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6. This amount will be refunded only on the successful completion of the contract. 9. The successful tenderer will have to bear the cost of stamps which are to be affixed to the agreement.

10. The Director of Agriculture reserves the right to terminate the contract for unsatisfactory work and non fulfillment of the conditions of the contract. In this event the Director of Agriculture reserves the right to make alternative arrangements for the completion of the work at the contractor's cost and expenses.

11. The Director of Agriculture reserves himself the right to reject all tenders and to accept any part of a tender.

14. Any failure on the part of the contractor to fulfil this condition in the contract shall render the contract liable to cancellation, provided however, that in exceptional circumstances the officer with whom the contract is entered into may permit the employment by the contractor of non-Ceylonese labourers specifically approved by him in writing with the concurrence of the Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Agriculture and Food.

The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers without such approval in writing and concurrence is forbidden and will be deemed a breach of contract.

The term "Ceylonese" for purpose of this contract shall mean and include a citizen of Ceylon by descent or registration.

The contractor shall pay a fair wage to every section of the workers employed by him in respect of this contract and in terms of all regulations now in force or which may hereafter come into force relating to the payment of wages to workers.

The contractor shall be bound to allow any officer of the Agricultural Department duly authorised to do so by the Director of Agriculture to have access to and to inspect his books, check rolls, muster rolls and other documents relating to labour employed by him in connection with this work.

15. All notices to be served upon the contractor shall be deemed to have been served if given to him personally or sent through the post to the address provided by him.

16. The contractor shall indemnify the Government against any claim by or in respect of an employee of the contractor under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934. (Cap. 117).

17. The Government reserves the right to object to the employment by the tenderer of any workmen whose employment is not desirable.

18. No contract will be entered into with any person whose names appears in the Crown List of defaulting contractors individually or jointly with any other person whose name is in the defaulters list or whom
