 - (iii) appeal to the appropriate Medical Officer of the Senior Administrative Grade if that decision is made by any Medical Officer, Deputy Administrative Grade, the Secretary/Accountant to any Superintendent of Health Services, the Secretary to the Superintendent, Colombo Group of Hospitals, the Secretary/Accountant to the Superintendent of Mental Health Services, the Secretary/Accountant to the Superintendent of the Anti-Malaria Campaign, the Secretary/Accountant to the Superintendent of the Anti-Tuberculosis Campaign, any Medical Officer in charge of a Medical Institution, any Medical Officer of Health, the Principal, Dental Nurses Training School, any Hospital Secretary or a clerk in Grade I of the Hospital Clerical Service who is departmentally designated Hospital Secretary.

3. The expression "1st year of employment" in paragraph 2 of this determination, in respect of employment under any employer means the period of 12 consecutive months commencing on the date on which an employee first took employment under that employer.

4. For the purpose of this determination—

- (1) "sales assistant" means a person employed for the purpose of serving customers within the meaning of the Shop and Office Employees' (Regulation of Employment and Remuneration) Act (Chapter 129);
- (2) "clerk" means a person who is wholly or mainly employed on clerical work including typewriting and accounts;
- (3) "cashier" means a person who is wholly or mainly employed to receive and/or pay money, have the custody of money, maintain such records and books as are necessary and attend to the banking of money when called upon to do so;
- (4) "book keeper" means an employee whose duties consist wholly or mainly of maintaining the books of accounts of a shop and/or office including the drawing up of the balance sheet;
- (5) "telephone operator" means a person who is wholly or mainly employed to operate the telephone switch board to make and receive telephone calls, to answer telephoned inquiries, and to maintain such records as are incidental thereto;
- (6) "store keeper" means a person employed in charge of a store room where the bulk stores are kept and responsible for the maintenance of necessary books and records connected with such store keeping;
- (7) "labourer" means a person who is employed to perform any unskilled work;
- (8) "typist" means a person wholly or mainly employed in typewriting;

AWARD

The Honourable Minister of Labour has, by virtue of the powers vested in him by Section 4 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon (1956 Revised Edition), as amended by Acts, Nos. 14 of 1957, 62 of 1957, 4 of 1962 and 39 of 1968 (read with Industrial Disputes (Special Provisions) Act, No. 37 of 1968), and by his Order dated 3rd August, 1972, referred the above dispute to me for settlement by arbitration.

The matter in dispute between the aforesaid parties is whether the non-payment of Bonus for the year 1969 by the Management of Ceylon Development Engineering Company Limited to the 597 workers whose names appear in the attached schedule and who are members of the Industrial and General Workers' Union is justified and to what relief each of them is entitled.

The inquiry into this dispute commenced on 10.11.1972 and ended on 29.6.1973. Thereafter, written submissions were sent to me by both parties.

The applicant Union was represented for the most part by Mr. Victor de Mel and, when he was absent, by Mr. A. N. A. Azeez. The Respondent firm was represented throughout by its Secretary, Mr. A. F. J. De Vos.

The request of the union was that the 597 workers listed in the schedule to the reference and who were said to be members of the Industrial and General Workers' Union should also be paid the bonus for the year 1969 in the same way as certain other grades of workers in the firm on the ground that these 597 workers had also contributed their share in earning profits for the firm during that year. The union alleged that the firm had discriminated against these 597 workers by overlooking them when the bonus was paid and had thereby done them an injustice.

The case for the respondent firm was that, in respect of the year 1969, its Board had decided to pay a bonus representing a month's salary to only five categories of workers who had not less than one year's service on 31.12.69. The five categories, according to the firm, were as follows:—

- (a) Senior Executive Officers.
- (b) Junior Executive Officers.
- (c) Import Department Staff.
- (d) Other Monthly paid employees.
- (e) Regular Daily paid Staff.

The firm added that the 597 workers listed in the schedule to the reference did not fall within any of the categories mentioned above.

The following witnesses gave evidence for the Union:—

- (1) A. A. P. Harischandra (former Store-Keeper);
- (2) K. Wilson (Stores Labourer);
- (3) N. Balasubramaniam (District Labour Officer, Colombo);
- (4) Timothy Pinto (Greaser);
- (5) A. C. Bandaranaike (Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Industrial Relations); and
- (6) D. M. V. Gunasekera (Welder and Treasurer of the Branch Union).

The witnesses for the respondent firm were:—

- (1) Padmasiri Leelananda (Clerk of the Industrial and General Workers' Union); and
- (2) G. S. M. Schokman (General Manager of the firm).

The union contended that many of the 597 workers listed in the schedule had several years of service in the firm and that, in this respect, they were not different from the workers in the five categories referred to by the firm and that they were, therefore, entitled to the payment of this bonus.

