The Honourable the Minister of Labour has, by virtue of the powers vested in him by Section 4 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon (1956 Revised Edition), as amended by Acts, Nos. 14 and 62 of 1957, 4 of 1962 and 39 of 1968 (read with Industrial Disputes (Special Provisions) Act, No. 37 of 1968), and by his Order dated 29th August, 1972, referred the abovementioned dispute to me for settlement by arbitration.

The inquiry into this dispute commenced on 7.12.72 and was concluded after 11 dates of hearing.

The Industrial and General Workers' Union was represented by Mr. Victor de Mel; Mr. S. Vallipuram, Proctor appeared for the Proprietors of Xavy Glass Works.

Hereinafter the two parties will be described in the Award as the "Union" and "Glass Works", respectively, and the two names will be deemed to refer to the two parties in the dispute.

The Minister of Labour has referred to me the industrial dispute in respect of the matter specified in the statement of the Commissioner of Labour for settlement by arbitration. According to the statement dated 22.8.72, the dispute is between the Industrial & General Workers' Union, 71, Malay Street, Colombo 2, and Mr. Saverimuthu Francis Xavier, No. 2, Athikar Lane, Kopay and Mr. Fakrudeen Khan Bhooy, No. 180, Prince Street, Colombo 11, both Proprietors of Xavy Glass Works, Kopay.

The matter in dispute between the aforesaid parties is whether the non-offer of work to the undermentioned employees, who are members of the Union by Mr. Saverimuthu Francis Xavier and Mr. Fakrudeen Khan Bhooy, is justified and to what relief each of them is entitled.

It was submitted by Mr. de Mel, that as workers Nos. 1, 3, 6, 7, 8, 10, 16, 19 and 20 in the Schedule have already been reinstated, he is not pressing their cases and the dispute therefore so far as the Union is concerned boils down to the balance 15 workers mentioned in the Schedule of the Statement of the Commissioner of Labour; but Mr. de Mel later submitted that as Mr. Sivapalan, No. 15, is under interdiction he is still in the employment of the Glass Works; and that therefore the court would consider the cases of the 14 only out of the 24 specified in the Statement. This submission I accept in the light of the facts.

The case for the Union is outlined by Mr. de Mel would appear to be that the dispute was sparked off by the Glass Works interdicting the services of Mr. Sivapalan, whose reinstatement was insisted upon by the Union; and on 12.6.72, 24 members of the Union struck work, and according to Mr. de Mel after having on 6.6.72, given notice of the strike to the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Jaffna. Three conferences were held thereafter to negotiate a settlement including one where Mr. Navaratnam, the Deputy Commissioner of Labour participated and suggested that the workers on strike should go back to work and also that a disciplinary inquiry should be held with regard to Sivapalan. According to Mr. de Mel, Glass Works having undertaken to take back the 24 workers on the 22nd failed to keep their promise and refused work to them when they reported for work.

Mr. Vallipuram on behalf of Glass Works submitted that 14 of the 24 went back to work and only 10 were out, implying thereby that it is this number of workers and not the entirety specified in the Schedule that should be considered as involved in the dispute.

No clear evidence has been led by Mr. Vallipuram on behalf of Glass Works as to who are the 10 and in view of the clear statement of Mr. de Mel, I am satisfied that 14 workers excluding Mr. Sivapalan and the other nine mentioned and stated above are involved in the dispute, and the award I propose to make would therefore relate to these 14 workers. Mr. Vallipuram called Mr. Panchalingam, the Personnel Manager of Glass Works and Mr. Rajanayagam, the Labour Officer, Jaffna, as witnesses.

The case for the Glass Works being that no prior warning of any strike having been given by the Union which took the Glass Works unawares the workers in question were treated by them as having kept away from work without cogent reasons. If the Union had exercised a little more patience and waited for the Assistant Commissioner of Labour to investigate the matter of the dispute so far as the Union was concerned the need to rush to take the drastic step the Union took may not have arisen as it may be that at that level Sivapalan's matter could have been ironed out and all the consequent trouble to both parties avoided with less friction or no friction at all. The evidence of the Union's own witness at page 25 of the proceedings of 15.12.72, amply supports the position taken up by Mr. Vallipuram on behalf of Glass Works. The Union appears to have written letters and sent them everywhere except to the Employer who predominantly was the chief party before whom any grievances the Union had should have been placed. A vital decision to strike on 1.6.72, had been taken, but although according to the evidence of the Union the entire Labour Department at Jaffna has been made aware of this, the employer who is the most important party had been completely ignored. The evidence of Mr. Wijenandan called by the Union is that before the Union decided to go on strike, it had not intimated to Glass Works what the dispute was. It was also in evidence that Glass Works was much more cooperative and willing to discuss matters and to smooth out all difficulties. The letters dated 1.6.72 and 6.6.72, sent by the Union to the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Jaffna, mentions a dispute relating to only Sivapalan and the only correspondence they had with the Employer was on 22.5.72, but according to the evidence of the Labour Department Officer, inquiries into what appeared to be an industrial dispute were commenced on 9.6.72, when Mr. Rajanayagam was commissioned

