THE CEYLON ASSOCIATION FOR THE ADVANCEMENT OF SCIENCE ACT, No. 11 of 1966

AMENDMENTS to the Rules and Regulations of the Ceylon Association for the Advancement of Science appearing in Ceylon Government Gazette No. 14,710 of 26th August, 1966, by virtue of the powers vested in the General Committee of the Corporation by Sections 9, 10 and 11 of the Ceylon Association for the Advancement of Science Act No. 11 of 1966.

(Passed at the Twenty Eighth Annual Meeting of the General Committee held on 16th December, 1972).

(a) Amend Rule 6.2 to read as follows:—

The following Sections shall be provided for the present:—

- (a) Medical and Veterinary Sciences;
- (b) Agricultural Sciences and Forestry;
- (c) Engineering, Architecture and Surveying;
- (d) Natural Sciences (Botany, Zoology, Fisheries, Geology and Mineralogy);
- (e) Physical Sciences (Chemistry, Biochemistry, Physics, Mathematics, Statistics, Astronomy and Meteorology);
- (f) Social Sciences (Anthropology, Archaeology, Demography, Economics, Education, Geography, Psychology and Sociology);

(b) Insert New Section 8 as follows:—

8. Committee for the Popularization of Science.—

- (1) Purpose:—There shall be set up within the Association a Committee called and known as the 'Committee for the Popularization of Science' for the purpose of popularizing science.
- (2) Constitution:—The 'Committee for the Popularization of Science' shall consist of 18 members elected by the General Committee. The Council shall recommend to the General Committee the names of members for election. The Committee shall include at least one representative from each section. The President-elect of the Association shall be an ex-officio member of the Committee.

The Committee for the Popularization of Science shall elect annually its own Chairman and Secretary from among its elected members and shall frame its own regulations provided that nothing in the regulations so framed shall be in conflict with any of the rules and regulations of the association.

(3) Functions and Powers.—The Committee for the the Popularization of Science shall—

- (a) take suitable action to popularize science with a bearing on the national interest;
- (b) advise the general public or any person and/or institution on the application of Scientific methods to various activities in their day-to-day life with a view to create an attitude in them on the scientific way of thinking;
- (c) do all other things as may be considered necessary and are incidental to the above functions with the common objective of popularizing science;
- (d) make semi-annual and annual reports to the Council.

(4) Funds:—(a) The Council of the Ceylon Association for the Advancement of Science (CAAS), shall allocate annually to a fund called the 'Popularization of Science Fund' sums of money from the funds of the Association, and the Committee for the Popularization of Science, with the approval of the Council, may also devise ways and means of obtaining additional contributions to the Fund by way of gifts/donations/endowments or other such methods;

- (b) All Funds to the Popularization of Science Fund shall be received and acknowledged by the Treasurer of the Association who shall maintain a separate account of the fund;
- (c) The 'Popularization of Science Fund' shall be used for promoting the functions specified in Section 3 above or for such other purposes required by the Council;
- (d) All monies paid out of the fund shall be on the certificate of the Chairman or the Secretary of the Committee for the Popularization of Science.

- (5) *Audit.*—The accounts of the 'Popularization of Science Fund' shall be maintained separately from from other funds by the Treasurer of the Association and shall be subjected to audit.
- (6) *Tenure of membership.*—The term of office of every member of the Committee for the Popularization of Science shall be three years. A member will be eligible for re-election only after the lapse of one year. In the case of the first Committee under these rules the General Committee shall elect three groups. The first group will be appointed for three year term of office, the second group for a two year term of office and the third group for a one year of office; each group consists of six members.
- (7) *Co-opting.*—The Committee for the Popularization of Science shall have the right to co-opt members provided that Council ratification is obtained. It shall also have the right to invite persons to attend its meetings, but such person or persons and co-opted members shall have no voting rights in the Committee.
- (8) *Meetings.*—The Committee for the Popularization of Science shall meet periodically, and in any case, at intervals not exceeding two months. Any member absenting himself from three consecutive meetings without leave of the Chairman shall be deemed to have forfeited his membership.
- (9) *Members not eligible to receive any payment.*—All members of the Committee for the Popularization of Science shall be honorary members and shall not be eligible to receive any payment from the Popularization of Science funds, provided, however, they shall be eligible to receive monies solely in reimbursement of out-of-pocket expenses for work as approved by the Committee for Popularization of Science.
- (10) *Vacancies in Committee.*—In the event of any vacancies occurring in the Committee for the Popularization of Science in between two annual meetings of the General Committee, the Committee for Popularization of Science shall recommend to the Council for approval the names of persons suitable to be appointed by the Council to fill such vacancies in the Committee. All such appointments shall hold good only until the date of the next meeting of the General Committee.
- (11) *Matters not provided for in these rules.*—On all matters not provided for in these rules the decision of the Council shall be final and binding on all members of the Committee.
- (c) *Amend existing Sections 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12.*—to read 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 respectively.

