Mr. R. S. Marimuthu was employed on this estate from May, 1967, at a salary of Rs. 200 per mensem. On 19th July, 1968, his salary was reduced by Rs. 50 as, it appears, the Superintendent of the Estate considered that Mr. Marimuthu's work was unsatisfactory. Thereafter Mr. Marimuthu continued to work on the reduced salary up-to-date. He has given a letter to the Management dated 19.10.68, more or less stating that he was prepared to work on the reduced salary. In spite of this letter Mr. Somapala who appeared for the Applicant, Mr. Marimuthu very strongly argued that the Management had no right to reduce his salary. They could have framed a Charge Sheet against Mr. Marimuthu terminating his services or withheld his increments and fringe benefits until his work improved. I agree with Mr. Somapala's arguments.

In the proceedings before me, Mr. S. Thiagarajah of the Ceylon Trade Union Federation to which the Ceylon General & Industrial Workers' Union is affiliated, appeared for the Union in behalf of the workers; Mr. S. S. Kandaiya, Proctor S.C., appeared for Mr. Elmo Andree, the Employer party who failed to present himself in Court.

The facts in respect of the dispute under reference are non-controversial. It was stated by Mr. Kandaiya, on behalf of the Employer, that the Employer is not contesting any of the

facts adduced. However, the Employer strongly relied on certain positions of law. These could be formulated in the following terms:—

- (1) Since it was admitted by both parties that the workmen had continued to work even after Mr. Elmo Andree ceased to be their employer, there was no termination of employment but only a cessation of employment. Hence a reference under section 4 of the Industrial Disputes Act is not valid as relations between the workmen and the employer is one between ex-employee and ex-employer.
- (2) Since the reference for arbitration describes the dispute as being "whether the termination of the services of the . . . employees . . . by Mr. Elmo Andree is justified and to what relief is each of them entitled.", the Arbitrator has no jurisdiction to arbitrate where the matter in dispute is admittedly one of cessation and not termination.

In respect of the first contention of Mr. Kandaiya that the present reference is not valid as the dispute is one between ex-employees and ex-employer, one needs only refer to section 47C of the Industrial Disputes Act.

In the light of section 47C, the second contention of Mr. Kandaiya, that the Arbitrator has no jurisdiction as the reference has wrongly described the dispute as one arising out of termination of services, too cannot be sustained. The scope of an inquiry into a dispute under reference need not strictly be limited by the description used in the Statement of the matter in dispute accompanying the reference. That statement of the Commissioner is made in terms of section 16 of the I.D. Act and consists of matters, which to the knowledge of the Commissioner of Labour are in dispute between the parties. It may so transpire in the course of the inquiry, that the description of the dispute by the Commissioner was not entirely accurate. Nevertheless it may also be that a dispute does in fact exist which falls within the ambit of the reference to arbitration.

Furthermore, it is my view that the proviso to section 16 of the Industrial Disputes Act gives the Arbitrator the necessary authority to make a just and equitable award on the essential pre-existing matters in connection with the description of the dispute under reference.

None of the relevant facts as to period and nature of service of the employees, their employment by Mr. Elmo Andree, the salaries/wages received by them, etc., are disputed. However, since Mr. Elmo Andree as the Employer has ceased to be such from the end of March 1970, the question of reinstatement does not arise. Since the workmen continued to be in the same employment till the end of 1970, this fact precludes one from considering compensation for loss of employment, the only question that remains is whether it is just and equitable to order payment of any gratuity for the services rendered to Mr. Andree. I consider it is just and equitable that the employer should pay to each workman half a month's remuneration for each year of service under him, calculated on the rate of salary/wages drawn in March 1970. On this basis I make award that the workmen concerned are entitled to and be paid by the employer, Mr. Elmo Andree, the following amounts as gratuity:—

No evidence was lead regarding the period of service and salary particulars of the employee R. PUNCHINONA (No. 23). Hence no specific amount can be awarded to her; but payment should be made to her on the same basis as the others, viz. half month's remuneration for each year of service.

