BY-LAWS made by the Municipal Council of Galle under sections 267 and 272 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance (Chapter 252), approved by the Minister of Public Administration, Local Government and Home Affairs by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 268 of that Ordinance and confirmed by the National State Assembly.

## BY-LAW RELATING TO PUBLIC LIBRARY

1. The public library established and maintained by the Galle Municipal Council shall consist of:—

- (a) a Lending Library;
- (b) a Reference Library;
- (c) a Reading Room; and
- (d) a Children's Library;

2. (1) The general administration of the public library shall be vested in a library Committee (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") composed of—

- (a) the Mayor for the time being of the Galle Municipal Council;
- (b) the Secretary of the Council who shall function as ex-officio Secretary of the Committee;
- (c) such other Members of the Galle Municipal Council not exceeding four as may be elected by the Council;
- (d) seven prominent residents of the Municipal area, elected by the Galle Municipal Council.

(2) The librarian in charge of the public library shall be responsible for the maintenance of order in such library.

3. (1) The Mayor of the Galle Municipal Council shall be ex-officio President of the Committee and he shall preside at every meeting of the Committee. In the absence of the Mayor at any meeting, such member of the Committee as may be elected for the purpose by the other members present, shall preside at that meeting.

(2) The presiding member at any meeting shall have an original vote and a casting vote if the votes cast on any question are equal.

4. No business shall be transacted at any meeting of the Committee unless there is a quorum of 3 members.

5. The Committee shall have the power to allow any person to use any part of the premises of the public library, subject to such conditions as it may deem necessary, or to refuse such person the use of any part of those premises, if such person has contravened any of these by-laws relating to the library.

#### LENDING LIBRARY

6. (1) No person shall be admitted as a member of the Lending Library unless he—

- (a) is not less than 12 years of age;
- (b) is literate;
- (c) is resident, or has an office or a place of business within the Municipal limits;
- (d) deposits with the Librarian a sum of Rs. 5 for the removal of one book, and Rs. 10 for the removal of two books.
- (e) is recommended by the owner or occupier of a house fetching a monthly rental of not less than Rs. 25.

(2) Every person desirous of being admitted as a member of the Lending Library shall make application in that behalf on the form obtainable from the librarian and shall have such application endorsed by anyone of the following persons who shall be deemed to be the guarantor:

- (a) a member of National State Assembly;
- (b) a member of Galle Municipal Council;
- (c) a member of the Committee;
- (d) a Minister of Religion;
- (e) a member of the medical or legal profession;
- (f) a Justice of the Peace;
- (g) a government servant whose name appears in the annual Civil List;
- (h) a Principal of a Maha Vidyalaya; or
- (i) a member of the Local Government Services, residing within the administrative limits of the Local Authority where the library is situated, and whose current basic annual salary is not less than Rs. 1,500 per annum.

(3) The Guarantor shall be liable for all fines, loss of books and other reading material, incurred by the member, and shall not be a guarantor for more than two members.

(4) No person who is entitled under paragraph (2) to endorse an application shall be required to have his own application so endorsed.

7. The librarian shall issue one ticket for a deposit of Rs. 5 and two tickets for a deposit of Rs. 10 to every person who is admitted as a member of the Lending Library and such person shall be entitled to borrow one book on each such ticket.

8. A member of the Lending Library shall be responsible for any book removed from such library on a ticket issued to him.

9. Where a member of the Lending Library loses a ticket issued to him under by-law 7 he shall immediately give notice of such loss to the librarian. If the librarian is satisfied that no book has been borrowed from the Lending Library on such ticket, he may issue to such member a duplicate ticket on the payment of a sum of cents fifty. No such duplicate ticket shall be issued by the librarian unless there has elapsed a period of not less than thirty days from the date on which the loss was brought to his notice. The issue of a duplicate shall not release a borrower from his responsibility for books which may at any time be taken out with his original tickets.

10. Any change of residence or of official address on the part of the borrower must be intimated in writing to the librarian within one week of such change under penalty of the forfeiture of the borrowers deposit and tickets and the cancellation of the same at the discretion of the Librarian.

11. Borrowers ceasing to reside within the Municipal limits, are required to return their tickets to the Library, in order to have them cancelled; otherwise they shall be held responsible for any books taken out in their names.

12. Membership should be renewed every year. Such renewal shall not involve any fresh deposit, but only the filling up of the normal Membership application form guaranteed by one of those specified in by-law 6 (2) (a) to (i).

13. Any book borrowed by a member from the Lending Library shall be returned to the Librarian within a period of fourteen days from the date on which it was borrowed. The member may be allowed by the Librarian to borrow any such book for a further period of fourteen days, if it is not required by any other member. Books may be so renewed by producing them personally or through the Guarantor, at the Library.

14. Where a member fails to return any book he has borrowed from the Lending Library to the Librarian within the period of fourteen days referred to in By-law 13, he shall be liable to a fine of ten cents for each day the book is overdue.

15. Where a member fails to return any book he has borrowed from the Lending Library within 30 days from the date on which it was borrowed, the Library Authority shall be entitled to take steps to recover from the borrower or the guarantor, by action at law, with costs, the book, or at the option of the Library Authority, the value thereof, plus detention fees due on such overdue book, in terms of by-law 14.

