THE REPORT

Under Section 20 (9) of Cap. 212

MAGGONA-USWELLA, IDDAPOLA MADEL FISHING DISPUTE

The above dispute was referred to me for Public Inquiry and report in terms of section 20 (1) of the Fisheries Ordinance (Cap. 212).

The inquiry was held on 16.11.72, 13.01.73 and on 03.02.73, at the Beruwala Fishermen's Co-operative Society, Beruwala.

It would appear that madel fishing rights in the Uswella and Iddapola Warayas at Maggonna were regulated by the Maggonna (Madel) Fishing Regulations of 1954 published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,696 dated 25.07.1954. Under those regulations, madel fishing rights in the said two warayas were given to three parties, namely: a Co-operative Society and two other groups. The three parties were:

- (a) The Maggonna Madel Fishing Co-operative Society;
- (b) Group A consisting of Messrs. S. S. Perera, S. L. Perera and S. E. C. Perera;
- (c) Group B consisting of Messrs. S. D. Andrew, S. D. Patrick and S. D. Juan.

The regulations also prescribed the particulars in respect of the manner, etc., the parties would exercise their respective rights.

It was in evidence that about the year 1957 the Maggonna Madel Fishing Co-operative Society ceased to function and that thereupon on the joint application of the remaining two groups an interim arrangement was made by the authorities for the two groups to share the rights in terms of the said regulations.

It was also in evidence that the three persons in the above Group A as also the three in the Group B are respectively brothers. Therefore, Group A is generally referred to as "Perera Brothers" and the other group as "Andrew Brothers". It was

admitted that of the Perera brothers two are dead, namely, S. S. Perera and S. L. Perera and that the 3rd namely, S. E. C. Perera is bed-ridden, while all the three Andrew brothers are living.

The complainant-applicant in this case, namely S. V. L. Perera, is a son of the above S. L. Perera, deceased. In his application dated 25.07.72, which gave rise to this reference, his position is that of the aforesaid three Perera brothers, his father, S. L. Perera, alone actually exercised the said right given to the Perera brothers by the said regulations as the other two Pereras were employed elsewhere. He also states that after his father, the said right was exclusively exercised by him till 1969 when the contestant Mrs. P. D. Catherine, wife of the aforesaid S. E. C. Perera, providing herself with a madel and fishing boat, disputed his right and claimed to fish in the right of her husband, S. E. C. Perera.

The position taken up by Mrs. P. D. Catherine the other party to this dispute, is that of the three Perera brothers to whom fishing rights were given by the 1954 regulations, two are dead and that only S. E. C. Perera who is alive is entitled to those rights and that, therefore, she is exercising that right under his directions. She denied that the applicant has any right to take fish.

In the meantime, in addition to the above dispute between S. V. L. Perera and Mrs. P. D. Catherine, there is also the application of S. G. B. Perera, a son of the aforesaid S. S. Perera, asking for fishing rights and also of S. N. Perera and of S. V. N. Perera asking for rights in the event of new allocations. They state that they can provide themselves with necessary madel and fishing boat.

At the inquiry the question was raised preliminarily whether the terms of reference of the Commission did not restrict it to determining only the dispute between the said two parties without entertaining claims for fishing rights by others. For the reasons set out in the proceedings, I held that it was competent for the Commission not only to consider the above applications for the right to fish but also to review, if equity so demanded, even the rights of Andrew brothers, as the regulations of 1954, on account of changes in the circumstances, have become inadequate.

Happily, a long inquiry was avoided as the aforesaid two parties to the dispute as well as the applicants to right to fish, by their joint application dated 29.1.73 sent to the Director of Fisheries, moved to withdraw their applications submitting that they had settled their dispute among themselves. This matter was brought to the notice of the Commission at its sitting on 03.02.73. The Commission, however, found that apart from merely stating that they had settled their differences and seeking permission to withdraw, the joint application did not show in what way they had settled and in what form the fishing rights were to be exercised by them hereafter. As the Commission was of opinion that leaving things in that way may lead to disputes and problems and as the said 1954 regulations also did not provide for the death of a party to the settlement, the Commission discussed with the parties and put forward various suggestions to work the right to take fish and ultimately all of them including the Andrew brothers submitted of consent a joint motion signed by all of them setting out the terms of settlement. This joint motion which is also witnessed by Mr. J. K. Kurukulasuriya, Proctor, who appeared for a party, is filed of record.

It is in evidence that the space in the said two warayas is not sufficient for operation of nets by many parties and it has also been found that the Maggona (Madel) Fishing Regulations of 1954, are inadequate to meet the present circumstances. Therefore, based on the terms of the aforesaid agreement among the parties and providing for other necessary matters the following scheme is recommended:—

1. The exclusive right to take fish during any year by means of a madel in Iddapola Waraya or Uswella Waraya of Maggona to be equally in the two groups described above as—
 - (i) Perera Brothers; and,
 - (ii) Andrew Brothers and/or their respective children.
2. As the group called Perera brothers considered of three persons, namely, S. S. Perera, S. L. Perera and S. E. C. Perera, each to be considered to have had a 1/3rd share devolving on their respective male children.

3. Notwithstanding that each of the Perera brothers may have more than one son, only one among such sons to be recognised for this scheme.

4. In terms of paragraph 3 above—
- (a) S. G. B. Perera—son of S. S. Perera
 - (b) S. V. L. Perera—son of S. L. Perera
 - (c) S. V. N. Perera—son of S. E. C. Perera
- are recognised

5. For the purposes of this scheme, a year is a period of twelve months commencing from 1st September.

6. In Iddapola Waraya—

(a) The Perera brothers group, in the manner set out in paragraph 6 (b) below, is entitled to take fish by Madel on odd number dates of every month such as 1st, 3rd, 5th and so on while Andrew brothers group similarly on even number dates of every month such as 2nd, 4th, 6th and so on.

(b) The odd number dates assigned in paragraph 6 (a) above to Perera brothers group shall be worked on the basis that the three persons recognised in paragraph 4 above may take fish in that order, namely—

- S. G. B. Perera on the 1st ;
S. V. L. Perera on the 3rd ; and
S. V. N. Perera on the 5th
and so on by rotation.

7. In Uswella Waraya—

(a) The Perera brothers group, in the manner set out in paragraph 7 (b) below is entitled to take fish by madel on even number dates of every month such as 2nd, 4th, 6th and so on, while the Andrew brothers group similarly on odd number dates of every month, such as 1st, 3rd, 5th and so on.

(b) The even number dates of every month assigned in paragraph 7 (a) above to the Perera brothers group shall be worked on the basis that the three persons recognised in paragraph 4 above may take fish in that order, namely—

- S. G. B. Perera on the 2nd ;
S. V. L. Perera on the 4th; and
S. V. N. Perera on the 6th
and so on by rotation.

8. Notwithstanding that in a month ending in 31 days and in a leap year two consecutive odd number dates occur, the above allotment will hold good as such advantage accrues to both parties.

9. Any of the persons receiving right to take fish as aforesaid may accordingly exercise that right only on providing himself with necessary madel and fishing boat registered with the Department.

10. On a date assigned to a person according to the foregoing provisions to take fish in a Waraya he may do so at any or all parts of that date.

11. In the event of any dispute *inter se* among the Andrew brothers and or their children, provisions governing Perera brothers will apply *mutatis mutandis*.

I end this Report thanking the officers of the Department who were of assistance at the Inquiry and also the lawyers who helped to clarify various matters.
