WILPATTU NATIONAL PARK BLOCK V

All that area of land situated in Grama Sevaka's Division No. 634—Pukkulam and Division No. 635—Pomparippu in Pomparippu Pattu of Puttalam Pattu and Gravets D.R.O.'s Division in Puttalam District, North-Western Province, containing in extent approximately 53,090 acres, exclusive of lot 16 in Inset No. 9 (Pallugaturai Village lots 17—74 in Inset Nos. 10, 11 and 12 (Pukkulam Village) in Topographical Preliminary Plan 12 and lots 2 and 3 in Inset 1 (Veilamudal Village) in Topographical Preliminary Plan No. 25 and bounded as follows:—

North: By a line starting from Kudremalai Point depicted as the North-Western corner of Topo P.P. 12, generally

Regulations

1. These regulations may be cited as Tea Subsidy Regulations, 1973 and shall come into operation from November 3rd, 1973.

2. In accordance with the provisions of these regulations, the Tea Controller may upon application made in that behalf in writing by the proprietor of a tea estate, tea small-holding or tea factory, as the case may be, grant a subsidy to that proprietor from the Tea Subsidy Fund, for the purpose of—

- replanting with vegetatively propagated tea cuttings, the whole or any specified part of such tea estate or tea small-holding;
- applying fertilizer on the whole or any specified part of such tea estate or tea small-holding;
- packing the tea manufactured in such tea factory in chests or other packing materials approved by the Tea Controller.

3. Every application for a subsidy under Regulation 2 shall be made to the Tea Controller in such form as may, from time to time, be provided by him for the purpose.

4. (1) The amount of the subsidy payable for replanting the whole or any specified part of a tea estate or tea small-holding with vegetatively propagated tea cuttings on replanting permits issued on or after November 3rd, 1973, shall be Rs. 4,750 in respect of each acre of the area to be replanted and may be paid in seven instalments in the following manner:—

- the first instalment of Rs. 500 for each acre may be paid after the eradication of the existing tea plants or other vegetation in the area to be replanted;
- the second instalment of Rs. 750 for each acre may be paid after the soil in the area to be replanted has been reconditioned for such period as the Tea Controller may specify;
- the third instalment of Rs. 750 for each acre may be paid after the necessary soil conservation measures have been adopted;
- the fourth instalment of Rs. 1,000 for each acre may be paid after the completion of the replanting;

(e) the fifth instalment of Rs. 500 for each acre may be paid not earlier than one year after the completion of the replanting;

(f) the sixth instalment of Rs. 500 for each acre may be paid not earlier than two years after the completion of the replanting;

(g) the seventh instalment of Rs. 750 for each acre may be paid not earlier than three years after the completion of the replanting.

(2) The second instalment of the subsidy referred to in sub-section 1 (b) shall not be paid in the cases where the Tea Controller is of opinion that the reconditioning of the soil on the area to be replanted is not necessary.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of Tea Subsidy Regulations 1958 published in Gazette No. 11,579 of November 7, 1958 as amended from time to time, the instalments of subsidy falling due for payment on or after 3rd November, 1973 in respect of replanting permits issued prior to such date may be paid at the rates specified in sub-section (1) of this regulation.

(4) In computing the amount of the subsidy payable in any case where the area to be replanted is less than one acre in extent, or where such area includes a part which is less than one acre, the rates specified in sub-section (1) of this regulation as is applicable to that extent or part of the area shall apply in the proportion that such extent or part of the area bears to one acre.

5. (1) It shall be the duty of every person to whom the first instalment of the subsidy has been paid under Regulation 4 to comply with the directions, requirements, restrictions or prohibitions issued by the Tea Controller under Regulation 8 and further maintain the replanted area in good agricultural condition;

(2) The proprietor of a tea estate or tea small-holding to whom one or more instalments of subsidy are yet to be paid under Regulation 4 in respect of an area for which a replanting permit has been issued, shall not sell or otherwise dispose of part or whole of that area without the written approval of the Tea Controller.

