11. Tenderers shall employ only Ceylonese local labour in carrying out the service under the contract. The term "Ceylonese" shall mean and include a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration. The employment of non-Ceylonese labour without the prior permission and concurrence of the Superintendent of Health Services, Colombo, will be considered a breach of the contract and will render the contract liable to be cancelled and the contractor penalised in terms of the conditions of contract.

12. The contractor shall indemnify the Government against any claims by or in respect of any employee of the contractor under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934 or any statutory amendments, modifications or extensions thereof.

13. A sum not exceeding Rs. 400 in cash will be required as security for the whole contract or part of it as may be demanded by the Superintendent of Health Services, Colombo.

14. The successful tenderer should be prepared to enter into a contract with the Director of Health Services for the satisfactory performance of the contract. Should the successful tenderer decline or fails to enter into a contract or fail to furnish the approved security within 10 days of receiving notice in

writing from the Superintendent of Health Services, Colombo, or his duly authorised representative that his tender has been accepted, the tender deposit shall be forfeited and the tenderer's name is liable to be included in the list of Crown Defaulting Contractors. Notice of acceptance of tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left at the address given by the tenderer in the tender.

15. The contract shall not be assigned or sublet without the prior authority of the Superintendent of Health Services, Colombo. The Government reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognise a power of attorney issued by a contractor to any person authorising such person to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf.

16. The Superintendent of Health Services, Colombo, may for reasons which appear to him sufficient give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any person/s specified in such notice and no such person/s shall be employed by the contractor.

17. The Government reserves to itself the right to reject without question, any or all tenders and the right of accepting any portion of tender.

18. The Superintendent of Health Services, Colombo is at liberty to get the said service or work performed or executed in or by any manner or means and by any other person other than the Contractor, notwithstanding the agreement which the Contractor will enter into with the Director of Health Services and in such event the Contractor shall have no right or claim of any kind to compensation, damages, rebate or any other remuneration caused by any consequent loss of work to himself.

19. In case the contractor shall fail or delay to convey and deliver goods or stores entrusted to him as aforesaid on two or more occasions or shall repeatedly fail to convey or deliver such goods or stores or shall violate any of these conditions he shall be deemed to have not fulfilled the contract and the contractor shall forfeit to the Government of Ceylon the deposit furnished by him as security for the due performance of the contract and his name is liable to be included in the list of Crown Defaulting Contractors precluding him from having any concern in a Government Contract.

20. The laws of the Government of Ceylon will apply to this contract.

21. Tenderers must acquaint themselves fully with the conditions of tender. No plea of lack of information or insufficient information will be entertained at any time.
