THE NATIONAL HOUSING ACT

REGULATIONS made by the Minister of Housing and Construction under section 2 (f) and 98 of the National Housing Act (Chapter 401) and approved by the National State Assembly under the said section 98.

Regulations

1. These regulations may be cited as the National Housing Regulations No. 2 of 1973.

2. The following shall be housing objects for the purposes of the National Housing Act:—

- (a) The control, management, maintenance and administration of the common amenities and the common elements of the relevant units;
- (b) the insurance, if so requested by owners of all buildings comprising such units, against risk of fire, civil commotion and riots;

(c) the proper maintenance and repair of the common amenities and the common elements of such units;

(d) the provision and maintenance in respect of such units, of services including water, sewerage, drainage, gas, electricity, garbage disposal, air conditioning, telephone, radio and rediffusion services;

(e) the establishment and maintenance of facilities such as roads, accesses, lawns, gardens, parks, playgrounds and other open spaces for the use of occupants of such units;

(f) the provision of common services for the benefit and the welfare of occupants of such units;

(g) the promotion and assistance of undertakings for the carrying out of the aforesaid objects by public, co-operative or private sector agencies or persons;

(h) any object reasonably connected with or ancillary to any of the aforesaid objects.

In these regulations—

The expression, " relevant units ", " common amenities ", " common elements ", shall have the same meanings, respectively as in the Common Amenities Board Law, No. 10 of 1973.

Minute on the Works Supervisors' Service

1. The Workers Supervisors' Service is under, the general control of the Secretary, Ministry of Irrigation, Power and Highways.

2. The conditions of service and salary scales are indicated below. Officers of the Works Supervisors' Service will also be subject to the Establishments Code, Financial Regulations, Departmental Orders and any other Orders or Regulations of the Government.

3. Structure and salary scales of the service—

The Minute will be implemented with effect from 1st February, 1971.

5. Recruitment to Class IV of the Service will be made from—

- Casual Overseers and Casual Kanganies working in the Territorial Civil Engineering Organisation and who have completed 3 years service as on 1.2.1971.
- Labour grades in the same organisation who have completed 10 years service as on 1.2.1971.
- Casual Overseers and Kanganies who complete 3 years service and labour grades who complete 10 years service in the same organisation on a date after 1.2.1971.

Those categories (a) and (b) will be required to have the minimum educational qualification of the J.S.C. Those in category (c) will be required to have the minimum educational qualification of the G.C.E. (O.L.) in 6 subjects in not more than two sittings.

Selection will be made from among those possessing the above qualifications by means of a viva voce test designed to examine the candidate's technical knowledge.

6. Recruitment to Class III of the Works Supervisors' Service will be made on the following basis:—

(a) up to 50 per cent of the vacancies in Class III will be filled by direct recruitment from those who possess the following qualifications:—

- Age limit between 18-30 years. This will not apply to those already in service.
- Who have passed the Junior Technical Officers' examination after undergoing a two year full-time course in any recognised Technical Training Institute or obtained other equivalent or higher technical qualifications from a recognised Institute.

(b) Not more than 40 per cent of the vacancies in Class III will be filled on seniority from officers in service in the Territorial Civil Engineering Organization, who have passed the G.C.E. (O.L.) in 6 subjects including two passes in physics, mathematics applied Mathematics or Chemistry in not more than two sittings. They will be required to undergo one year's training and pass an examination before they are appointed to Class III. If the number of those successful at this examination is more than the number of vacancies available, then, they will be subject to a test for selecting the number required.

(c) 10 per cent of the vacancies in Class III will be filled from officers in Class IV on seniority and merit if they satisfy the viva voce test to examine the candidate's technical knowledge before appointment.

(d) Any balance vacancies will be filled by advertisement for recruitment from persons who have the following qualifications:—

- Age limit 18-30 years.
- Have passed G.C.E. (O.L.) in six subjects with at least 4 credit passes including two credit passes in physics, mathematics, applied mathematics or chemistry.
- They will be required to undergo one year's training and pass an examination before they are appointed to Class III.

(e) The number of vacancies will be determined on 1.2.71 firstly and thereafter on the 1st of January each year.

7. Appointment to Class II, subject to vacancies, will be by promotion on seniority and merit from those who have put in a minimum of six years service in Class III including temporary service.