6. The amount of subsidy payable for applying fertilizer on the whole or any specified part of a tea estate or tea small-holding shall be determined by the Tea Controller according to the needs of such estate or small-holding subject to a maximum subsidy of Rs. 850 for each acre per annum. This subsidy shall be given in the form of fertilizer supplied by the Tea Controller at half the cost or at such rate as is determined by the Minister.

7. The amount of subsidy payable for chests used for the packing of tea manufactured in a tea factory shall be the excess in price over the sum of Rs. 3 for each set of chest panels.

8. Where a subsidy is payable or has been paid under Regulation 4, 6 or 7 to any person, such person shall within such period of time as the Tea Controller may by notice specify in writing, comply with the directions, requirements, restrictions or prohibitions issued in writing by the Tea Controller as he deems necessary for the purpose of carrying out in a satisfactory manner the replanting of the tea estate or small-holding, application of fertilizer on the tea estate or small-holding or the packing of tea manufactured at the factory, as the case may be.

9. Where the Tea Controller is of opinion that any person to whom a subsidy or portion thereof has been paid, has contravened or failed to comply with any of the provisions of Regulation 5 or 8, the Tea Controller may, by notice in writing require such person to refund so much of the subsidy as has been paid to him forthwith or within such time as may be specified in the notice. No person to whom a notice has been served under this regulation shall fail to comply with that notice.

10. The Tea Controller may, by writing under his hand, authorise any officer of the Tea Control Department to exercise, discharge or perform any of the powers, duties or functions

conferred or imposed on or assigned to the Tea Controller under these Regulations.

11. Every person who—

- contravenes or fails to comply with the provisions of Regulations 5, 8 or 9 or
- makes in any application or declaration under these regulations any statement which he knows to be false in any material particular or
- being an applicant for or receiver of subsidy furnishes any false information to the Tea Controller,

shall be guilty of an offence and shall, on conviction after summary trial by a Magistrate be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 1,000 or to a term of imprisonment of either description not exceeding six months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

12. In these regulations, "Proprietor" in relation to an estate, small-holding or factory means the person registered or deemed to be registered under the provisions of the Tea Control Act, No. 51 of 1957, as the proprietor of such estate, small-holding or factory.

## AWARD

The Commissioner of Labour vide his letter No. C/1.12 dated 20th May, 1972, by virtue of the powers vested in him under Section 3 (1) (d) of the Industrial Disputes Act—Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon (1956 Revised Edition) as subsequently amended (read with Industrial Disputes (Special Provisions) Act, No. 37 of 1968, has referred the following dispute to me for settlement by arbitration:

The matter in dispute is as follows:

(1) Whether the termination of the services of R. D. Dhanapala by his Employer, namely Messrs. Brown & Co. Ltd., Colombo, is justified and to what relief, if any, is he entitled.

The inquiry into this dispute commenced on 30.10.1972 and after several dates of inquiry it concluded on 9.6.1973.

At the commencement of this inquiry Mr. S. M. Fernando, Assistant Secretary, Employers' Federation represented the Respondent-Company while Mr. S. R. Crossette Thamyam appeared for the Applicant Mr. R. D. Dhanapala. Thereafter, Mr. S. M. Fernando, Assistant Secretary of the Employers' Federation, represented the Respondent-Company and Mr. Hidayatulla appeared for the Applicant-workman till the conclusion of the proceedings of the inquiry.

R. D. Dhanapala, the workman concerned, was the Foreman of the Lanka Garage, belonging to the Respondent-Company. His functions were to examine the cars brought in for repairs, to supervise the repairs and finally to test the cars after such repairs.

The Applicant had joined the Respondent-Company on 30th November, 1943, and his services were terminated on 3rd October, 1970, by letter of the even date marked R2. The grounds for the termination of his services were that whilst being an employee of the Respondent-Company at the Lanka Garage he had, on 15th day of August, 1970, (a working day), without the authority of the Management, engaged himself in effecting repairs to the Jaguar Car bearing No. 8806 at a private garage in Mount Lavinia.