It transpired in Court that most of these employees had been in the service of Mr. Elmo Andree for over ten years, and the above-mentioned gratuity payments are ordered on the basis, that they also receive the Employees Provident Fund benefits to which they are entitled over the period of their employment. If, as was mentioned in Court, the contributions due have not been lodged to their credit with the Fund by the employer, the Department of Labour will have to take action to recover those statutory dues and make them available for disbursement on Claim in the normal course.

I consider the above award just and equitable, and make order that the above sums of money should be deposited by Mr. Elmo Andree with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo South, within one month of the date of publication of this Award in the *Gazette of the Republic of Sri Lanka*. The workers above-named shall be free to withdraw their amounts thereafter.

This is an Award under section 17 of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon

(Revised Edition), as amended by Acts Nos. 14 of 1957, 62 of 1957, 4 of 1962 and 39 of 1968 (read with Industrial Disputes (Special Provisions) Act No. 37 of 1968). The dispute was referred to me by the Honourable Minister of Labour by his Order dated 3rd August, 1972, for settlement by arbitration.

The matter in dispute between the aforesaid parties is whether the hypothetical rate of overtime wages paid to the Motor Transport Trade Workmen, namely, Messrs. S. M. J. Perera and W. A. Justin who are members of the United Tea, Rubber & Local Produce Workers' Union in respect of their journeys performed up-country was reduced by Messrs. Esufali & Co. Ltd., with effect from 1st December, 1966, and if so to what relief each of them is entitled.

Mr. Peter Jayasekera, instructed by Mr. Rajah Collure appeared for the Union on behalf of Mr. S. M. J. Perera. Mr. L. W. Athulathmudali, instructed by Mr. Arnold de Silva appeared for the Employer.

After certain preliminary arguments and some evidence was led parties arrived at a settlement, and on 9.4.73 both parties submitted the terms of settlement which are as follows:—

The Employer will pay an ex-gratia payment of Rs. 3,000 to Mr. S. M. J. Perera in full and final satisfaction of all claims statutory and otherwise.

The Employer will pay the said sum of Rs. 3,000 in instalments of Rs. 1,000 each on or before:—

30th May, 1973,

30th June, 1973,

30th July, 1973.

The Employer will deposit the said sums in the aforesaid manner with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo North, 4th Floor, Labour Secretariat, Kirula Road, Colombo 5.

The dispute has been settled to the satisfaction of both parties. I consider the above terms of settlement just and equitable and I make award accordingly. Any instalment due but yet undeposited with the A. C. L., Colombo North on the date of publication of this Award shall be so deposited by the Employer-Company aforesaid within a week thereof.

Mr. W. A. Justin, one of the applicants on whose behalf the Union stood in dispute in this reference, was absent and unrepresented throughout this inquiry which commenced on 3.11.72 and concluded on 9.4.73.

Mr. Jayasekera, Counsel for the Union, stated that he was not appearing for Mr. Justin. In the course of the inquiry, Counsel for the Employer produced document marked A-7 dated

31.7.71, which stated that as the claim for Overtime and Batta was made erroneously the Union withdraws its claims in respect of W. A. Justin. The Union is willing to accept the payment of Rs. 3,000 in full and final settlement of all claims statutory and otherwise due to W. A. Justin, and arrangements be made to pay through the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo North, on or before 15th August, 1971. The fact that Mr. Justin had not appeared before this Court on the ten dates of inquiry and in view of document A-7, I am satisfied that Mr. Justin has no claim against the Employer. I hold that he has no claims, whatsoever, against the respondent Company, and that he is not entitled to any relief.

Award

The Honourable Minister of Labour by his Order dated 10th January, 1972, referred the above dispute to this Tribunal under section 4 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments of Sri Lanka, as subsequently amended for settlement by arbitration.

