Order under Section 4 (1)

SCHEDULE

A Manager means an employee who is in overall charge of the hotel.

A Cashier means a person who is wholly or mainly employed to receive or pay money, have the custody of money, maintain the cash book and other necessary records and attend to the banking of money.

A Telephone Operator means a person who is mainly employed to operate the telephone switch board and to make and answer telephone calls.

A Grinder means a person who is employed to grind ingredients for the preparation of food in the hotel.

A Supervisor or a Head Waiter means an employee who is wholly or mainly employed in supervising the work of Waiters, Ice Cream Servers, Pantry Boys, Plate Washers, Room Boys and Page Boys.

An Assistant Cashier means a person who is wholly or mainly employed to receive money and to maintain records of the money received.

A Waiter means an employee who is employed to serve food and drinks and to perform other duties ancillary thereto.

A Packer means an employee who is wholly or mainly employed to pack and deliver articles of food in or about the hotels.

An Assistant Packer means an employee who is wholly or mainly employed to pack articles of food not consumed within the premises.

An Assistant Bar Keeper means an employee employed wholly or mainly to assist the Bar Keeper in managing the liquor Bar.

A Room Boy means an employee who is wholly or mainly employed to make beds, clean and tidy bed rooms and to wait on the occupants of such rooms.

A Page Boy means a person who is wholly or mainly employed to deliver food, drinks, crockery, cutlery and linen to waiters for the purpose of serving customers and to maintain the pantry.

A Plate Washer means a person who is wholly or mainly employed to wash and clean crockery, cutlery and utensils.

An un-skilled Labourer means a person who, not being a cookmate, is employed to perform any unskilled work.

An Ice Cream Server means a person who is wholly or mainly employed to attend to the Ice Cream machine and to serve ice cream to customers either directly or through waiters.

A Table Cleaner an employee who does table cleaning and work ancillary to it.

A Bar Keeper means a person employed to manage the liquor bar and to maintain the necessary records.

A Cook Mate means a labourer wholly or mainly employed in or about the kitchen of a hotel to perform unskilled work.

A Billiard Marker means an employee employed by residential hotels to maintain the billiard room and the equipment and mark the scores and to perform other ancillary duties.

An Assistant Cook means an employee who is employed to assist the cook in the preparation of meals.

A Tea Brewer means a person who is wholly or mainly employed to brew tea and prepare other similar beverages, operate and maintain any apparatus used for such purposes and perform duties ancillary thereto.

A Rotti Maker means a person who is wholly or mainly employed to make one or more of the following :—rotti, string-hoppers hoppers, those, wade and pastries.

A Sweet Maker means a person who is wholly or mainly employed to make sweet-meals commonly known as Indian Sweetes.

A Clerk means an employee (not being a bill clerk, a book-keeper or receptionist) who is wholly or mainly employed on clerical work including type-writing and accounts.

A Receptionist means a clerical employee whose duties consists wholly or mainly in doing reception work in residential hotels.

A Bill Clerk means an employee who is wholly or mainly employed in the task of writing out bills issued to customers.

A Book Keeper means an employee whose duties consist wholly or mainly of maintaining the books of accounts of a hotel including the drawing up of the balance sheet.

A Short Eat Maker means a person who is employed in making rolls, patties, outlets and other short eats.

An Ice Cream Mixer means an employee who is employed in mixing ice cream and the preparation of cool drinks.

A Cost Clerk means a person who is wholly or mainly engaged in preparation of daily estimates of expenditure of food and maintenance of registers for that purpose.

“Store-keeper” means a person employed in-charge of a store room where the bulk stores are kept and who is responsible for the maintenance of necessary books and records connected with store keeping.

An Assistant Store-keeper means a person employed to assist the Store-keeper in discharge of his duties.

A Wages Clerk is a person employed to prepare pay sheets and other registers connected with the payment of wages of the employees.

An Assistant Manager is a person employed to assist the Manager in discharge of his duties.

String Hopper Maker means a person who is wholly or mainly employed to make String Hoppers.

Hopper Maker means a person who is wholly or mainly employed to make hoppers.

Assistant Supervisor is a person employed to assist the Supervisor in discharge of his duties.

Butler is an employee who is wholly or mainly employed in supervising the work of employees attached to the kitchen and dining room.

Award

The Honourable the Minister of Labour has, by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 4 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon (1956 Revised Edition), as amended by Acts, Nos. 14 of 1957, 62 of 1957, 4 of 1962 and 39 of 1968 (read with Industrial Disputes (Special Provisions) Act, No. 37 of 1968) hereby referred the abovementioned industrial dispute to me for settlement by arbitration—*vide* his Order dated 3rd March, 1972.