AWARD

The Honourable the Minister of Labour, has by virtue of the powers vested in him by Section 4 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131, of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon (1956

Revised Edition), as amended by Acts Nos. 14 of 1957, 62 of 1957, 4 of 1962 and 39 of 1968 (read with Industrial Disputes (Special Provisions) Act No. 37 of 1968), and by his Order dated 19th July, 1971, referred the aforesaid industrial dispute to me for settlement by arbitration.

The matter in dispute between the aforesaid parties is whether the demand of the payment of gratuities and/or compensation to the employees referred to below, who are members of the aforesaid Union, consequent on the closure of business by Mr. M. M. Osman, the former Proprietor of Pilawoos Hotel, is justified, and if so, what quantum of gratuity and/or compensation should each of them be paid.

On 24.8.71, when this case came up for inquiry Mr. M. A. Haniffa appeared for the Union, and neither Mr. Osman was present nor was he represented. For reasons given by me, I called upon Mr. Haniffa to lead evidence and he called Mr. Joseph Manual, an employee of the Hotel as his first witness.

On 8. 10. 71, Mr. A. L. M. Hidayathulla, Advocate, instructed by Mr. C. J. B. Seneviratne, appeared for Mr. M. M. Osman, and Mr. M. A. Haniffa for the Union. From 29. 10.71 onwards, Advocate Mr. Peter Jayasekera, instructed by Mr. Rajah Collure, appeared for the Union.

According to the Statement of the Union dated 4. 8. 71 submitted to Court, the employees who joined the services of the Employer, Mr. M. M. Osman at various times (vide Statement where the month and year of employment of the employee is given) were terminated on 19.9.70, and certain sums of money are now lying in the Labour Department, such as salaries for July, August and September 1970, along with other benefits other than gratuity which the Union claims as one month's salary for each year of service and which the Employer agreed to deposit at the Labour Department but has not done so thus violating the terms of the agreement reached between the parties at the conferences held.

This is a dispute between the workers of Pilawoos Hotel and Mr. M. M. Osman, the Proprietor who by the time the year 1970 dawned found that he was perilously on the brink of bankruptcy and was forced to abandon what at the time turned out to be a white elephant, and thus after over three decades of serving the public with sumptuous and palatable delicacies to tickle the palates of even the most exacting and fastidious gourmards, the shutters of Pilawoos went down on 18. 9. 70. It was at this stage that these workers who are now before me in this Court took over the building and equipment and ran the Hotel as a business concerned advertised as 'New Pilawoos Hotel'.

After a few days, the workers who had thus forcibly taken physical possession of the building and equipment ran riot damaging the furniture, fittings and the existing electrical equipment of the buildings, a rumpus that necessitated the calling of the Police which kept vigil in the premises of the building off and on. It was at this time that the Inland Revenue Department seized upon the building and equipment to retrieve for itself even some part of what was due from Mr. Osman by way of Tax to the Department which went into the premises and netted a sum of Rs. 8,000. Mr. Osman thus, it would appear to me, was forced to penury and impoverishment. Nevertheless, at certain conferences between Mr. Osman, his representative and the Union in the Labour Department agreement was reached for a settlement. It would appear to me that according to the settlement arrived at, at the various conferences, the Union agreed to accept a sum of Rs. 21,851.91 which was offered on behalf of Mr. Osman on three cheques for Rs. 7,000, Rs. 3,000 and Rs. 11,851.91. It was maintained by Mr. Haniffa that a cheque for a sum of Rs. 14,000 was also tendered on behalf of Mr. Osman by Mr. Charles Vethacan, a Proctor of the Supreme Court, who gave evidence in this case, but this cheque for Rs. 14,000 has not come to the Union, and that it is in the Labour Department. Mr. Vethacan denied when giving evidence that any cheque for Rs. 14,000 was tendered as part payment or by way of any payment at all; but that the negotiated amount for settlement was only Rs. 21,851.91. Even Mr. Stephen Silva, Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo North, supported Mr. Vethacan in this respect. If it is true that a cheque for Rs. 14,000 was handed over to the Labour Department, then it would be that four cheques in all were given on behalf of Mr. Osman to the Union, and that the cheque for Rs. 14,000 sent by him in March 1970, would be missing from the custody of the Labour Department. It is very strange that if Mr. Haniffa became aware that a cheque for such a large amount which has been tendered as part payment of the amount agreed upon for settlement, that when he realised that it was missing from the custody of the Labour Department that he did not think it necessary that serious notice should be taken of the fact and speedy action taken to retrieve the same from wherever it was.

