 212), and approved by the National State Assembly under sub-section (4) of section 33 of the said Ordinance.

Regulations

- These regulations may be cited as the Back Bay Fishing Regulations, 1973.
- These regulations shall apply to that portion of the Ceylon waters known as "Back Bay" in Trincomalee, (excluding the Sally Port area), hereinafter referred to as "Back Bay Fishing Area" and described in Schedule A hereto.
- No person shall fish by means of a net known as "karavalai" in that portion of the Back Bay Fishing Area adjacent to the shore line defined in Schedule B hereto.
- No fisherman other than a local fisherman shall anchor a mechanized fishing boat in the Back Bay Fishing Area except in the area referred to in regulation 3.

5. Every fisherman, other than a local fisherman shall anchor his mechanized fishing boat in the area north of the pipe-line which juts out into Back Bay and which is situated north of the area defined in Schedule B hereto.

6. Within the Back Bay fishing area—

- no person shall take fish, except by means of a Karavalai net or by means of rod and line; and
- no person shall take fish by means of a karavalai net or by means of rod and line, unless he is a local fisherman.

7. Notwithstanding anything in regulation 6, fishermen, other than local fishermen, not exceeding two hundred and fifty in number, shall be permitted to fish in the Back Bay Fishing Area by means of rod and line, on obtaining permits issued by the Director or by an officer authorised by him in that behalf.

8. No person, other than a local fisherman, shall—

- operate by fishing boat from Back Bay for the purpose of taking fish, or
- land at any place on the foreshore adjacent to Back Bay Fishing Area any fish, or beach a fishing boat used for the purpose of taking fish outside that area, or

(c) anchor in the area referred to in regulation 5 any fishing boat used for the purpose of taking fish outside the Back Bay Fishing Area, unless he is the holder of a permit issued for the purpose by the Director or by an officer authorised by him in that behalf.

9. The number of permits to be issued under regulation 8 shall be determined by the Director, in consultation with the Government Agent of the Administrative District of Trincomalee.

10. Every person desirous of obtaining a permit under regulation 7 or 8 shall make written application therefor in such form as may be approved for the purpose by the Director, on or before such date as may be fixed by him for the purpose.

11. Every permit issued under regulation 7—

- (a) shall be substantially in the form prescribed in Schedule C hereto;
- (b) shall be subject to the conditions specified in the permit; and
- (c) unless earlier cancelled, shall remain in force for such period as is specified in the permit.

12. Every permit issued under regulation 8—

- (a) shall be substantially in the form set out in Schedule D hereto;
- (b) shall be subject to the conditions specified in the permit; and
- (c) unless earlier cancelled, shall remain in force for such period as is specified in the permit.

13. When in the course of operating a karavalai net, after both ends of such net are brought ashore for the purpose of being drawn, no person shall use any rod and line or cast any other net or operate any fishing boat for the purpose of taking fish within the area encircled by such karavalai net.

14. In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires the expressions "Director", "fish", "take" and "Ceylon Waters" shall have the same meanings respectively as in the Fisheries Ordinance (Chapter 212);

"local fisherman" means a fisherman who is permanently resident in the area adjacent to the Back Bay; and

"Sally Port Fishing Area" means the Sally Port Fishing Areas A and B specified in Schedules A and B to the Sally Port Fishing Regulations 1941, as amended subsequently.

SCHEDULE A

BACK BAY FISHING AREA

The area bounded as follows:—by a straight line drawn south-eastwards from Elizabeth point till it intersects the prolongation of the western boundary of M. S. P. 86—E. P. thence south-westwards along the said prolongation and the western boundary of the said M. S. O. to the foreshore of Back Bay; thence north-westwards, northwards and north-eastwards along the said foreshore crossing the outlet of salt-lake to the starting point of the area.

