1. Wages shall be paid monthly and within 10 days of the end of the month.

- 2. (a) For any 5 days in the week, being such 5 days as are agreed upon between the employer and the workers the number of hours constituting a normal working day shall be 12 (inclusive of hours constituting a normal wor of four hours for meals or rest).
- 2. (b) For any one day in the week, being such day (other than any of the five days referred to in paragraph 2 (a)) as is agreed upon between the employer and the workers, the number of hours constituting a normal working day shall be five. (exclusive of intervals for meals or rest).

- 1. The minimum rate of wages for time work shall be as set out in paragraph 6.
- 2. A worker of any class specified in this Part shall be paid as wages for any month mentioned in Column I below an amount equal to the minimum monthly rate specified in respect of that class in this Part, if he has worked during the minimum number of working days specified in respect of that month in Column II below:

Provided, however that the minimum number of working days specified in the aforesaid Column II shall be reduced by one in respect of any month which has five Sundays.

For the purpose of this paragraph, any day on which the employer fails to provide work to any worker who presents himself therefor shall be deemed to be a day on which such worker has worked.

- 3. Where a worker has not been in employment for a full month, he shall be paid as wages an amount which bears to the minimum monthly rate the proportion which the period of employment bears to the number of days in that month.
- 4. Where by reason of any unauthorized absence a worker of any class specified in this Part has not worked in any month during the minimum number of working days specified in respect of that month in paragraph 2, he shall be paid as wages for that month an amount which bears to the minimum monthly rate specified in respect of that class in this Part he proportion which the difference between such minimum number of working days and the number of days of unauthorized absence bears to such minimum number of working days.
- 5. Absence from work on holidays or on days for which leave with full pay is allowed shall not be deemed to be unauthorized absence.

6. Minimum rate of wages for time work applicable to the workers specified in Column I shall be the corresponding rates set out in Column II.

OVERTIME RATE

The minimum overtime rate in respect of each hour of work The minimum overtime rate in respect of each hour of work in excess of the number of hours constituting the normal working day or the normal working week shall be the minimum hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the minimum monthly rate by 200) increased by 50 per centum of such minimum hourly rate.

PART IV

WEEKLY HOLIDAYS (SECTION 24)

1. Every employer shall allow one day in the week as the weekly holiday to every worker employed under him, such day being a day agreed upon between the employer and the worker:

Provided, however, that an employer may employ any worker on such weekly holiday subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) that a day within the six days next succeeding such weekly holiday shall, in addition to any holiday or leave or day of absence to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of any decision made by the Wages Board or the Wages Boards Ordinance or any other law or under the terms of his contract of employment, be allowed to that worker as a holiday;
- (b) that in respect of work done on such weekly holiday, the worker shall be paid, in addition to the wages paid on a monthly basis, a remuneration of not less than 1/25 of the minimum monthly rate;
- (c) that for each hour of work performed on a weekly holiday in excess of the number of hours constituting a normal working day under paragraph 2 (a) and 2 (b) of Part I, the minimum overtime rate shall be an amount equal to two and a half times the minimum hourly rate ascertained by dividing the minimum monthly rate by 2000 and 200; and
- (d) that the remuneration due to a worker for work done on the weekly holiday during any month shall be paid along with the wages payable for that month.

PART V

ANNUAL HOLIDAYS (SECTION 25)

- 1. (a) In respect of the first year of employment during which my worker has been in employment that worker shall be
- (i) where his employment commences on or after the first day of January but before the first day of April, a holiday of twenty-one days with full wages;
- (ii) where his employment commences on or after the first day of April but before the first day of July, a holiday of 17 days with full wages;
- (iii) where his employment commences on or after the first day of July but before the first day of October, a holiday of fourteen days with full wages;

(iv) where his employment commences on or after the first day of October, a holiday of 11 days with full wages, and the employer shall allow such holiday and be liable to pay