The facts leading to the dismissal were as follows—

Mr. Gunaratne the Service Manager at the Respondent's garage states that Messrs. Brown & Co. Ltd., are the Agents for Jaguar cars in Ceylon. One Mr. Jafferjee who is the owner of a Jaguar car had brought his car on 12.8.1970 to the garage to check on some fault in it. The Applicant was asked by him to inspect the car. He took out the car for a trial run and on his return he informed Mr. Gunaratne that there was a noise emanating from the gear-box. Mr. Gunaratne too had confirmed the Applicant's diagnosis. Thereafter Mr. Gunaratne had informed the customer in the presence of the Applicant that he wanted about four days to rectify the defect. But the owner had promised to bring back the car in a week's time as he had to go outstation on some business. On 14th August, Mr. Gunaratne had been informed by a person in the workshop that the Applicant had helped one Arnolis (a garage owner in whose garage this car had been repaired by the Applicant) to purchase some spare-parts from his stores and found that Jaguar gear-box spare-parts had been bought on that day (vide purchase receipt R 1). On the top of this, the Applicant had absented himself from work on the 15th of August. The purchase of the spare-parts and the absence of the applicant from work had aroused the suspicion of Mr. Gunaratne.

Mr. Gunaratne had concluded that the car must have been taken to Arnolis's Garage for repairs. Arnolis too had been a Mechanic at the Respondent-Company. Thereupon on 15th of August, he detailed Daya de Silva and Ranasinghe two of his employees to go to Arnolis's Garage in the afternoon and verify whether this Jaguar car had been deposited there and the Applicant Dhanapala was working on it. He required them to meet him at the Mount Lavinia Hotel after their raid of the Arnolis's Garage. As instructed, Daya de Silva and Ranasinghe in the afternoon of 15.08.1970, proceeded to the Arnolis's Garage

situated at Mount Lavinia. There is a gravel path leading from the Galle Road to Arnolis's Garage. Daya de Silva had stopped his car on the Galle Road itself and had walked along the gravel road with Ranasinghe towards the garage. When they went close to this open garage (about 15 feet from the garage) Daya de Silva testifies that he saw the Applicant doing some repairs to the gear-box of this identical Jaguar car. The car had been jacked up and the engine and the gear-box had been removed. He questioned the Applicant and asked him to make a statement but the Applicant had refused to do so. Daya de Silva offered the applicant a cigarette and on that occasion he had seen grease on the hands of the Applicant. Ranasinghe had lighted the cigarette for the Applicant.

According to Daya de Silva, Arnolis was not in the garage at the time of their visit. They had remained in the Garage for about 15 minutes and had gone to see Mr. Gunaratne at the Mount Lavinia Hotel. Daya de Silva had told Mr. Gunaratne what they had seen at Arnolis's Garage and came back with Gunaratne again to Arnolis's Garage. Gunaratne accompanied by Daya de Silva had come back to the garage. Gunaratne states that he did not see either the Applicant or Arnolis. He had observed that the Jaguar car No. 8806 was in the garage. He also saw the gear-box on the bench. He was emphatic that it was the identical gear-box pertaining to the Jaguar car No. 8806. They had waited in the garage for about 20 minutes on some information that the applicant would be coming back. Failing to meet the applicant, Mr. Gunaratne and his party left the premises.

Dhanapala, the applicant, says that Mr. Jafferjee brought this Jaguar car to the Garage on the morning of 12.8.1970. He tested the car and found a noise in it. Mr. Gunaratne too confirmed his view. Mr. Jafferjee wanted the car after repairs within three days. It was a difficult task. Therefore, he did not undertake to repair the vehicle. Mr. Gunaratne himself had told Mr. Jafferjee that it would take about four days to complete the work and consequently Mr. Jafferjee did not bring the car for repairs on the following day.