Regulations

The Sally Port Fishing Regulations 1941, published in *Gazette* No. 8,796 of September 26, 1941, as amended by Regulations

published in *Gazette* No. 9,053 of December 18, 1942, are hereby further amended as follows:—

1. in regulation 3—

(a) by the substitution, for the definition "Assistant Government Agent" means the Assistant Government Agent, Trincomalee", of the definition "Assistant Government Agent" means and includes the Government Agent, Trincomalee";

(b) by the insertion immediately after the last definition of the following new definitions:—

"Karavalai" means a shore seine net which is set in water and hauled or dragged on to the shore by its two ends, and is made up of three component parts, namely, Kamban, Karavalai and Salva Madiya".

"Adasuvalai" means a shore seine net which is set in water and hauled or dragged on to the shore by its two ends and is made up of three component parts, namely, Kamban, Thiruchan and Adasuvalai; the Adasuvalai containing meshes not less than 2 inches in length measured diagonally from knot to knot when stretched".

2. in regulation 4, by the insertion immediately after paragraph (b) thereof, of the following new paragraph:—

"(c) be granted a permit unless he is an active fisherman who is permanently resident within the urban council limits of Trincomalee and is the owner of a boat or fishing craft registered in accordance with regulations made under the Fisheries Ordinance".

3. (a) by the renumbering of regulation 5, as regulation 5 (1); and

(b) by the substitution, in the renumbered regulation 5 (1) for the words "Within Area B, no person shall" of the words "Subject to the provisions of regulation 5 (3), within area B no person shall"

4. by the insertion immediately after the renumbered regulation 5 (1) of the following new paragraph:—

"(2) within area B, no person shall between the 1st day of April and the 30th day of September, in any year—

(a) fish except by means of a karavalai net or by means of a rod and line or hand net; such line or hand net being thrown from the rocks or the sea shore; or, by means of a rod and line thrown from any boat or fishing craft;

(b) fish by means of a karavalai net or by means of a rod and line thrown from a boat or fishing craft unless he is the holder of a permit issued on that behalf by the Government Agent".

"(3) no person other than the group of persons operating Adasuvalai nets in area B, as set out in Schedule C, or the group of persons operating Karavalai nets in Uyanthapadu at the time these regulations come into force, shall operate either an Adasuvalai or Karavalai net in Sally Port Area B, provided however that under no condition shall the right to operate such net accrue to the Heirs, Successors or Assigns of such persons".

5. in regulation 6—

(a) by the substitution in paragraphs (1) and (5) thereof for the words "under regulation 4 (b) or regulation 5 (b)" of the words "under regulation 4 (b), 5 (1) (b) or 5 (2) (b)".

(b) by the insertion immediately after paragraph (2) thereof, of the following proviso:—

"Provided however that every application for a permit under regulation 4 (b) shall be accompanied by—

(i) a declaration signed by the Grama Sevaka of the area in which the applicant is resident to the effect that the applicant is presently resident within the urban council limits of Trincomalee;

(ii) a declaration signed by the Fishery Inspector of the area to the effect that the applicant is an active fisherman and is the owner of a fishing craft registered and marked in terms of regulations made under the Fisheries Ordinance".

6. in regulation 7—

(a) by the substitution in paragraphs (1) and (4) thereof for the words "under regulation 5 (c)" of the words "under regulation 5 (1) (c)".

(b) (i) by the renumbering of paragraphs (2) and (3) thereof as paragraphs (3) and (4) and;

(ii) by the substitution in the renumbered paragraphs (3) and (4) for the expression "under paragraphs (1)" of the expression "under paragraphs (1) and (2)".

(c) (i) by the renumbering of paragraph (4) thereof as paragraph (5) and;

(ii) by the substitution in the renumbered paragraphs (5) for the words "under regulation 5 (c)" of the words "under regulation 5 (1) (c)".