The union led the evidence of witness Harischandra who stated that he had 2½ years service by the end of 1969, at which time the bonus question for 1969 was decided. The union also led the evidence of Wilson who stated that he had four years service and of witness Timothy Pinto who stated that he had nine years service in the firm.

Witness Balasubramaniam, who was called as a witness for the union, expressed the view that a 'Casual' worker or a 'Regular' worker is not defined in the law, but he admitted that 'Casual' and 'Regular' workers can exist and that it is only from their letters of appointment that one can say whether they are 'Casual' or 'Regular'.

Witness Bandaranaikie, who was also summoned by the union, while generally agreeing with the view expressed by the previous witness, stated that the grant of a bonus is a matter for decision by the Management subject to the terms of the Contract of Employment etc.

During the proceedings the firm raised two issues—

- (a) The firm contended that it was unaware whether the persons referred to in the schedule were in fact members of the Union especially at the time the Reference was issued and the firm challenged the Union to prove this fact;
- (b) The Firm argued that the claim for a bonus by the Union was belated because the question of a bonus arose at the end of 1969 whereas the Reference to this Court was issued only on 3.8.72.

Regarding (a) above, witnesses Gunasekera and Leelananda gave evidence and their evidence was generally vague, contradictory and therefore far from satisfactory. However, after these two witnesses gave their evidence, the Union produced 'A 12' and 'A 13', i.e. revised lists said to contain the names of 231 workers who had worked for the Firm for the whole year 1969 but were not paid bonus and who were at the sametime members of the Union on 3.8.1972, i.e. on the date of the Reference. The Union indicated, at this stage, that they were more or less prepared to have this list substituted in place of the schedule containing the names of the 597 workers.

Regarding (b) above, the Union referred to a conference held at the Department of Labour on 14.11.70 at which the Union stated that the question of the 1969 bonus was in fact discussed by the Union at the Department of Labour and the Union also produced 'A 14' i.e. the Notes of a Conference held at the Department of Labour on 16.03.71 regarding this same bonus question—to prove that the Union had been

pursuing the bonus question for the balance workers right from 1970 and that there was no undue delay on their part.

In regard to the dispute between the Union and the Firm, the evidence of witness Schokman (the General Manager), who was the last witness to give evidence, is of direct relevance. He explained that the decision of the Firm's Board was to pay the 1969 bonus only to the following categories:—

Senior Executive Officers, Junior Executive Officers, Import Department Staff, Monthly Paid Employees and Regular Daily Paid employees who had not less than one year's service on 31.12.69. He said that the Board allocated a sum of Rs. 162,000 for this purpose. He explained that at the time the Board made this decision there were in the Firm two categories of daily paid labour i.e. "Casual" and "Regular". "Casual" labour he stated, was labour appointed by the Site Managers and they were not issued letters of appointment as they were of a casual status, and it was not uncommon for casual workers to continue to be casual for even ten years. "Regular" labour, he explained, were appointed only to particular grades such as Mechanics and Operators, only on the occurrence of vacancies and on the basis of efficiency and merit; these appointments were personally approved by him and further they were issued letters of appointment.

He stated that this was the practice in the Firm at the time the 1969 bonus question was considered. He emphasised that, according to this practice, the 597 workers listed in the schedule were all "Casuals" and not "Regulars" and, therefore, they were not entitled to the bonus. He added that this practice was changed only in February, 1972, after the Collective Agreement was entered into and that from February, 1972, there were no casual or regular daily paid staff in the Firm but they are all monthly paid. He further stated in his evidence that, in addition to the 597 workers in the schedule, there were at about this time over 2,000 casual workers at Walawe and about 500 casual workers at Maskeliya and that, if the 597 workers listed in the schedule are to be paid the 1969 bonus, the other 2,500 odd workers also would have to be paid this bonus similarly! He added that the Firm paid only a sum of Rs. 60,200 by way of bonus to 209 Regular daily paid labourers and that, if in addition the 597 workers in the schedule as well as the 2,500 odd workers at Walawe and Maskeliya have to be paid the 1969 bonus, the additional sum of money which the Firm would have to find for such payment would be colossal!

I have considered very carefully all the evidence and the submissions placed before me and, especially in view of the explanations and clarifications given by witness Schokman, I hold that the non-payment of the 1969 bonus by the Firm to the 597 workers listed in the schedule is not unjustified.

I also hold that it would not be fair and equitable that the Firm should, especially at this belated stage, be called upon to pay the bonus in question to the 597 workers listed in the schedule or even to the reduced number of 231 workers listed in document "A 12", particularly as the additional sum of money required for such payment would be very large.

I make my award accordingly.

RENEWAL OF FIREARMS LICENCES FOR 1974