In the statement of the Commissioner of Labour which accompanied the Honourable Minister's Order the dispute between the parties is set out as follows:—

"Whether the termination of the services of Messrs. S. D. Stephen and S. M. Peter who are members of the above union by the Management of Messrs. Trading and Forwarding

The Commissioner of Labour by his statement dated April 1973, stated the matter in dispute in the following terms:—

"Whether the non-payment of bonus to Messrs. E. Varatharajah, K. Arulanathan, S. Thavachelvam, V. Thuraiingham T. Thillainathan and M. K. Nadarajah (who are members of the above Union) for the year 1970/71 by the Management of the said Jaffna Co-operative Stores limited is justified and if not to what relief each of them is entitled."

When this matter was taken up for inquiry on 1.6.73 Mr. V. Subramaniam appeared for the respondent and Mr. W. S. K. de Silva, appeared on behalf of the applicant.

After submissions were made by parties, the parties came to the following settlement of the dispute:—

1. The applicant Union sought no relief in respect of the following workmen:—1. M. K. Nadarajah. 2. T. Thillainathan and 3. K. Arulanathan, No award therefore be made in respect of these workers.
2. In respect of the other workers the respondent agreed to offer the amounts mentioned below as bonus payment for the year 1970-71 and the workers agreed to accept the said amounts in full and final satisfaction of all claims in respect of bonus against the respondents:—

I consider the above settlement just and equitable.

The respondent shall deposit the above sum of Rs. 375 with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Jaffna, within one month from the date of this award, for withdrawal by the workers abovenamed.

Agency Limited is justified and to what relief is each of them entitled".

The applicant union by its statement dated 2nd February, 1972, has submitted that the employer terminated the services of these two workmen with effect from 9th August, 1971, and that this termination is wrongful and unjustified. The respondent has in its statement dated 14th February, 1972, stated *inter alia* that the conduct of these two workmen was found to be unsatisfactory and it was felt that the proper amounts collected as funds from the transport of goods were not accounted for and paid to the company.

When this matter was taken up for inquiry on 31st May, 1972, while Mr. Victor de Mel appeared for the applicant union, Mr. L. S. V. Perera appeared for the respondent and when the matter was taken up for further inquiry on 20th March, 1973, Mr. C. E. Cooray appeared for the applicant union while Mr. Perera appeared again for the respondent.

According to the statement filed by the respondent, the respondent company is a company which maintains a fleet of hiring lorries and one of the reasons for the termination of services of S. M. Peter and S. D. Stephen is that they had been found guilty of misconduct in that they had not handed over collections made on behalf of the employer to the employer.

At the inquiry held before me, S. A. Peiris, the Managing Director of the respondent company, K. D. A. Gunadasa, M. D. Abeykoon, D. M. Seeyathu and Meerasaibo gave evidence for the respondent. Stephen and Peter gave evidence on behalf of the applicant union.

In my opinion, the evidence of Stephen and Peter quite clearly establish that they are guilty of the act of misconduct complained of against them and I therefore do not think it is necessary for the purposes of making an award in this matter to analyse the rest of the evidence led before me. Stephen and Peter have both admitted in their evidence that they collected a sum of Rs. 22 being the charge for some of the goods they transported in one of the employers lorries (Lorry No. 22 Sri 3322) on the day in question (4th August, 1971) and that of this sum of Rs. 22 each of them took Rs. 10 for their expenses and the balance Rs. 2 was spent on meals. Peter and Stephen had

also made statements to this effect to the respondent and these statements have been produced marked R2 and R4. Peter's and Stephen's position was that they were entitled to appropriate monies collected by them in this manner and that this was a regular practice in this company. Peter and Stephen stated that when they so appropriate money they inform the clerk who makes an entry in the books of the company and that these amounts so appropriated will be deducted from the salaries due to them. There is no evidence whatsoever to support the contention of Peter and Stephen that this kind of appropriation of money was a regular practice in this company and neither of them summoned the company to produce the books of the company to show that in fact entries had been made of similar appropriations in the past. Nor was any evidence led to show that on this date the clerk of the company was informed of the fact that they had appropriated the Rs. 22. It is quite clear that Peter and Stephen are both guilty of the act of misconduct complained of and that their story that appropriation of moneys collected by them on behalf of the company was a regular practice which they were entitled to indulge in is a fabrication. It is also clear that, if not for the fact that this offence had been detected on a surprise check by S. A. Peiris, the Managing Director of the company himself on this date, the offence could have gone undetected, and neither Peter nor Stephen would have informed the company that they had collected this money and taken it for themselves. The money therefore would not have been accounted for and paid to the company.