It is the evidence of the Applicant that on 14.08.1970 he developed a boil on his cheek and on the 15th the boil had festered and was undergoing quite a lot of pain and suffering. On the 15th at about 2 p.m. Mr. Hallock, a friend of his, had accidentally come to his house and he complained to him of his pain. Mr. Hallock had volunteered to take him to Dr. Aruliah's Dispensary and would be back only at 4 p.m. Thereupon the Arnolis's Garage. Mr. Hallock had dropped him near the Dispensary and gone away promising to come back within one or one and half hours' time. The doctor was not in his Dispensary and would be back only at 4 p.m. Thereupon the Applicant had gone to Arnolis's Garage just behind the Dispensary. He had seen the Jaguar car being repaired by two persons. When he was talking to Arnolis (later he corrected it) just then Daya de Silva and Ranasinghe called him away to the road. They asked him whether he was repairing the car and he denied and further he refused to make a statement to him. He admits that he was given a cigarette by Ranasinghe and it is not his hands that lighted it. They also asked him to wait till they brought Mr. Gunaratne to the place and speeded away. Thereafter he went to the Dispensary and had his medicine. Mr. Hallock arrived and took him back home at about 4 p.m. The Applicant arrogantly says that it was not necessary for him to wait till Gunaratne arrived on the scene.

Arnolis the owner of the garage says that Mr. Jafferjee brought this car to his garage on the 12th or 13th of August. He promised to give the car after repairs in three days' time. It was not a difficult job for him. According to him on 15.8.70 at about 3 p.m. Dhanapala came to his garage when he was coming out of the garage. The Applicant told him that he had come to get medicine for a boil he had under his lower lip. Arnolis had not spoken long to him and he went away and returned to the garage at 5 p.m. When he came back, he had found Gunaratne and another person had come to the garage and recorded that Dhanapala was working in the garage. He also says that Mr. Gunaratne too had come to his garage on other days. Arnolis admits that he brought the spare parts from the Respondent Company on 14.08.1970 and the receipt bears his signature. On being questioned whether he saw Dhanapala at the Lanka Garage on the day of his purchase, he feebly replied, "I may have met him there. I did not tell him about these spare parts". Arnolis denies that the Applicant effected any repairs to the gear-box of the car.

Now to advert to Mr. Hallock's evidence:

Mr. Hallock says that on the 15th of August (supposed day) at about 2.15 p.m. he went to the Applicant's house and there he saw the applicant in a depressed mood suffering from a boil. He readily took him to the Dispensary in Mount Lavinia and promised to fetch him within one or one and a half hours on his way back from Moratuwa. After a lapse of about two hours he had picked the Applicant with medicine at the Dispensary and brought him back home on that day. The applicant had not uttered a word to Mr. Hallock that Gunaratne and his party had come to Arnolis's Garage in search of him on some information that he was repairing the Jaguar car. Mr. Hallock's recollection was that the Applicant told him as regards this incident about three days after he took him to the Dispensary. So much for the facts.

Firstly, it has been suggested by the Counsel for the Applicant that there is a diabolical conspiracy between Gunaratne and Daya de Silva to get rid of Dhanapala (Applicant) as he was a stumbling block in the way of Daya de Silva's promotion. It was further put to Gunaratne that Daya de Silva was related to him on his wife's side. Mr. Gunaratne vehemently resented and refuted these two suggestions. He said that Daya de Silva joined the Company as a Special Apprentice. He had recommended him being the only Special Apprentice in the establishment. A Special Apprentice is a person who is ear-marked for promotion as an executive or for training abroad, but due to circumstances beyond his control he could not be sent abroad. He denied that he, for some reason or other, did not like the Applicant being promoted as a Junior Executive. Mr. Gunaratne further added that he was very fond of the Applicant as he was a good workman. He was instrumental in getting the Applicant a double increment as a Foreman—being the only Foreman to earn such a remuneration. To my mind these suggestions are bare and baseless and they only remain as suggestions.

The fact remains that on 15th of August this Jaguar car was found in Arnolis's Garage with the gear-box and the engine removed. It cannot be denied that on this day the Applicant was found in the garage of Arnolis where the car was lying. It has been admitted on both sides that the Applicant was offered a cigarette by one of the detectives. Why did the Applicant run away from the scene when he was told by Daya de Silva that Gunaratne would be brought to the spot in a short time? He could have produced his bottle of medicine before Mr. Gunaratne and pleaded his innocence.