(d) by the insertion immediately after paragraph (1) thereof of the following new paragraph:—

Decision under Section 34 of the Industrial Disputes Act

The dispute between the parties above named was referred to me for settlement by arbitration and Award issued under

section 17 of the Industrial Disputes Act on the 13th of December, 1972. The terms of that Award are as follows:—

- The workman to be reinstated in service within 45 days of publication of this Award in the *Gazette*.
- Upon being reinstated the workman's service to be deemed not to have been interrupted by his period of non-employment.
- The workman to be entitled to emoluments not less favourable than those enjoyed by him at the time of his dismissal from service as from the date set out in Clause I of this Award.
- The workman to be entitled to back wages commuted to the sum of Rs. 8,000 in lieu of back wages which sum of Rs. 8,000 should be deposited by the respondent above named with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Ratnapura, on or before the lapse of 60 days from the publication of this Award in the *Gazette*.
- The respondent to be entitled as an alternative to paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of this Award to pay to the workman—(over and above the said sum of Rs. 8,000 referred to in Clause 4 hereof), a further sum of Rs. 6,000, this option being exercisable by depositing with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Ratnapura, to the credit of the workman the said sum of Rs. 6,000 on or before the lapse of 60 days from the date of the publication of this Award in the *Government Gazette*.

In the event of such deposit for whatever reason not being made as heretofore set out the management to be presumed to have waived the option given to it in this paragraph as an alternative to paragraphs 1, 2 and 3.

Thereafter the respondent made an application to this Tribunal for interpretation so as to clarify the position as to the conditions upon which the workman would be entitled to withdraw the monies deposited. This matter came up for hearing on 07.03.73, and the applicant Union and workman were represented by Advocate W. A. de Silva instructed by Proctor Sarath Ranasinghe. Mr. Sundaralingam of Messrs. F. J. & G. de Saram appeared for the respondent.

The workman is in occupation of premises on the estate which had been given to him during the pendency of this inquiry at the instance of this Tribunal. The respondent contended that the withdrawal monies to be deposited in favour of the workman should be conditional upon the workman vacating these premises. This is a matter which should have been specifically dealt with in the Award.

At the inquiry the respondent stated that it would be exercising the option given to it under paragraph 5 and would be depositing both the sum of Rs. 8,000 referred to in paragraph 4 as well as sum of Rs. 6,000 referred to in paragraph 5.

Of consent it was agreed that the withdrawal of the monies would be subject to the following conditions:—

1. The sum of Rs. 8,000 referred to in paragraph 4 to be deposited in cash or by cheque drawn in favour of the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Ratnapura.

2. Of the sum of Rs. 6,000 referred to in paragraph 5, a sum of Rs. 2,000 to be transmitted by cheque or Money Order drawn in favour of the workman, Mr. A. Weerasekera.
3. The balance sum of Rs. 4,000 referred to in paragraph 5 to be deposited in favour of Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Ratnapura.
4. The workman, Mr. A. Weerasekera to be entitled to withdraw the cheque of Rs. 2,000 drawn in his favour as soon as deposit is made.
5. The balance sum of Rs. 12,000 to be withdrawn by the workman only upon his producing to the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Ratnapura, a certificate from the Superintendent of the estate that the said A. Weerasekera has on or before 30.04.73, handed over the premises referred to in this decision and quit Kiribathgalla Estate.
6. If for whatever reason the said workman fails to quit the premises as stipulated herein on or before 30.04.73, the said sum of Rs. 12,000 is liable to forfeiture at the instance of the respondent.

The parties above-named are hereby ordered to give effect to these terms. A copy of this decision is sent to Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Ratnapura, for necessary action.

REPORT OF THE LOAN BOARD FOR THE YEAR 1970

THE Commissioners of the Loan Board present their report on the activities of the Loan Board during the financial year ended 31st December, 1970, along with the audited Accounts for the same period.

Funds :

The funds of the Loan Board comprise of deposits held on behalf of the Supreme Court and District Courts suitors of which the Commissioners are Trustees.

Activities :

The main activity of the Loan Board is the management and investment of Suitors deposits to the best advantage of the suitors. These funds are utilised for investment in Government securities, for granting of loans for construction of residential houses and on mortgages of house property. The earnings on these funds are used for the payment of half-yearly dividends to suitors.

- (a) *Investment on Government securities.*—The bulk of the funds (about 83%) is invested on Government securities thereby making them available to the Government for the development programme.

The rate of interest for both categories of loans was seven per centum per annum.