I accept the evidence of Mr. Stephen Silva, the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, without the slightest hesitation, and I am satisfied that the cheque for Rs. 14,000 was never given to a Labour Official of the Labour Department as part payment and that it is a figment of imagination of Mr. Haniffa that Rs. 14,000 also was ever intended by Mr. Osman to be paid to the Union.

According to the evidence of Mr. Stephen Silva, the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, on 8.3.71, Mr. Haniffa told him that the parties are anxious to settle the dispute and the Employer agreed. In the presence of all parties a cheque for Rs. 11,851.91 was tendered by Mr. Vethacan on behalf of Mr. Osman to the Assistant Commissioner of Labour. This was the total sum computed by a Labour Officer as representing statutory dues and one month's total wages. He further stated that Mr. Osman on 9.3.71 came to the Labour Department and, having paid cash, withdrew the cheque for Rs. 11,851.91, including a sum of Rs. 4,247.50 reflecting the total wages of the employees for one month. These would not be statutory dues, since the Labour Officer who compiled the figures has not mentioned the sum as salary due against a month. Besides, short payments

have been mentioned in the list up to the end of September, 1970. The Hotel was closed down on 18.9.70. So this sum of Rs. 4,247.50 represents a month's salary paid as part settlement of the dispute. Therefore, the Union's contention that Rs. 11,851.91 represents the total statutory dues would be incorrect.

Mr. Charles Vethacan was the Proctor for the Employer, Mr. Osman, when the settlement was being negotiated. He said that he was aware that the Management had been suffering losses and had to pay taxes, and that was the reason why the proprietor was forced to close down the Hotel, Mr. Osman had even to go to the Criminal Court and file a case against the employees for trespass.

Mr. Vethacan's evidence was that he was a party to the discussions which were held to settle the dispute between the two parties amicably, and it was finally agreed between the parties that a sum of Rs. 21,851.91 be paid in full and final settlement of all the Union's claims. It was agreed that the criminal case filed by Mr. Osman against the employees for trespass in the Magistrate's Court would be withdrawn, and that after the settlement of the dispute both parties proceeded to the Police Station, Pettah, where this settlement was recorded. According to the Police who gave evidence in this case, it was then that the Officer-in-Charge of the Police handed over keys of the Hotel to Mr. Osman, and Mr. Vethacan's evidence was that at no time did Mr. Osman agree, as was maintained by the Union, to reimburse the expenses of the Union, for maintenance of the employees after the physical take over of Pilawoos Hotel, when Mr. Osman closed it down on 18.9.70. Mr. Vethacan also said that the cheque for Rs. 14,000 was handed over at the earliest stages of the negotiations for a settlement at the Labour Department as 'earnest money', a few days before the settlement. Once the settlement was reached the cheque was withdrawn, by Mr. Vethacan on 8.3.71.

On the evidence I am satisfied that a substantial sum of money had been paid by Mr. Osman representing the amount negotiated upon, for a full settlement of the dues to the employees, and that this sum viz., Rs. 21,851.91 was paid on Mr. Osman's behalf to the Union. Whether the employees in question in the case benefited by this amount or whether the entire sum or any part of it only reached the intended destination would be of no concern to the erstwhile employer Mr. Osman who I am convinced has satisfied his obligations towards his employees within the limits of the agreement reached between him and the Union in the matter of the relief the Union deemed adequate so far as the dispute went.

The workers should be alive to an awareness of the need to elect for responsible offices in the Unions to which they belong persons who are trustworthy and dependable, not only to fight their battles but also to dole out to them their due share of the plums of victory if and when they succeed in the cause for which they battle. In this case it does not at all appear to me from the evidence that these workers derived their fair share of the substantial sum of money which Mr. Osman has handed out to the Union according to the settlement arrived at between the two parties at the various conferences at Labour Department level.