Arnolis had been a long associate of the Applicant who has now come forward at this late stage to pull his friend out of this difficult situation though he had been reluctant to face the domestic inquiry. It is no wonder that Arnolis would defend his friend and his benefactor who would come to his aid to attend to the more difficult repairs.

Mr. Hallock's evidence cannot go very far to bolster up the Applicant's case. Even if one accepts the evidence of Mr. Hallock that he took the Applicant in his car to the Dispensary at Mount Lavinia, it is not surely on the 15th day of August. What is Mr. Hallock's evidence on this point? "I stopped my car near the Doctor's Clinic to pick him up. He had taken medicine.

Q. Did he tell you any other thing on that day?

A. At that time he did not mention to me anything.

Subsequently I came to know from Dhanapala that some officers had gone to him when he was at Arnolis's Garage after he went to the Doctor". In another place Mr. Hallock says, "I came to know about this incident later. I think three days later he told me about this incident".

Q. How do you know that you went to his house on 15.8.70?

A. Some officers had come in connection with a detection and he told me that it was on that very day that I came to his house."

It was quite apparent from this evidence that Mr. Hallock was not sure of the date. According to the information given by the Applicant and by a process of elimination Mr. Hallock has hit upon 15th as the day of this incident. This evidence does not convince me at all.

I have no doubt in my mind that the Applicant has directed the owner of the Jaguar car to Arnolis's Garage where he often used to work. Arnolis had been very fortunate in getting the spare parts with the assistance of the Applicant. One does not know whether it was a boil or a pimple that disabled the Applicant from working from the 15th to 17th August. It could well be a feigned illness.

Mr. Gunaratne and Daya de Silva struck me as truthful witnesses. I am firmly convinced from the evidence of Daya de Silva that on the day in question the Applicant was repairing the gear-box of the Jaguar car. The Applicant is the handy man Arnolis could employ who is an expert Foreman in handling Jaguar gear-box.

I reject the evidence of the Applicant as unacceptable and unworthy of credit.

The Counsel for the Applicant also submitted that the Applicant is entitled to do outside work during his off hours and on holidays. The worst feature in this case is that the Applicant tested this Jaguar car at his employer's premises and surreptitiously directed the car to be taken to his friend Arnolis's Garage, assisted his quondam co-employee to purchase the spare parts and finally started repairing it at Arnolis's Garage.

There is hardly any redeeming feature to give the Applicant a shadow of relief.

I am satisfied that the termination of the services of the applicant is justifiable and justified.

I make award accordingly.

**IMPORTANCE NOTICE REGARDING PUBLICATION OF GAZETTE**

THE Weekly issue of the *Gazette of the Republic of Sri Lanka (Ceylon)* is normally published on Fridays. If a Friday happens to be a Public Holiday the *Gazette* is published on the working day immediately preceding the Friday. Thus the last date specified for the receipt of notices for publication in the *Gazette* also varies depending on the incidence of public holidays in the week concerned.

The Schedule below shows the dates of publication and the latest time by which notices should be received for publication in the respective weekly *Gazette*. All notices received out of times specified below will not be published. Such notices will be returned to the sender by post for necessary amendment and return if publication is desired in a subsequent issue of the *Gazette*. It will be in the interest of all concerned if those desirous of ensuring the timely publication of notices in the *Gazette* make it a point to see that sufficient time is allowed for postal transmission of notices to the Government Press.

**The Government Printer does not accept payments of subscriptions for the Government Gazette.** Payments should be made direct to the Superintendent, Government Publications Bureau, P. O. Box 500, Secretariat, Colombo 1.

*Note.*—Payments for inserting Notices in the *Gazette of the Republic of Sri Lanka (Ceylon)* will be received by the Government Printer and not by the Superintendent, Government Publications Bureau.
