Regulations

CHAPTER I: SHORT TITLE

1. These regulations may be cited as the "Sri Lanka Aerodromes" (Zoning) Regulations, 1975.

CHAPTER II: DEFINITIONS

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

(A) General terms.

- (1) "Act" means the Air Navigations Act;
- (2) "aerodrome" has the same meaning as in the Act;
- (3) "aerodrome elevation" means the height above mean sea level of the highest point on the usable landing area;
- (4) "aerodrome hazard" means any building structure, tree or other object obstructing or interfering with, in any manner whatsoever the air space required for the flight of aircraft in landing or taking off at an aerodrome;
- (5) "Aerodrome reference point" means the point designated by geographical location of an aerodrome;

- (6) "Director" means the Director of Civil Aviation;
- (7) "instrument runway" means a runway specified for the purposes of these regulations as an instrument runway by the Director by notification published in the *Gazette*;
- (8) "landing area" means the area of the aerodrome used for the landing, take off or movement of aircraft;
- (9) "non-instrument runway" means a runway other than an instrument runway;
- (10) "runway" means a defined rectangular area on a land aerodrome prepared for the landing and take-off run of aircraft along its length.

(B) Area/Surface/Zone.

- (1) "zone" means the air space contained between the areas and their corresponding surfaces.
- (2) (a) "instrument approach area" means an area serving an instrument runway in the landing direction for which a non-visual aid has been provided and whose lateral limits shall comprise—
 - (i) an inner edge 305 metres (1000 feet) wide and perpendicular to and symmetrically placed about the centre line of the runway at a distance of 61 metres (200 feet) measured horizontally from each end of the runway from the direction of landing;
 - (ii) two sides originating at the ends of the inner edge diverging uniformly about the extended centre line of the runway to a width of 4,877 metres (16,000 feet) at a horizontal distance of 15,244 metres (50,000 feet) from the inner edge; and
 - (iii) an outer edge of 4,877 metres (16,000 feet) wide and parallel to the inner edge at a distance of 15,244 metres (50,000 feet) therefrom.

- (b) "instrument approach surface" means a plane laterally limited by the limits of the instrument approach area, commencing at the latter's inner edge level with the elevation of the mid point of the threshold and sloping upwards and away from the direction of landing at a slope of 1 foot in 15 metres (50 feet) of horizontal distance and terminated by a vertical plane containing the outer edge of the approach area.
- (3) (a) "conical area" means an area commencing at the outer periphery of the inner horizontal area and extending horizontally to a distance of 2,134 metres (7,000 feet);
- (b) "conical surface" means a surface commencing at the outer periphery of the inner horizontal surface at a height of 46 metres (150 feet) from the aerodrome elevation, and extending outwards and upwards at a slope of five per centum measured above the horizontal, up to a height of 152 metres (500 feet); above aerodrome elevation;
- (4) (a) "inner horizontal area" means—
- (i) in the case of Bandaranaike International Airport the area within two circles each having a radius of 3,962 metres (13,000 feet) with their centres at the point of intersection of the runway centreline with each end of the instrument runway, and the area within their common tangents.
- (ii) in the case of the airports at Ratmalana and Kankasanturai the area within a circle with its centre at the reference point of each aerodrome and having a radius of 3,962 metres (13,000 feet).
- (b) "inner horizontal surface" means a surface commencing at the outer periphery of the transitional surface and the lateral edges of the approach surface at a height of 46 metres (150 feet) from the official aerodrome elevation, and terminated by the vertical plane containing the outer periphery of the inner horizontal area.
- (5) (a) "outer horizontal area" means an area commencing from the outer periphery of the conical area and extending radially away from the conical area;
- (b) "outer horizontal surface" means a horizontal plane located at a vertical height of 46 metres (500 feet) from the official aerodrome elevation extending outwards from the outer periphery of the conical surface.
- (6) (a) "transitional area" means an area commencing from the line originating at the end of the inner edge of each approach area, drawn parallel to the centre line of the runway in the direction of landing and terminated by a line at a horizontal distance of 473 metres (1,550 feet) away from and parallel to the centre line of the runway, and laterally meeting the approach area;
- (b) "transitional surface" means a surface commencing from a line originating at the end of the inner edge of each approach area, drawn parallel to the centre line of the runway in the direction of landing; and sloping upwards and outwards at .30 metre (one foot) in height measured in a vertical plane for 2.1 metres (seven feet) of horizontal distance and terminating at a height of 46 metres (one hundred and fifty feet) above aerodrome elevation and laterally on meeting the approach surface.

CHAPTER III: HEIGHT LIMITATIONS

3. Except as provided in regulation 7 no building or structure shall be erected or altered and no tree shall be allowed to grow above the surfaces corresponding to the following areas:—

- (a) Instrument approach area;
- (b) Transitional area;
- (c) Inner Horizontal area;
- (d) Conical area; and
- (e) Outer horizontal area.

4. *Air Strip*: No building or structure of any description shall be erected, nor shall any tree be allowed to grow within 305 metres (1000 feet) on either side of the runway centerline or within 305 metres (1000 feet) on either side of the extended centerline to a distance of 1,829 metres (6,000 feet) from each end of the instrument runway, without the approval of the Director.

5. Where the areas defined under item "B" of Chapter II have more than one height limitation, the more restrictive limitations shall prevail.

