**Examinations, Results of Examinations, &c.**

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE**

Efficiency Bar Examination for Officers in Executive Clerical Class (Grade II) of the Local Government Clerical Service—21.7.73

THE above examination will be conducted in Colombo, on 21.7.1973, by the Commissioner of Examinations.

2. *Applications.*—(a) Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo.

(b) Applications must be sent by registered post to reach the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, on or before 11.6.1973. Applications received after that date will be rejected.

(c) Candidates must forward their applications through the Head of the Local Authority in which they work. If any candidate fails to do so he will be regarded as disqualified.

(d) Candidates are requested to forward their applications to the Head of the Local Authority in which they work, well in time with a request that they may be transmitted to the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, on or before 11.6.1973.

(e) It has been decided to charge fees from the candidates who appear for this examination on the following basis:—

- (i) First Sitting—Free of Charge.
- (ii) Each subsequent sitting—Complete examination: Rs. 15, One Subject: Rs. 7.50.

The fees should be paid in revenue stamps duly cancelled by the candidate with his signature thereon.

Candidates who have already sat for this examination are required to pay the relevant fees as indicated above.

3. *Admission to the Examination.*—(i) The Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, will issue Admission Forms to those candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for the examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination, their forms of admission. A candidate not producing such forms, will be refused admittance to the examination.

(ii) Candidates must sit for the examination at the Examination Hall assigned to them. A candidate presenting himself at an Examination Hall other than the one assigned to him will be refused admittance to the examination.

(iii) A copy of the time table will be forwarded, together with the Admission Form. Every candidate presenting himself for the examination must hand over his admission forms to the Supervising Examiner on the day of the examination.

(iv) If a candidate does not receive his admission form at least seven days before the day of the examination, he should communicate with the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, giving the following particulars:—

- (1) Name of Examination:—

*N.B.*—Admission to the examination does not constitute acceptance of eligibility.

4. If a candidate is found to be ineligible according to the regulations for this examination, his candidature is liable to be cancelled at any stage prior to, during or after the examination.

5. *Leave to officers to attend examination.*—Heads of Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant duty leave to officers serving in their Councils, whose applications are accepted by the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, to present themselves at the examination.

6. *Identity Cards.*—Candidates will be required to prove their identity in the Examination Hall to the satisfaction of the Supervisor for each subject they offer. For this purpose any one of the following documents will be accepted:—

- (a) Identity Card issued by the Postmaster-General;
- (b) A valid Passport issued within three years preceding the date of this examination;
- (c) Any certificate, licence or other document embodying a photograph of the holder and issued within the 3 years preceding the date of the examination, on the authority of a Government Department.
- (d) A Passport size photograph with the following attestation on the reverse made by a person eligible to provide such attestation on the signature form.

Candidates who fail to produce their Identity Cards at the Examination Hall will be disqualified.

7. *Scheme of Examination.*—(i) The subjects of the examination and marks assigned to each subject are given below.

	<i>Marks</i>
(a) The two National Languages—Sinhala and Tamil. This examination will consist of two parts, namely—	
(i) Conversation and Interpretation	100
(ii) Reading and Writing	100

In the examination under Rule (a) (i) above, the candidate will be tested in conversation so as to satisfy the Examiner as to his power of understanding Sinhalese or Tamil of different classes; and making himself understood by them both in common conversation and in the course of official business. He will also be required to act as Interpreter between the Examiners and Sinhalese and Tamils entirely ignorant of English, the interpretation to be on matters connected with ordinary official business. The candidate will be required in this examination to obtain a minimum of 40 per cent of the total marks.

In the examination under Rule (a) (ii) above, the candidate will be required to write an English translation of two short Sinhala or Tamil Reports written in different running hands, to translate an English Order into Sinhala or Tamil and to read and translate an extract from a Sinhala or Tamil Notarial Deed and from the proceedings of a Rural Court Case and put into his hands for the first time. The candidate will be required in this examination to obtain a minimum of 40 per cent. of the total marks.

This paper will be divided into two parts, namely:—

Part I.—Questions on this part will be based on Municipal Councils, Urban Councils, Town Councils Ordinance and Rules and By-Laws framed thereunder, and Local Government Ordinance and Regulations framed thereunder.

Part II.—(a) Questions on this Part will be based on the following Ordinances, Rules, Regulations and By-Laws framed thereunder:—

(b) And Organisation of Municipal Council, Urban Council and Town Council Offices, Office System and Procedure.

(ii) Officers of Sinhalese, Tamil and Moor parentage will be required to pass in one language and accounts and Local Government Law.

(iii) Officers of other parentage will be required to pass in accounts and Local Government Law and one language (conversation and interpretation only).

(iv) Candidates for examination under Rule I (b) and (c) above will be required to obtain a minimum of 40 per cent. of the total marks in Accounts and Local Government Law.

(v) A candidate may take up the Language and the Accounts and Local Government Law Papers, if he so desires, separately and on different occasions.