8. Appointments to Class I, subject to vacancies, will be made by promotion on seniority and merit from officers who have put in a minimum of six years service in Class II including temporary service.

9. Absorption of Overseers into the Works Supervisors' Service:

- Into Class I of the Works Supervisors' Service will be absorbed Road Overseers and Supervising Overseers who are in Classes I and II of their respective services.
- Into Class II of the Works Supervisors' Service will be absorbed those who are in Class III of the Road Overseers and Supervising Overseers Services, Maintenance Overseers of the Irrigation Department and Construction Overseers, Class I of the Irrigation Department.

(c) Into Class III of the Works Supervisors' Service will be absorbed those who are in Class IV of the Road Overseers and Supervising Overseers Services and Construction Overseers, Class II of the Irrigation Department, Irrigation Overseers and Village Cultivation Overseers who are on the salary point of Rs. 3,540 and over per annum will also be absorbed into Class III of the Works Supervisors' Service.

(d) Into Class IV will be absorbed Irrigation Overseers, Village Cultivation Overseers, Irrigation Kanganies and Wewa Lekams of the Irrigation Department and Overseers of the Water Supply and Drainage Department with their present salary scales as personal to them.

10. Seniority.—

The relative seniority of officers absorbed into Classes I, II, III and IV of the Works Supervisors' Service will be determined on the following basis:—

(a) In the case of officers absorbed into Class I, Officers already in Class I of the Road Overseers and Supervising Overseers Services will be senior to others and relative seniority among them will be decided by the date of appointment to Class I in the respective services. In the case of officers in Class II of the Road Overseers and Supervising Overseers Services absorbed into Class I, their relative seniority will be from the date of appointment to Class II in the respective services.

(b) Seniority in Class II of the Works Supervisors' Service will be determined by the date of appointment to class III of the Road Overseers and Supervising Overseers Service, and the date of appointment as Maintenance Overseer or Construction Overseer—Grade I.

(c) Seniority in Class III of the Works Supervisors' Service will be determined by the date on which officers absorbed into Class III were appointed to their respective grades from which they are being absorbed except in the case of Irrigation Overseers and Village Cultivation Overseers. In the case of Irrigation Overseers and Village Cultivation Overseers absorbed into Class III of the Works Supervisors' Service, the date on which they reach the salary point of Rs. 3,000 will be taken as the relative date of appointment for seniority purposes.

(d) Irrigation Overseers and Village Cultivation Overseers will be considered senior to other grades being absorbed into Class IV. Seniority between Village Cultivation and Irrigation Overseers will be determined by the date of appointment to the respective grades. Wewa Lekams and Irrigation Kanganies will rank junior to Village Cultivation Overseers and Irrigation Overseers and the relative seniority between them will be determined by the date of appointment to the respective grades.

Award

The Honourable the Minister of Labour has, by virtue of the powers vested in him under section 4 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131, of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon (1956 Revised Edition), as amended by Acts, Nos. 14 and 62 of 1957, 4 of 1962, and 39 of 1968 (read with Industrial Disputes (Special Provisions) Act No. 37 of 1968), and by his Order dated 10th April, 1972, referred the abovementioned industrial dispute to me for settlement by arbitration.

The matter in dispute between the aforesaid parties, according to the statement accompanying the Minister's reference, is whether the presently prevailing norms of production beyond which incentive payments are made should be increased and, if so, to what extents.

Inquiry into this dispute commenced on 13.6.72, and continued thereafter on six dates.

On the first two dates of inquiry, Mr. A. M. Somapala, Proctor, S.C., appeared for the Applicant Union; the Respondent Company was represented by Mr. Lyn Wirasekera, Secretary, Employers' Federation of Ceylon. On the subsequent dates, namely, 5.3.73, 24.3.73, 24.4.73, 27.4.73 and 1.6.73, the Respondent Company was represented by Mr. Lalith Hevawitharana, Mr. Stanley Fernando and Mr. Marcus Perera.

During the course of the proceedings, both parties indicated to me that, they were discussing a settlement and finally on 1.6.68, informed me that they had lodged with the Registrar of this court the terms of settlement they had arrived at.