- (b) In respect of second or any subsequent year of employment during which any worker has been in employment, that worker shall be allowed to take and shall take a holiday of twenty-one days with full wages, of which not less than seven shall be on consecutive days, and the employer shall allow such holiday and be liable to pay such wages.
- 2. The holiday referred to in sub-section (1) in respect of any year of employment shall be taken in the year immediately succeeding on days to be agreed upon by the employer and the
- 3. For the purposes of this section, the continuity of the employment of any worker shall be deemed not to have been interrupted by reason of the absence of that worker-from work—
 - (a) on holiday or on leave, with full wages, in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance or of any other written law;
 - (b) with the permission or subsequent consent of the employer, whether with or without wages.
- 4. Where the employment of any worker is terminated, such worker shall be allowed to take and shall take before the dute of such termination :-
 - (a) the holiday with full wages, if any, to which he may be entitled in respect of the year of employment preceeding that in which the termination occurs; and
 - (b) in respect of the period during which he has been continuously in employment in the year of employment in which the termination occurs:—
 - (i) a holiday, with full wages, of two days in respect of each complete month if such period is less than nine months, and
 - (ii) a holiday of 21 days with full wages, if such period is not less than nine months;

and such employer shall allow such holiday and be liable to pay such wages:

Provided, however, that where any such holiday cannot be allowed by reason that the period of notice of termination of employment is insufficient or the employment is terminated without notice the employer shall pay full wages to such worker in respect of each day on which a holiday should otherwise have been allowed.

5. The fact that notice of termination of employment has been given by an employer or o worker employed shall not prejudice the right of such worker to take before the date of the termination of his service any leave to which such worker may be entitled under the preceeding sub-sections.

 - (b) The worker shall be paid in addition to the wage for the month, wages at not less than 1/25th of the minimum monthly rate for work done during the number of hours constituting a normal working day, and at not less than one and a half times the normal hourly rate ascertained by dividing the minimum monthly rate by 200) for work done during each hour (and proportionately for work done for part of such hour) in excess of the number of hours constituting a normal working day. working day.

Minute on the Technical Officers' Service

- 1. The Technical Officers' Service is under the general control of the Secretary, Ministry of Irrigation, Power and Highways.
- 2. The conditions of service and salary scales are indicated below. Officers in the service will also be subject to the Establishments Code, the Financial Regulations, the Departmental Orders and any other orders or Regulations of the Government.

3. Structure and Salary Scales of the Service:

- 4. Recruitment to the Technical Officers' Service will be to Class III on the salary scale Rs. 4,152—16×144—6,456. Officers absorbed into Class IIIB will be appointed to Class III on passing the Sub-Inspectors' Examination or equivalent qualifying examination which may be prescribed for appointment into Class III. There will be no further appointments to Class IIIB.
- 5. Posts in Class I will be fixed according to requirements. The ratio between Class II and III will be 1:3. Class IIIB will, however, be excluded for calculation of cadre ratio. The Technical Officers' Service will consist of 1,224 posts as follows:—

Class I . . 137 Class II . . 251 Class III . . 754 Class IIIB . . 82

This Minute will be implemented with effect from 1st February, 1971

- 6. Recruitment to the Service.—Recruitment to Class III will be made on the following basis:—
 - (a) 90% of the vacancies to be filled from-
 - (i) Works Supervisors who have a minimum of 3 years service in Classes, I, II and III and who have passed the Junior Technical Officers Examination after undergoing a two year full-time course in any recognised Technical Training Institutes or who have obtained other equivalent or higher technical qualification from a recognised Institute and who have, in addition, passed the qualifying examination which will be called the First Examination for Technical Officers for appointment to Class III, and
 - (ii) Works Supervisors in Classes I, II and III who have completed 3 years service in the Works Supervisors' Service and have passed the G.C.E. (O.L.) examination in 6 subjects in not more than two sittings including passes in Physics and mathematics and have passed the qualifying examination which will be called the First Examination for Technical Officers for appointment to Class III.

Where the number of qualified officers exceed the number of vacancies in Class III, selection will be made after and interview.

Note.—Serving officers in Classes, I, II and III of the Work Supervisors' Service who enjoyed the right to sit the examination to qualify as a Technical Officer, even though they did not possess the G.C.E. (O.L.) will retain the right as personal to them.

- (b) 10% of the vacancies will be filled by promotion on seniority and merit from Works Supervisors who have at least 15 years service.
- (c) The number of vacancies will be determined on the 1st Februry, 1971, firstly and thereafter on the 1st January of of each year.
- 7. Appointment to Class II.—Appointment to Class II will be from those who pass the qualifying examination for Technical Officers Class II which will be called the "Second Examination for Technical Officers" and have had 3 years Service in Class III excluding any period of learnership or training. Those who have passed the Inspectors Examination or the Senior Examination for Technical Assistants will be exempted from this examination. Those holding the posts of Cultivation Superintendents (Lower Grades) on 1.2.1971 will also be exempted from this examination.

Note.—10% of the vacancies will be filled by promotion on seniority and merit from Technical Officers in Class III who have put in 12 years' service in that class.

