#### REGULATIONS

- 1. The public slaughter-house proclaimed under section 26 of the Butchers Ordinance (Chapter 272) shall be in charge of the Medical Officer of Health or any Public Health Inspector authorised by him in that behalf subject to the directions of the Chairman. Such officer shall be responsible for the discipline, control and the sanitary conditions within the slaughter-house.
- 2. (1) No person shall slaughter any animal at the slaughter-house—
  - (a) unless such animal has been inspected by the officer appointed by the Council for the purpose, and approved by him as fit to be slaughtered for human food; and
  - (b) unless such animal has been pounded in the cattle pound provided by the Council for such purpose for not less than 24 hours before slaughter; and
  - (c) except between the hours of 6 a.m. and 9 a.m. on any day:

Provided that the Chairman may in exceptional circumstances authorise the slaughter of an animal at any time other than at the time specified herein.

- 2. (2) No person shall slaugter any animal at the slaughter-
  - (a) at any time after the expiry of a period of 72 hours from the time of the approval of that animal under paragraph 2 (1) (b), and
  - (b) if it has been removed alive from the slaugter-house premises after it was approved under paragraph (1) unless it is again inspected and approved under that paragraph as it to be slaughtered for human food.
  - 3. No cow-in-calf shall be slaughtered at the slaughter-house.
- 4. Every person who brings any animal into the premises of the cattle-pound or slaughter-house shall take such measures as may be necessary to ensure that the animal is adequately fed and watered while it remains in those premises.
- 5. Every person who brings any animal into the cattle-pound or the slaughter-house shall, if the animal is rejected by the officer-in-charge as unfit for slaugter, immediately after it is so rejected, remove such animal or cause it to be removed from those premises.
- 6. The Medical Officer of Health or the officer authorised in regulation 2 (a), may prohibit the slaughter of any animal if, after it has been approved under regulation 2 (a), if it is found to be diseased or unfit to be slaughtered for human consumption.
- 7. If the meat or offal of any animal slaughtered in the slaughter-house is, in the opinion of any officer referred to in regulation 2 (a), diseased or unfit for human consumption he shall cause the meat or offal to be immediately destroyed or so disposed of as to prevent such meat or offal being exposed for sale or used for consumption.
- 8. The Officer-in-charge of the slaughter-house shall not permit the slaughter of any animal which has not been approved as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption, or the slaughter of which has been prohibited as provided in regulation 6.
  - 9. No person shall remove from the slaughter-house-
  - (a) any meat or offal which has been declared under regulation 6 to be unfit for human consumption, except under the direction of any officer referred to in regulation 1;

- (b) the carcase of any animal intended for human consumption unless such carcase has been stamped in its fore-quarters and hind-quarters with the mark "Kachchai V. C." by the officer-in-charge of the slaughter-house.
- 10. No animal shall be slaughtered in the presence of any other animal or until the carcase of every animal previously slaughtered in the premises has been removed or screened off and the premises cleaned.
- 11. No person who suffering or who has recently suffered from any infectious, contagious or cutaneous disease shall be permitted by the person in charge of the slaughter-house to enter the same or take part in the slaughtering of any animal until the period of infection and incubation have elapsed.
- 12. It shall be lawful for the Medical Officer of Health, the Chairman or any officer duly authorised by the Chairman to enter and inspect the slaughter-house at all reasonable times and the person in charge thereof shall render him all such assistance as may be necessary.
- 13. A fee at the following rates shall be paid in advance to the Council for the use of the slaughter-house established by the Council, and no animal shall be slaughtered without an official receipt in proof of payment of the fee due:—
  - (a) Slaughtering fees:—
    For cattle Rupee One and Cents fifty (Rs. 1.50) per head.
    For goats Rupee One (Rs. 1) per head.
  - (b) Pounding fees:— For cattle Rupee One (Rs. 1) per head. For goat Fifty Cents (50 cts.) per head.
- 14. The Officer-in-charge of the slaughter-house or the Public Health Inspector authorised by him shall maintain or cause to be maintained a register in the following form of all cattle removed to the slaughter house:—

- (b) in a conspicuous place in the foyer, a notice containing the words "Smoking Prohibited inside the Auditorium" and
- 5. It shall be a condition of the licence issued to a licensee of every cinema that he shall not sell or permit the sale of tobacco in any form whatsoever within the auditorium during the specified period.
  - 6. In these by-laws-
  - Cinema" means a building which has been licensed under the Public Performances By-laws for the public exhibi-tion of pictures or optical effects by means of cinema-tograph, magic lantern, or other similar apparatus;
  - specified period "means a period beginning 30 minutes before the commencement of any public performance and ending with the conclusion of such public performance and in-cludes all times during which such public performance takes place;
  - "smoking" means the smoking of tobacco as cigars, cigar-ettes, beedi or in any other form either with the aid of a pipe or hookah or otherwise; and
  - public performance!' has the same meaning as in the Public Performances Ordinance (Chapter 176).
