1. The Minutes on Pensions, dated February 5, 1934, as amended from time to time, are hereby further amended, by

the insertion immediately after section 48AA, of the following new section:—

48AB Where any pensionable state officer who had relinquished his office or post under the Government with its approval and accepted permanent employment in a statutory body is transferred to another statutory body or to several other statutory bodies in succession, he may retain any benefit or qualification that may have accrued to him under these Minutes and accordingly—

(a) in the event of his leaving any such statutory body in any of the following circumstances, that is to say—

(i) retirement on account of age or on the ground of ill-health or on any other ground approved by the Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration, Local Government and Home Affairs; or

(ii) abolition of office, the following award may be granted to him, namely, such award as might have been granted to him under these Minutes if he had been retired from the service of the Government on the ground of ill-health on the date on which he relinquished his post or office under the Government to accept permanent employment in a statutory body; or

(b) in the event of his death while in the employment of a statutory body, the following award under these Minutes may be granted to the person or persons to whom such award is payable under these Minutes, namely, such award as might have been granted under these Minutes, if he had died on the date on which he relinquished his post or office under the Government to accept permanent employment in a statutory body.

For the purposes of this section, the expressions "transferred" means the appointment from one statutory body to another statutory body with the approval of the former; and

"statutory body" means a Corporation, Board, University or any other institution established by statute and specified in Schedule H to section 48A of these Minutes or any other Corporation, Board, University or other institution as the Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration, Local Government and Home Affairs may determine to be a "statutory body" for the purposes of this section.

2. The amendments made in the Minutes on Pensions by paragraph 1 of this notification shall be deemed to have come into effect on January 1, 1955.

AWARD

The Commissioner of Labour by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 3 (1) (d) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131, as amended by Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts Nos. 14 and 62 of 1957, 4 of 1962 and 39 of 1968 (read with Industrial Disputes (Special Provisions) Act No. 37 of 1968), and by his Order dated 10th December, 1971, referred the above-mentioned dispute for settlement by arbitration.

As per statement of the Commissioner of Labour under section 16 of the Industrial Disputes Act, the matter in dispute between the aforesaid parties is whether the termination of the services of Messrs. S. E. Gunadasa, Edwin Silva, Dalton Silva, Jayasinghe Mendis, K. Seedara and L. P. Cyril by Ceylon Metal Industries Limited is justified and to what relief is each of them entitled.

When this matter was taken up for inquiry on 1.3.72, Mr. S. Siriwardene, the General Secretary of the All Ceylon Commercial and Industrial Workers' Union (hereinafter called the 'Union'), appeared for the Applicants The Respondent, Ceylon Metal Industries Limited (hereinafter called the 'Company') was represented by Mr. M. Ellapola. After several dates of hearing, the inquiry was concluded on 27.02.73.

The Company has a factory at Attidiya, where aluminium articles are manufactured.

S. E. Gunadasa, Edwin Silva, Dalton Silva, Jayasinghe Mendis, K. Seedara and L. P. Cyril were labourers in this factory, and on 6.2.71, all the labourers of the factory, except those who worked in the Stores, stood outside the gate of the factory and did not report for work at 7.30 a.m. They threw stones, cowdung, explosives, etc., inside the factory premises and the Management summoned the Police for protection.

The Supervisors and the others were at their posts and did the work assigned to them.

The workers and the strikers stood around the factory creating trouble and the Police stood at the gate.

In the evening at about 4 p.m. Vadivel, the Supervisor; Ariyaratne, the Storekeeper; Moramudali, a Clerk; de Mel the Accountant; and Weerasinghe, the Engineer, got out of the factory and went towards Galle Road to take the bus. The Police stood at the gate and asked Vadivel and the others to proceed

Vadivel and the others were pelted with stones and cowdung and when they had proceeded some distance Vadivel and Ariyaratne were assaulted, and the injuries on Vadivel were grievous.

The Police rushed up and found Vadivel lying injured and unconscious, and Ariyaratne, standing on the road with an injury on the face.

The Police chased and arrested Seedara and Cyril and took them to the Police Station, with Vadivel and Moramudali.

Vadivel gave evidence that as he got out of the factory along with the others they were pelted with stones and cowdung, and when he had gone some distance and reached Mallikarama Junction, Seedara went up and caught him by his shirt collar; Jayasinghe Mendis gave a blow on his nose; Dalton Silva a blow on his eye; and Edwin Silva a kick; and when he fell down Seedara, Cyril, Dalton Silva and Edwin Silva assaulted him, and he fell unconscious.

Vadivel was first taken to the Kalubowila Hospital and was seen there by the J.M.O., on the following day.

The J.M.O. had noticed (1) a confusion of the upper part of the nose extending below the left eye; (2) lacerated wound on the left angle of the mouth. The J.M.O. said that Vadivel had told him that Seedara, Jayatillaka and others assaulted him.