- 8. Appointments to Class I.—Appointments to Class I will be made by promotion of officers in Class II who have had a minimum of 4 years' service in Class II.
- 9. Appointments to Engineer Grade.—(a) Technical Officers who obtain a recognised degree in Civil Engineering or who pass Parts I and II of the Examination of the Institution of Civil Engineers, London, or Parts I, IB and II of the Examination of Civil Engineers of the Institution of Engineers, Ceylon, or equivalent will be appointed to the next available vacancy in the Engineer Grade.
- (b) Technical Officers who pass the Examination for Civil Engineers conducted by the Department of Examinations will be eligible for appointment as Engineers to available vacancies.
- (c) Appointments to 25% of the permanent cadre of Engineers will be made on merit and seniority from Technical Officers in Class I of the Service who have passed the Second Examination for Technical Officers. Those who have passed the Senior Technical Officers' Examination for Technical Assistants or the Inspectors' Examination or were appointed Cultivation Superintendents on the results of the competitive examinations will be exempted from the examination.
- Note.—Concessions in (b) and (c) above will apply only to those who are absorbed into the Technical Officers' Service Classes I, II, III and IIIB at the time of formation of the Service.
- 10. Absorption of serving officers into the Technical Officers' Service.—Officers serving in the technical grades in the Departments of Irrigation, Highways and Water Supply and Drainage will be absorbed into the Technical Officers' Service in the following manner:—
 - (a) Into Class I of the Technial Officers' Service will be absorbed all officers who are in the Chief Inspectors Grade of the Departments of Highways and Water Supply and Drainage or the Technical Assistants, Special Grade of the Department of Irrigation and who apply to joint the Territorail Service.
 - (b) Into Class II of the Technical Officers' Service will be absorbed officers in the Grade of Inspectors of the Department of Highways and Department of Water Supply and Drainage and also in the Technical Assistants Grade I of the Irrigation Department, who apply to joint the Territorial Service, Cultivation Superintendents (Higher Grade) of the Department of Irrigation, the Higher Grade of Superintendents of Village Works of the Department of Water Supply and Drainage, Superintendents of Village Works Lower Grade appointed prior to 1952 on the salary scale Rs. 4,152—Rs. 7,680 consolidated and Inspectors of Works (Local Government).
 - (c) Into Class III of the Technical Officers' Service will be absorbed officers in the grades of Sub-Inspectors of the Department of Highways, and Department of Water Supply and Drainage and Technical Assistants Grade II of the Irrigation Department and Irrigation Learners who have successfully completed their training and who apply to joint the Territorial Service. Cultivation Superintendents Lower Grade, Village Cultivation Officers who have reached the salary point Rs. 4,152/- per annum consolidated and Superintendents of Village Works Lower Grade of the Department of Water Supply and Drainage. Other Village Cultivation Officers and village Cultivation Learners who have successfully completed their examination will be absorbed into Class III on their present salary scales and when they reach the salary point of Rs. 4,152/- they will be eligible to the salary scale of Class III.
 - (d) Supervising Overseers who on 01.10.1971 were in Grades I, II and III of the Department of Highways who have passed the G.C.E. (Ordinary Level) in six subjects with Mathematics and Chemistry or Physics will be absorbed into Class IIIB of Technical Officers' Service with their present salaries as personal to them.

- Seniority.—The relative seniority of officers absorbed into Classes I to III of the Technical Officers' Service will be determined on the following basis:

(Consolidated).
 - (c) Seniority in Class III will be determined by the date on which the officers absorbed into Class III reached the salary point Rs. 4,152/- in the permanent cadre in their respective Departments

In the case of the Inspectorate of the Highways and Water Supply Departments who were holding acting appointments, such period of acting service will be considered for purposes of service requirements for promotion where such acting appointments were against a temporary cadre under Works Estimate.

Mr. C. W. Paramsothy, President of the Ceylon Bank Officers' Association, appeared for the Ceylon Bank Officers' Association, while Mr. C. L. Wickremanayake, Advocate, of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon appeared for the State Bank of India.

The matter was taken up for inquiry on 22nd March, 1973, and after a preliminary discussion the parties arrived at the following settlement in Court:—

'It is agreed that pensions would be computed on the basis of the total number of completed years of service calculated from the date of confirmation of an employee in the Bank's service plus five years upon 60 years into the average of the total basic salary plus Dearness Allowance plus Interim Allowance (but excluding Rent Allowance), drawn by the employee during the last three years.'