The terms of settlement handed over to this court are contained in the Collective Agreement between the Ceylon Match Company Limited and the All Ceylon Match Workers' Welfare Union, running into four pages, and two Schedules; Schedule 'A' and Schedule 'B'. For the Ceylon Match Company Limited it is signed by Mr. Lalith Hevawitharana; for the All Ceylon Match Workers' Welfare Union it is signed by Mr. K. D. Jinadasa, its president. This Agreement appears to take into consideration many matters which seem to have been in dispute between the parties. I have gone through this Agreement and the annexed Schedules 'A' and 'B' filed with this Collective Agreement, and find in all the circumstances of the case that this Agreement would be a just and equitable settlement of the matters in dispute, as well as any other foreseeable matters in dispute which both parties have agreed upon.

I accept this Collective Agreement as a just and equitable settlement of this dispute and make award accordingly. A copy of this Agreement is attached to my award, together with a copy of the Schedule 'A' and 'B', all of which form part of my award.

The Collective Agreement made this 27th day of April, 1973, between the Ceylon Match Company Limited, P. O. Box 1, Kelaniya (the Company registered under the Company's Ordinance and having its registered office at Peliyagoda, Kelaniya), and hereinafter referred to as the employer of the one part and the All Ceylon Match Workers' Welfare Union (registered under the Trade Unions Ordinance of Ceylon and having its registered office at No. 82, Siyambalagahawatta, Biyagama Road, Kelaniya); hereinafter referred to as the union of the other part.

Witnesseth.

1. Date of operation and duration.

This agreement shall have effect up to 31.12.73 and it shall continue to have force until and unless it is terminated by six months notice in writing by either party to the other subject to such notice not being given by either parties prior to 1.7.73.

2. The terms and conditions of Collective Agreement No. 1 of 1961, shall continue to have force during the period of this Agreement, save where these are altered expressly or by implication by the provisions of this Agreement.

3. The Company shall pay the workers a production bonus at the rate of 6319/16000 of the difference between the former Banderol Duty of Rs. 167 per case and the Banderol Duty operative at the time of the payment of the production bonus,

less a charge levy per case as Turnover Tax and also less 2/5ths of the amount of the increase in the cost of raw materials calculated per case between 1971 (calculated at Rs. 97.62 in 1971) and 31.12.72 (calculated at Rs. 130.79 per case). This increase in the cost of raw materials is fixed at Rs. 33.17 per case. Any price increase in raw materials cost between 31.12.72 and 31.12.73, shall not affect this Agreement. The above method of computing the production bonus shall apply upto an annual production of 20,000 cases. If the production exceeds 20,000 cases annually the Company and the Union will further negotiate regarding the method to be adopted for the payment of the production bonus in respect of the cases produced in excess of the said 20,000 cases. The payment of the production bonus on the above basis is effective from 1st April, 1972. Any increase in turnover tax resulting from the increase in net selling price of matches above Rs. 328 shall not affect the production bonus paid to workers for the duration of this Agreement.

4. The production workers shall be placed in four Grades as proposed by the Company in its letter of 19.3.70. The workers in each Grade shall be those listed by the Company in its aforementioned letter, save that Levelling Helper shall be in Grade B and Feeling No. 2. Helper shall be in Grade C.

5. The rate of pay of Production workers shall be based on the 'daily average production' for each month. The daily out-turn at the Factory Gate for all full working days in the month shall be listed and the mean out-turn shall be taken as the 'daily average production' for the given month, provided that if on any given day the outturn falls short of 58 cases and the shortfall is not due to the fault of the workers, the production for that day shall not be taken into account in working out the 'daily average production' for the month and the wages for that day in these circumstances shall be the rates of pay applicable for a 'daily average production' of 58 cases to each Grade of workers as set out in Clause 6 below and provided also that if the Company and the Union cannot agree in respect of any day on which the production falls below 58 cases, whether the shortfall was or was not due to any fault of the workers, this question shall be referred to arbitration by an officer of the Labour Department.

If the shortfall is due to the fault of the workers the production for that day shall be taken into account when working out the daily average or the month.

For Saturday the same principles apply but with 40 cases instead of 58 cases in the first proviso.

6. The rate of pay for Grade A workers shall be Rs. 10.35 for a 'daily average production' of 58 cases plus 30 cents for each additional case.

The rate of pay for Grade B workers shall be Rs. 8.30 for a 'daily average production' of 58 cases plus 20 cents for each additional case.

The rate of pay for Grade C workers shall be Rs. 7.65 for a 'daily average production' of 58 cases plus 15 cents for each additional case.