Dr. R. C. J. Rustomjee, the Ear, Nose and Throat Specialist gave evidence that Vadivel had fracture dislocations of the nasal bone and the nasal septum.

Dr. (Mrs.) Srisandarajah, an Eye Surgeon, stated that Vadivel had 'Conjunctival haemorrhage'.

Moramudali, de Mel and Weerasinghe gave evidence similar to the evidence given by Vadivel.

Ariyaratne gave evidence that he left the factory with Vadivel and the others and when he was close to the Mallikarama Road Junction, Gunasekera, Jayasinghe, Seedara and Edwin Silva, who were standing by the road, assaulted him, and that Goonasekera gave him a blow on his cheek under the eye, which made him have his eyes closed.

The medical evidence supports the evidence of Vadivel. Moramudali, de Mel and Weerasinghe corroborated the evidence of Vadivel and Ariyaratne.

Seedara said that he was near the factory gate and that he saw Vadivel and the others. He admitted that Vadivel had reported him to the Management for doing insufficient work.

C. E. Silva gave evidence that he was on a rubber land close to the factory after 3.30 p.m., and that he was not near the factory gate when Vadivel and the others left.

L. P. Cyril stated that the Police obstructed him and prevented him from going near the factory gate, and that he did not know why the Police came and arrested him. He denied seeing Vadivel even at the Police Station.

Jayasinghe Mendis gave evidence that he remained at home without going for work, and he heard from a friend that there was a strike. He admitted that there was a case against him in the Magistrates Court.

I reject the evidence of Seedara, C. E. Silva, L. P. Cyril and Jayasinghe Mendis.

I accept the evidence of Vadivel and Ariyaratne and hold that Vadivel was assaulted by Seedara, Jayasinghe Mendis, Dalton Silva, Edwin Silva and Cyril; and that Ariyaratne was assaulted by Goonasekera and others.

The strike in the Company had continued till May, and the strikers had harassed those who went for work.

Mrs. Peiris, is a Supervisor in the Company and she gave evidence that on the morning of 12th May, she came to the Bus Stand at Ratmalana to go to the factory and saw Devadason, Seedara, Gunadasa, Swaris and Gunaratne at the Bus Stand and that when she was waiting for the bus they crossed the road, went up to her, abused her in filthy language and threatened to pull out her saree. She further stated that she moved off to avoid them, but they followed her, and at that time a Jeep with Police Officers came and that she stopped the Jeep and complained to the Police and the Police arrested Devadason, Swaris and Seedara, and that they pleaded guilty in the Magistrates Court.

Seedara said that the Police filed a case against him for abusing Mrs. Peiris and that that case was compounded.

Wickremanayake gave evidence that Mrs. Peiris told him that Gunadasa abused her, and that others surrounded her. I accept the uncontradicted evidence of Mrs. Peiris that Gunadasa and the others abused her.

It was urged on behalf of these discontinued labourers that these incidents even if true had happened outside the Company; and, as such the Management was not entitled to take cognisance of these incidents to discontinue these workers.

Although this abuse and assaults took place outside the Company they were connected with the strike and the work in the factory.

Discipline, respect for authority and orderliness are essential for the smooth functioning of a factory and for its maximum production. Assault and abuse by the workers on the supervisory staff, even outside the factory will have a demoralising effect on its whole labour force. A timid member of the supervisory staff may follow the path of least resistance and refrain from being strict in his supervision; a bold and unscrupulous worker may desist from carrying out the orders of the supervisory staff.

If the required standards of discipline are to be maintained in this factory, the services of Gunadasa, Ewin Silva, Dalton Silva, Jayasinghe Mendis, K. Seedara and L. P. Cyril should be dispensed with.

Seedara had joined the Company on 1st August, 1966. His work in the Company was not satisfactory and he was fined or otherwise dealt with in the years 1966, 1967 and 1970. Except for Seedara noting was urged against the others. The punishment meted out to Seedara and the others should not be the same; the others, during their period of service, had done satisfactory work and contributed to the prosperity of the Company. I consider it just and equitable to make an order that the Company pay one month's salary as an *ex gratia* payment for every year of service and part year of service to S. E. Gunadasa, Edwin Silva, Dalton Silva, Jayasinghe Mendis and L. P. Cyril.

1. S. E. Gunadasa had joined the Company on 29.6.64. He was in receipt of a salary of Rs. 4.10 per day when his services were terminated on 22.5.71. He will be entitled to—

Rs. 4.10 × 30 × 7 = Rs. 861

2. Edwin Silva had joined the Company on 12.11.63. He was in receipt of a salary of Rs 4.30 per day when his services were terminated on 17.5.71. He will be entitled to—

Rs. 4.30 × 30 × 8 = Rs. 1,032.

It will be in the interest of all concerned if those desirous of ensuring the timely publication of notices in the *Gazette* make it a point to see that sufficient time is allowed for postal transmission of notices to the Government Press.