I hold that no one of the employees mentioned in the Statement of the Commissioner of Labour is entitled to any further relief by way of gratuity and/or compensation, and that the sum of Rs. 21,851.91, already paid to the Union and accepted by Mr. Haniffa on their behalf is quite adequate and satisfactory compensation in the circumstances. I do not think it would be just and equitable in the strained financial circumstances in which Mr. Osman is placed today to order him to make a further hand-out to employees who are involved in this dispute for the reason that it is the employees of Mr. Osman who fouled the Proprietor's nest and dug their own graves.

I order that the claim of each and every one of the employees of Pilawoos Hotel, formerly owned by Mr. M. M. Osman for gratuity and/or compensation fails, and that none of them who has come before this Court is entitled to any relief, whatsoever.

I make award accordingly.

Award

The Learned Commissioner of Labour by virtue of the powers vested in him by Section 3 (1) (d) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131, as amended by Industrial Disputes (Amendments) Acts numbers 14 and 62 of 1957, 4 of 1962, and 39 of 1968 (read with Industrial Disputes (Special Provisions) Act, No. 37 of 1968), appointed me as Arbitrator and referred the dispute to me for settlement by arbitration by order dated 12th March, 1973.

The parties to the dispute have consented to the reference of the dispute for settlement by arbitration and have jointly nominated me as Arbitrator.

The matter in dispute between the Ceylon Mercantile Union and Messrs. Lewis Brown & Company Limited is whether the termination of the services of Mr. R. A. Piyasena by Messrs. Lewis Brown & Company Limited, is justified and to what relief if any, is Mr. R. A. Piyasena entitled.

Mr. Advocate Motilal Nehru with Mr. S. Mahendran instructed by Mr. S. Sivadasan appeared for the Ceylon Mercantile Union.

Mr. V. L. Wirasinha, Managing Director Lewis Brown & Company Limited, appeared for the Management.

Mr. Wirasinha submitted that by letter dated 25th May, 1972, Mr. R. A. Piyasena was asked to explain why he should not be dismissed from the services of the Company or otherwise punished for the following acts of grave misconducts.

- (1) "Having received from the Despatch Section of the stores of this Company a case of S. M. A. Infants' milk food on 16th May, 1972, for delivery at premises No. 136, Dam Street, occupied by the Transport Agent of Messrs. Haggala Stores, Haggala, Ellakala, along with the related invoice, you neither delivered the said goods or invoice at the said premises, nor returned them to this Company either on the 16th May or at any time thereafter, but misappropriated the said goods to yourself or otherwise fraudulantly disposed of them to the detriment of this Company.
- (2) You did not, up to 22nd May, inform this Company or any person in authority in the Company's employ of your omission to effect delivery of the goods as directed or your failure to return them to this Company.
- (3) On being questioned about this matter on 22nd May, by Mr. G. Kurukulasuriya, Director of this Company, you stated to him that you had returned the said goods, together with the related invoice to Mr. L. V. Samarawickrema of the Despatch Section of the Stores of this Company, knowing that statement to be false, with the intention of misleading Mr. Kurukulasuriya and concealing the offence you had committed in respect of them as set out at (1) above."

Subsequently on the 12th of June, 1972, Mr. R. A. Piyasena was dismissed as, "The charges are therefore deemed to have been proved against you and you are accordingly dismissed from the services of this Company." No domestic inquiry was held.

Mr. Nehru appearing for the Union submitted that there is no evidence that Mr. R. A. Piyasena misappropriated the goods as alleged by the Company.

Evidence was led for the Management and the witnesses were cross-examined at length.

However, on the 26th day of July, 1973, parties and Counsel assumed the responsibility of settling the dispute on the following terms:—

- (1) "The Company agrees to re-employ Mr. R. A. Piyasena with effect from 1st July, 1973.
- (2) Mr. R. A. Piyasena's re-employment will be without a break in service but he will not be entitled to any back wages.
- (3) Mr. Wirasinha, Director of Lewis Brown & Co. Ltd., offers to pay a reasonable amount as ex-gratia payment as Mr. R. A. Piyasena has been out of employment from May, 1972."

(vide proceedings of 16th July, 1973 and 26th July, 1973).

I consider the terms just and equitable and I make by Award accordingly.