The rate of pay for Grade D workers shall be Rs. 6.85 for a 'daily average production' of 58 cases plus 15 cents for each additional case.

The rates of pay are exclusive of I.D.A.

Production workers shall also receive an Attendance Bonus on the following basis:—

If a worker is present on every working day in a given week and works for eight hours on week days and five and a half hours on Saturday, he shall be paid—

Rs 1 for every actual working day if in Grade A

75 cents if in Grade B

50 cents if in Grade C

50 cents if in Grade D

If a worker is present on every day in a given month and works for eight hours on week days and five and a half hours on Saturdays he shall be paid a further 10 per cent of the sum due to him as Attendance Bonus.

The Consolidated Monthly Wages in section 3 of Collective agreement No. 1 of 1961 is hereby amended as follows:—

Grade A—Rs. 200.00

Grade B—Rs. 180.00..

Grade C—Rs. 160.00

Grade D—Rs. 140.00 and more fully described in Schedule B

The cash value of Supplementary Allowance in section 3 of Collective Agreement No. 1 of 1961 for 52 cases shall be calculated for the period before 1.5.70 and shall be added as a fixed sum payable to each worker who received a Supplementary Allowance.

Production workers shall be paid a Seniority Allowance of Rs. 20.00 for 20 years service; Rs. 15.00 for 15 years service; Rs. 10.00 for 10 years service and Rs. 5.00 for 5 years service.

7. Engineering workers shall be placed on four Grades with pay scales as follows:—

Special Grades	—	Rs. 300.00	$\left\{ \begin{array}{l} 10 \times 12.50 \\ 10 \times 15.00 \end{array} \right\}$	Rs. 575.00
Grade A	—	Rs. 270.00	—	20 × 10.00—Rs. 470.00
Grade B	—	Rs. 250.00	—	16 × 7.50—Rs. 370.00
Grade C	—	Rs. 230.00	—	19 × 5.00—Rs. 325.00

Workers Nos. 105, 164, 87 and 59 shall be placed in the Special Grade at Rs. 340 and workers No. 2 shall be placed in the Special Grade at Rs. 310.

Workers Nos. 83, 199, 103, 15, 64, 157 and 195 shall be placed in Grade A at Rs. 330.

Workers Nos. 92, 5, 22, 162, 165, 9, 74, 192, 53, 403, 6, 31, 127 and 98 shall be placed in Grade B at Rs. 310.

Workers Nos. 174, 401, 402, 21, 191, 112, 47 and 3 shall be placed in Grade C Rs. 290.

All pay rates are per mensem and all placements will be as from 1.5.70.

All Engineering workers shall receive an Attendance Bonus of Rs. 100 per actual working day to be paid on the same basis of entitlement as in the case of Production workers and a further 10 per cent. for full attendance in any given month as in the case of Production Workers.

Where the 'daily average production' in any given month exceeds 66 cases Engineering workers shall be paid an extra cents 25 per case per day if in Special Grade or Grade A, cents 20 per case per day if in Grade B, and cents 15 per case per day if in Grade C.

The incentive payment on Saturdays to be for production in excess of 46 cases instead of 48 cases with effect from 1.3.73.

The payment of wages on the basis set out in Clauses 6 and 7 hereinbefore except on Saturdays as set in the preceding paragraph shall be effective as from 1.6.70.

8. Scavenging workers shall be placed on monthly pay on the scale Rs. 140—10 × 3—Rs. 170 as from 1.5.70.

9. Workers not classified as Production or Engineering Workers (Odd job workers) shall be paid at Rs. 5.35 per day but if such workers are assigned production tasks on any given day their wages shall be as paid to production workers assigned the same tasks.

10. In addition to the sick leave privileges set out in Collective Agreement No. 1 of 1961, such workers shall be entitled to 7 days paid sick leave if hospitalised or if specifically recommended for such paid sick leave by the Company's doctor after an examination for which the worker has presented himself at the office of the Company's Doctor.

The days on which a worker is on paid sick leave shall be counted for the purpose of payment of Attendance Bonus.

11. Provident Fund contributions shall be calculated on the gross monthly earnings of workers at the rate of 10 per cent. for both workers' and employers contributions.

12. All male workers shall receive 3 shirts and 3 pairs of shorts a year. All female workers shall receive 2 aprons a year. Workers receiving shirts, shorts and aprons shall wear them at work. Home clothing shall not be left about in the Factory.