The act of misconduct complained of which I hold has been established is in my view serious enough to warrant termination of services. I therefore hold that the termination of services of Messrs. S. D. Stephen and S. M. Peter is justified. When workmen have been found guilty of offences of this nature I do not think it would be proper for me to grant them any relief and therefore I also hold that S. D. Stephen and S. M. Peter are not entitled to any relief and I make award accordingly.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT

Order

BY virtue of powers vested in me by Section 4 read with Section 3 (2) of the Control of Prices Act (Chapter 173), I, Suraweera Gunadasa Samarasinghe, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food and Miscellaneous Articles) for the District of Ratnapura, do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with immediate effect Food Price Order No. R/53/69 of 25th March, 1969, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 14,847/3 dated 30th March, 1969;
- (ii) fix with immediate effect the price for the time being fixed under the Control of Prices Act (Chapter 173) as the wholesale dealer's maximum wholesale price for the Colombo Municipality, increased by amounts specified in Column 3 of the Schedule hereto, to be the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight (gross) above which the articles specified in the corresponding entry Column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold within the area or the Administrative District specified in Column 2 of that Schedule;
- (iii) fix with immediate effect the price for the time being fixed under the Control of Prices Act (Chapter 173) as the retail dealers maximum retail price for the Colombo Municipality increased by the amounts specified in Column 4 of the Schedule hereto, to be the maximum retail price per pound (nett) above which the article specified in the corresponding entry in Column 1 of that schedule shall not be sold within the area or the Administrative District specified in Column 2 of that schedule;
- (iv) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of an article specified in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto for the purpose of re-sale or any sale of an article specified in Column 1 of that schedule in a quantity of 1 cwt. or more at a time shall be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of an article specified in Column 1 of the schedule hereto less than 1 cwt. gross for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (v) direct that in every area where maximum prices fixed by this Order, no person shall sell any article specified in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto, which is adulterated with any other article;
- (vi) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every trader who has any article specified in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto in his possession or under his control at any place or any vehicle shall, exhibit conspicuously at such place or in such vehicle quantity of such article in a suitable container with the maximum price of such article fixed by this Order displayed in figures not less than one inch in height on price tags or boards attached to such container in such manner that the article and the maximum price thereof could be clearly seen by any customer;
- (vii) direct that for the purpose of this Order 'pound' or 'lb.' shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight;
- (viii) direct that in every area where the maximum prices are fixed by this Order every person who sells any article specified in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto by wholesale shall, and every person who sells any articles specified in that Schedule by retail shall, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) date of the sale,
 - (b) the quantity of such article sold (by weight),
 - (c) price paid for the quantity sold, and
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say whether the sale was by wholesale or retail;

(ix) direct that when any article specified in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto is sold, the maximum price referred to in Columns 3 and 4 of that schedule shall include the price of the wrapper of container if any, in which such article is sold.

Such notices will be returned to the sender by post for necessary amendment and return if publication is desired in a subsequent issue of the *Gazette*. It will be in the interest of all concerned if those desirous of ensuring the timely publication of notices in the *Gazette* make it a point to see that sufficient time is allowed for postal transmission of notices to the Government Press.

The Government Printer does not accept payments of subscriptions for the Government Gazette. Payments should be made direct to the Superintendent Government Publications Bureau, P O Box 500, Secretariat Colombo 1.

Note - Payments for inserting Notices in the *Gazette of the Republic of Sri Lanka (Ceylon)* will be received by the Government Printer and not by the Superintendent Government Publications Bureau.