The matter in dispute between the aforesaid parties is whether the non-offer of work to the following workers who are members of the above Union by the Management of Sri Lanka Distilleries Limited, Wadduwa, is justified and to what relief each of them is entitled.

The Industrial and General Workers' Union was represented by Mr. Rajah Collure, Proctor S.C., at the early stages, then by Mr. Victor de Mel, and thereafter by Mr. M. A. Azeez. The Respondent Company's interests were looked after by Mr. L. W. Athulathmudali, Advocate, with Mr. N. T. S. Kularatne, Advocate, instructed by Mr. Leslie Peiris.

According to the Employer, the Respondent Company carries on the business of manufacturing and supply of liquor. The right to carry on this business is governed by law, and can be carried on only on a contract and licence given by the Excise Commissioner. Upon this licence arrack is manufactured and delivered to Government. If this licence is not granted, it would be an illegal act to manufacture. The licence is granted

each year either at the end of March or at the beginning of April, and lapses at the end of the year. From January 01 to March there was no authority to manufacture arrack. The period of the licence is entirely at the discretion of the Government. As a result work can only be offered to the employees after the issue of the licence. All the distilleries offer work to their workmen on an annual contract for the period April to December.

In December, 1970, the contract of the Applicants amongst the workers ended. As usual the Employer expects all the workmen to make the customary application for employment during the Season. 43 workmen made the customary application. Six of the Applicants, except P. Sooriarachchi (No. 1, in the reference) did not forward the customary application, but stated that they should be given work without applications being called as usual. They wanted continuous employment. Their offer was refused.

As regards P. Sooriarachchi, he asked for light work in October, 1970, on grounds of ill-health. His work was as a toddy receiver. No lighter work could have been given. He worked till December, 1970. Thereafter he did not come for work nor made any fresh application for employment.

According to the Applicant Union all seven workmen were in regular employment under the Employer. This distillery not only manufactures arrack, but also manufactures Gin. It is common ground that arrack is manufactured only during the period of the licence normally between April to December. However the manufacture of Gin and rectified spirits goes on right throughout the year, especially during the period January to March. These Applicants are employed in the Distillery. During the off period for the non-manufacture of arrack other work is done in the Distillery. (This to some extent is admitted by the Employer). The Applicants have worked in the Distillery for a number of years. The Employer has refused employment from 05.12.70.

This case went on for several dates of inquiry.

I am happy to state that on 04.08.73, the parties, after much discussion, have arrived at the following terms of settlement, in respect of the following workers:—

No. 2.—E. A. Ariyasena  
 No. 3.—E. A. Publis Perera  
 No. 4.—L. Ebert Fernando  
 No. 5.—H. A. Jayasena Rodrigo  
 No. 6.—Silmon Perera

The case of the 7th Applicant in the reference had been settled earlier.

The Employer undertook to pay the undermentioned workers the following sums of money, *ex gratia*, in full and final satisfaction of all claims, statutory and otherwise.

The Union accepted the above offer in satisfaction of the matters in dispute, and all claims statutory and otherwise, in respect of these workers.

The Employer will deposit the said sums of money with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Kalutara, on or before 15th September, 1973.

The Employer will also deposit with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Kalutara, on the date of payment of the above sums of moneys all Certificates of Service of the Employees.

As regards Aron Boteju (No. 7 in the reference)—Rs. 1,285.20—a cheque was paid to him in full settlement of his dues.

As regards the case against the first person mentioned in the reference, namely, Mr. P. Sooriarachchi, I find that the reference is with regard to the non-offer of work. The case of P. Sooriarachchi has been, I think, inadvertently added on with the case of the other Applicants.

The case of P. Sooriarachchi, it transpired, is clearly different from the other Applicants. Therefore, I think a fresh reference should be made with regard to the case of Sooriarachchi.

I inform the Applicant Union of the fact that they are at liberty to withdraw the representations as regards Sooriarachchi in this reference and to make application for a new reference.

At this stage Mr. Azceez withdraws the application, with the liberty to make a fresh application before a Labour Tribunal, or the Industrial Court, with regard to this matter.

Mr. Athulathmudali objects and states that the application is on the ground that the reference is whether there was a non-offer of work to P. Sooriarachchi, and on his own evidence it is clear that no such thing happened. In the circumstances he submits that the Court will make an award in regard to the non-offer of work, in respect of Sooriarachchi also. The award should be in terms of the reference. He says that the Court can consider an application only after giving an award in terms of the reference made by the Honourable Minister of Labour.

I note that since the merits of the application of this Applicant has not been gone into that I will be in order to permit Mr. P. Sooriarachchi to withdraw from this case with permission to file a fresh reference before the appropriate Court.

As regards the settlement arrived at, I consider the terms of settlement just and equitable.