13. There shall be set up a production Committee consisting of 3 members nominated by the Company and 3 members nominated by the Union. The Committee shall meet as often as is necessary to discuss matters connected with production with a view to ensuring efficiency. The Manager shall be one of the members nominated by the Company and shall be the Chairman of the Committee. Where the Production Committee issues instructions to workers, the Union will take the responsibility for the carrying out of these instructions. If the Production Committee cannot reach agreement on any matter relating to production, the Chairman can give his ruling which shall prevail until the question is dealt with between the Company and the Union. The Chairman shall report any ruling he gives to the Union as soon as possible.

Among the matters which the Production Committee will take up are those referred to by the Company in its letter of 23rd May, 1970.

14. The Production target aimed at by the Company and the workers shall be 5000 cases for each three-month period. The Company and the Union shall review production at the end of each three month period when the payment of the Production Bonus becomes due. If production in the period has fallen below 4500 cases, and the Company claims that the shortfall is due to the fault of the workers, the Union and the Company shall discuss the question whether the Production Bonus for the period

shall be reduced by any amount and in case the Union and the Company cannot reach agreement, the question (a) whether the shortfall was or was not due to the fault of the workers and (b) if so, by what amount, if any, the Production Bonus and any other incentive payments should be reduced for the period shall be referred to an arbitrator agreed upon between the parties. In considering whether other incentive payments should be reduced, the arbitrator may guide himself by the provisions of Section 3 (c) of Collective Agreement No. 1 of 1961.

15. The question of any Casual Workers now employed being made permanent shall be taken up after the Production Committee has reviewed paras. 2 and 3 of the Company's letter of 23.05.70 without prejudice to any casual workers' entitlement to permanency on or before 30.04.70.

16. In the event of any increase in existing installed machinery and/or working capacity of the Factory, suitable amendments to the incentive and production bonus schemes shall be negotiated by discussions and in the case of failure to reach agreement, by arbitration. The present working capacity of the factory is defined to be 70-80 cases per normal working day having regard to the extra effort of the workers induced by the incentives at present in force. (The existing installed machinery is described in Schedule A of this Agreement.)

17. (a) The Union, its members and the workers covered by this Agreement jointly and severally agree with the Company: that during the continuance in force of this Agreement they will not seek to vary, alter or add to all or any of the terms and conditions of employment presently applicable to any of the workers covered and bound by this Agreement or all or any of the benefits presently enjoyed by the workers covered and bound by this Agreement other than mutual agreement.

(b) The Company, agrees with the Union, its members and the workers covered and bound by this Agreement that during the continuance in force of this Agreement that it shall not seek to vary, alter or withdraw all or any of the terms and conditions of employment and the benefits presently enjoyed by the workers, hereinbefore specifically agreed other than by mutual agreement.

The matter in dispute between the United Tea, Rubber and Local Produce Workers' Union and Mr. A. B. Liyanage, the Proprietor, Ceylon Fibre Industries, Colombo 9, is whether the termination of the services of the (18) workmen referred to in the Schedule to the reference who are members of the aforesaid Union by the said Employer, is justified and to what relief, if any is such of the workmen entitled.

I was instructed to make this award within one month of the date of reference, but considering the nature of the case, the volume of evidence led, and the length of the cross-examination, I found that this was humanly impossible. As a matter of fact this reference really consisted of 18 different cases.

Mr. L. W. Panditha, General Secretary, United Tea, Rubber and Local Produce Workers' Union, appeared on behalf of the workmen. Mr. L. W. Athulathmudali, Advocate, with Mr. N. T. S. Kularatne, Advocate, instructed by Mr. S. Rajendra, Proctor, appeared for the respondent.

Arbitration proceedings in regard to this matter commenced as early as 09th March, 1973, and was continued thereafter on 26 subsequent dates.

I am happy to state that despite several dates of hearing, this case was settled. The settlement was eminently welcome, as otherwise the case would have been prolonged for a considerable period of time.

Of consent I order the amounts mentioned in the Schedule hereto to be paid to the (18) respective workmen. I might mention that with the settlement of each case the respondent Mr. A. B. Liyanage paid these amounts to the respective parties.

Of consent these amounts represent all claims arising out of this reference. This is without prejudice to statutory dues.

I consider the above settlement fair and equitable, and make award accordingly.