to investigate whose opinion of the alleged dispute was that it was a storm in a tea cup. He did not put it in these words, but the Court understood him to mean that only one worker was involved whose reinstatement the Union was pressing. Even this the Employer had stated that he had inquired into the moment Sivapalan sent his explanation to the charges, but he had not sent his explanation by the due date; and therefore he and the others who went on strike were treated by Glass Works as having vacated their jobs. The Employer had even gone to the extent of interdicting two others along with Sivapalan at the request of the Union which maintained that those two also would have had a hand in the alleged act of Sivapalan; and against those two people disciplinary action was taken when they gave in explanations and they were taken back to work. The only evidence before Court regarding the strike of 12.6.72, is that of the Trade Union representative. Evidence of any decision to strike by the Union such as a Court could be expected to accept was not forthcoming. The minutes of the meeting, if meeting there was, where a decision was arrived at to resort to strike action could have been produced but was not produced. Hence the Court is constrained to conclude that the decision to strike was a figment of the imagination of the Union.

I reject the evidence of the Union and accept the evidence adduced by Glass Works. According to this evidence, considerable damage has been caused to the industry run by Glass Works by the sudden dislocation of work by a sizeable proportion of the workers going on strike. The evidence regarding the damage has not been refuted by the Union. As many as eight of those who went on strike realising, though later, that they had been led up the garden path by the Union had sought re-employment by the Glass Works and been reinstated, and the Award will now apply only to the 14 workers out of the 24 in the Schedule as stated earlier.

Strike as a weapon of trade Union action has to be resorted to when all other genuine and serious attempts at conciliation and negotiation concerning industrial disputes have successfully failed. If without provocation or on the slightest provocation workmen down tools swayed by their whims and caprices, such acts assume the character of absence of action enshrined in the law which can result in industrial dislocation and even chaos. Here, in this case the Court finds that the Union has acted irresponsibly misguiding the workmen who alone are now left to pay the penalty for the folly of the Union which

espoused their cause without due regard to the requirements of the dynamics that play in the field of employer-employee relations.

There was no need for the Union to have raised a hornets' nest in the industrial sphere of Glass Works by prematurely calling a strike of its members and imperilling their future prospects in the employment sphere. It is not the Union but its innocent members who today have to pay for the folly of their patron Saint.

The Union should have been concerned in healing the sore, instead of pricking it, by persuading Sivapalan to send in his explanation as called for by the Management of Glass Works before the dead line or even later after asking for an extension of time if it became necessary and then awaited developments in this single individual's matter of interdiction before resorting to strike action.

Had a saner and more responsible course of action been adopted by the Union in the matter of the approach by the Management of Glass Works to Sivapalan's case industrial stability and harmony would not have been thrown out of gear with consequent loss of face to the Union and financial loss to the industry. A Union should bear in mind that it should not assume the role of a bug-bear to intimidate and bludgeon Employers into yielding to its demands capriciously and whimsically made in season and out of season brandishing in the face of the Employer the strongest and most potential weapon in its armoury, but that a Union is an organisation with defined rights enshrined in the law that creates it but that such rights have to be exercised and availed of in the interests of industrial tranquility with restraint, sobriety and circumspection and that too if and when positive assertion of such rights becomes necessary only.

This Court is satisfied, taking into consideration all the evidence oral and documentary, that the non-offer of work by the Glass Works to the workers, whose case is under consideration is justified and the Court holds that no one is entitled to any relief whatsoever that could be given under the provisions of the Industrial Disputes Act, and I make my award accordingly.

I am deeply grateful to Mr. Vallipuram for the clear and lucid exposition of the law on the subject of strikes as a weapon in the armoury of the workmen.