16. No member shall damage or injure in any manner any book he has borrowed from the Lending Library. Members are requested to keep the books clean. They shall not turn down leaves or make pencil or other marks upon them.

17. It shall be the duty of every member to bring to the notice of the Librarian any damage or injury in any book he intends to borrow from the Lending Library. Where he has failed to bring any such damage or injury to the notice of the Librarian such book shall be presumed to have been issued to him without any injury or damage.

18. Where the Librarian is satisfied that any book returned by a member has been soiled (except by fair wear and tear), written in, marked, or otherwise injured, the borrower must immediately replace such book, or the set of books to which it may belong, or pay the value thereof or such other penalty as the Mayor may see fit to impose. In the case of refusal or neglect to do so, such value shall be recoverable by action at law with costs. When a new copy of a book or set of books is deposited or paid for to replace the one that has been injured, the person depositing or paying for the same shall be entitled to the damaged copy, after it has been stamped "The Public Library, ..... Sold as damaged."

19 (1) No member shall lend to any person any book borrowed by him from the Lending Library.

(2) Any member who contravenes the provision of paragraph (1) of this by-law shall forfeit his deposit and cease to be member of the Lending Library.

20. No member shall return to the Lending Library any book which to his knowledge has been used by any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease. Where such is the case, such book shall be destroyed and the member shall pay to the Librarian the cost of its replacement, or the set of books to which it may belong, or pay the value thereof at the discretion of Librarian.

21. Where any dispute arises between two or more members of the Lending Library as to which member should borrow a particular book, the Librarian shall decide such dispute.

22. Any member who desires to borrow any book which has already been borrowed by another member, shall enter his name and the title of the book in a register kept for that purpose and the Librarian shall, on such book being returned by the member who borrowed it, issue it to the member who has entered his name in the register. Where two or more members have entered their names in the register for any book, then such books shall be issued to them in the order in which they have entered their names in the register.

23. The deposit paid by any person in terms of by-law 6 (1) (d), shall, less any sum due from him to the Lending Library, be returned to him on his ceasing to be a member.

#### REFERENCE LIBRARY

24. No person shall make use of the Reference Library unless he—

- (a) has obtained permission from the Librarian for that purpose; and
- (b) has signed the register kept in the Reference Library.

25. No person shall take out of the Reference Library any book, issued to him for purposes of reference, or any other book or part thereof, any pamphlet, periodical, picture, painting, engraving, map, chart, plan, manuscript, document, print or newspaper forming part of the collection of the Reference Library.

## READING ROOM

26. No person shall make use of the Reading Room unless he—

- (a) has obtained permission from the Librarian for that purpose, and
- (b) has signed the register kept in the Reading Room.

27. No person shall remove from the Reading Room any newspaper, periodical, magazine, map, document manuscript, print, plan, chart, painting, picture, engraving, pamphlet or any other article placed in or belonging to the Reading Room.

## GENERAL

28. No person who is suffering or has recently suffered from any contagious, infectious or cutaneous disease or has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall enter the premises of the public library until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

29. No person shall—

- (1) behave in any disorderly manner or commit any nuisance in or about the premises of the public library;
- (2) damage or in any way deface any portion of the building, or any property of the Galle Municipal Council in or about the public library;
- (3) enter, remain or loiter about the premises of the public library after such library is closed, without being able to give a satisfactory account of himself or for his presence;
- (4) smoke or spit within the premises of the public library;
- (5) gamble with dice or cards or play any games within the premises of the public library;
- (6) disturb the users of the public library by shouting, singing songs or making any other noise in such library;
- (7) enter the premises of the public library in unclean or improperly clad attire;
- (8) bring any dog or other animal into the premises of the public library;

(9) sleep or eat any food in any part of the premises of the public library;

(10) enter or remain in any part of the library not set apart for the use of the public;

(11) assign any responsibility for the safe-keeping of any articles such as hats, umbrellas, sticks, bags, parcels or any other articles. Such articles shall be at the borrowers or readers own risk;

(12) wilfully or carelessly or negligently soil, tear, cut, deface, write upon, damage, injure or destroy any book or document forming part of the contents of the library or misuse or carelessly or negligently deface, injure or destroy any part of the library or any property, furniture or fittings therein;

30. Any person who in the premises of the library—  
(a) obstructs the librarian or any person acting under the orders of the Librarian, in the lawful exercise of his powers under these by-laws.

30. Any person who in the premises of the library—

- (a) behaves in a disorderly manner;
- (b) use violent abusive or obscene language;
- (c) bets or gambles; or

who after warning persists in remaining in the library beyond the hours fixed for the closing thereof or who is not entitled to the use of the library, or who is suffering from an infectious or offensive disease may be excluded or removed from the library by an officer or servant of the library authority.

31. The number of working hours of the Librarian shall not exceed 6½ hours. The lunch interval shall not exceed one hour.

32. Every contravention of by-laws 19, 25, 27, 28, 29 and 30 shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

33. In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the expression "Librarian" means the person appointed by the Local Government Service Commission to be in charge of the library and includes his assistants.