8. *Exemption.*—(i) Officers who are over 50 years of age, i.e. on attaining their 50th (fiftieth) birthday on 11.6.1973 are exempted from the examination for promotion over the Efficiency Bar, provided their work and conduct warrant this concession, and after the Commission has satisfied itself in each case that the officer concerned merits this concession.

(ii) All officers who were transferred to the Local Government Service on April 1, 1946, are exempted from the National Language papers prescribed for this examination.

(iii) Those candidates who have passed any one of the following examinations will be eligible for exemption from subject Sinhala/Tamil:—

- (i) Proficiency Examination in Sinhala or Tamil either at the Advanced Level or the Ordinary Level.
- (ii) Proficiency Examination in Sinhala or Tamil either at Grade IV or Grade V level.
- (iii) Ceylon Senior School Certificate (Sinhala/Tamil) Examination.
- (iv) Ceylon Senior School Certificate (English Medium) Examination with Sinhala Language or Tamil Language as a subject.
- (v) Ceylon General Certificate of Education (Ordinary) Level Sinhala or Tamil Medium Examination.

### By-Laws

#### THE WARAKAPOLA TOWN COUNCIL

##### The Town Councils Ordinance

BY-LAWS made by the Warakapola Town Council under sections 152 and 156 of the Town Councils Ordinance (Chapter 256) and approved by the Minister of Public Administration, Local Government and Home Affairs, under section 153 of that Ordinance.

##### By-LAWS

1. (i) These by-laws may be cited as the Warakapola Public Fair by-laws, 1973.  
(ii) A fair to be called and known as "the Warakapola Public Fair" shall be held by the Council on every Saturday or on any other day fixed by the Council.
2. The area within a circle having a radius of four hundred and forty yards from the Warakapola Public Fair is hereby declared to be the market area for the Warakapola Public Fair.
3. (i) No person shall use or occupy any stall or place within the premises of the fair, unless he is the holder, or the servant or agent of the holder, of a permit issued by or under the authority of the Chairman.

(ii) Every permit issued under paragraph (1) shall be substantially in the form set out in Schedule I hereto and shall be in force for the day of issue only.

4. Every holder of a permit issued under by-law 3 shall pay a fee at the rate specified in Schedule II hereto for the use of a stall or space within the premises of the fair.

5. If the Council does not employ an officer to collect the fees payable under by-law 4, it may issue the right of collecting the fees to any approved person—

- (a) by private treaty; or
- (b) by calling for tenders; or
- (c) by putting the right to public auction.

6. (i) No holder of a permit issued under by-law 3 shall sell or expose for sale within the premises of the fair any meat. Provided, however, that any such article or commodity may be sold or exposed for sale under the authority of a special permit issued in that behalf by the Chairman.

(ii) No special permit shall be issued by the Chairman unless he is satisfied that there are good and sufficient reasons for issuing such a permit.

7. Any dispute arising between holders of permits issued under by-law 2 or their authorised servants, or between them and the public relating to the use of the fair, may be settled by any officer authorised by the Chairman, on duty within the premises of the fair.

8. Order within the premises of the fair shall be maintained by an officer of the Council appointed for the purpose and on duty within the premises of the fair.
9. Every person attending the fair for the sale or purchase of goods shall comply with any lawful order given by an officer of the Council or by a police officer, in settlement of any dispute or for the maintenance of order.
10. No person shall, within the premises of the fair—
  - (a) carry on any cooking; or
  - (b) behave in a disorderly manner or create any noise or disturbance or fight with any other person or use insulting, abusive or obscene language; or
  - (c) remain in or loiter about without being able to give a satisfactory account of himself after being ordered to leave by an officer of the Council or Grama Sevaka or Police Officer or any person acting under the authority of the Chairman.
11. (i) It shall be lawful for the Chairman or the Medical Officer of Health or for any Public Health Inspector, acting under the authority of the Chairman, to inspect and seize any article of food exposed for sale within the premises of the fair, which appears to him to be unwholesome.  
(ii) Where any article seized under paragraph (i) is certified by a government medical officer to be unwholesome, such article may be destroyed without payment of compensation to the person from whose possession it was seized.
12. (i) No person shall resist, obstruct, hinder or molest any person or officer appointed by the Chairman to superintend the fair in the execution of his duties.  
(ii) No person shall, resist, obstruct, hinder or molest any person appointed to collect the fees by the Council or (where the right to collect the fees has been leased) by the lessee, in the execution of his duties.
13. No person shall—
  - (a) construct any sheds or awnings, or leave mats or sacks in the premises of the fair earlier than 12 noon of the day preceding the holding of the fair; or
  - (b) leave any sheds, awnings, mats, sacks or any other goods in the premises of the fair later than 9 a.m. of the day following the holding of the fair.
14. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any other officer of the Council acting under the authority of the Chairman to remove any sheds, awnings,

mats, sacks or any other goods left in the premises of the fair after 9 a.m. of the day following the holding of the fair.

15. Every contravention of any of these by-laws shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees, and in the case of a continuing contravention, with an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees, for every day during which the contravention is continued after conviction by a Court of Competent jurisdiction or after service of a written notice from the Chairman or any officer authorised by the Chairman directing attention to such contravention.