CHAPTER IV: USE RESTRICTIONS

6. No use shall be made of land within any area defined in Chapter II in such manner as to create electrical interference with radio communication between the aerodrome and aircraft, or in any manner which might make it difficult for flyers to distinguish between aerodrome lights and other lights or in any manner which might cause glare in the eyes of flyers using the aerodrome, impair visibility in the vicinity of the aerodrome or otherwise endanger the landing, taking-off, or manoeuvring of aircraft.

CHAPTER V: PERMITS

7. (1) No use shall be made of the land, and no building or structure shall be erected or altered, and no tree shall be planted in any of the areas specified in Chapter III, except on the authority of a permit issued by the Director:

Provided, however, that no permit shall be required for the use of the land or for the erection or alteration of a building or for the planting of a tree—

- (a) in the area lying outside the transitional area where the height of the building, structure or tree is not more than 23 metres (75 feet) in height above aerodrome elevation,
- (b) in the area lying within the limits of an approach area whether instrument or otherwise but at a horizontal distance of not less than 1,829 metres (6,000 feet) from each end of the runway, where the height of the building, structure or tree is not more than 23 metres (75 feet) above the aerodrome elevation.

An application for a permit shall state the purpose for which it is required and shall be addressed to the Director. The issue of a permit and the conditions subject to which it is issued shall be at the discretion of the Director. In the case of a building, the appropriate application to the local authority under the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance shall be made in addition to the Director's permit, in any area to which such Ordinance applies.

CHAPTER VI: APPEALS

8. (a) Any person aggrieved by any decision of the Director under these regulations, may appeal to the Minister.

(b) An appeal shall be made in writing and shall set forth the grounds upon which it is made and shall reach the Director within 90 days of the date of receipt of the decision of the Director. The Director shall forthwith transmit to the Minister all the documents and other records relevant to the appeal.

(c) An appeal shall stay all proceedings in furtherance of the decision appealed against, unless the Director certifies to the Minister after the notice of appeal has been filed, that by reason of the facts stated in the certificate a stay would, in his opinion, cause imminent peril to life or property, where the Director so certifies, proceedings shall not be stayed except by order of the Minister.

(d) The Minister may reverse or affirm, in whole or in part, or modify the decision appealed from and may make such order, as may be appropriate.

(e) The decision of the Minister on appeal under these regulations shall be final.

Award

The Commissioner of Labour, by virtue of the powers vested in him under section 8 (1) (d) of the Industrial Disputes Act with the amendments thereto has referred the following dispute to me for settlement by arbitration.

The matter in dispute is "Whether the termination of the services of Mr. W. S. C. Fernando by Messrs. Shaw Wallace & Hedges Ltd., is justified and to what relief, if any, is Mr. Fernando entitled."

Mr. S. M. Fernando, Assistant Secretary, Employers' Federation of Ceylon represented the Respondent Company; the interests of the Applicant were looked after by Mr. C. Motilal Nehru, Attorney-at-Law, for the Ceylon Mercantile Union.

The letter dated 28.5.1968, R1 requesting Mr. Fernando (who will be known as the applicant henceforth) to show cause against the termination of his services, indicates the nature of the charges:—

- (a) Failure to supervise properly the effectively the overhauling of the pipe extruder in March, 1968;
- (b) Supplying incorrect information to Mr. Pieris as regards the hole in the vacuum pump.

The facts relevant to this dispute are, shortly, as follows:—

A Mechanic was the first informant who had made the complaint about these mechanical defects to Mr. Pieris, one of the Directors of the said Company, but not to Mr. Mananwatte, the Assistant Factory Manager. It is regrettable that Patrick has not been called to give evidence, but Mr. Mananwatte substitutes Patrick. Mr. Mananwatte says that the applicant as a Mechanical Foreman is expected to supervise the mechanism of the overhauling of the machines. One fine day Patrick has found that the Applicant had fitted new bushes, screws and blades to the shaft of the pipe extruder which had a slight waste at the end. According to Mr. Mananwatte, the machinery had to be dismantled again and the shaft had to be sent to Messrs. Samuel Sons Limited, a firm of Engineers, to fill the wasted end of the shaft.

As regards the second charge, Patrick had brought it to the notice of Mr. Pieris that there was an unusual noise in the vacuum pump. Mr. Pieris had questioned the applicant about the necessity of having certain openings for the lubricating oil to pass through. As the explanation given by the applicant was unsatisfactory, Mr. Pieris had the pump opened and found no hole in the particular pump. As a testing measure a similar pump was opened and it had the necessary holes in the pump unit.

The applicant has defended bravely and candidly the charges levelled against him. According to him, some time prior to 1968, the vacuum pump of the extruder was overhauled by Messrs. Brown & Company, a reputed and well known professional Engineering firm. Therefore, he had thought that everything was in order. He explained in great detail the working of the shaft and the accompanying bushes, with the sample shaft made of wood by himself accompanied by the sketches, A1 and A2. He is of opinion that a slight waste at the tip would not matter very much and is not likely to cause a colossal break down or, as a matter of fact, even a slight one. One has to remember that there could be hardly any wear or tear at the end even of a shaft for which a workman cannot be charged, but the question is whether he should be penalised with dismissal for such short-comings.

If Messrs. Brown & Company had overhauled the pump they would have been the best qualified to speak about the holes and the oil leakage. If they had overhauled it, they could have seen whether there were holes in it or not. The machine had worked for over one year without any trouble or break down. The Applicant had not opened it; very likely he thought it was unnecessary. It was the incumbent duty of the company to consult the Engineers concerned before any charges could have been framed against the workman. It appears that Mr. Pieris, after he became a director of the company was in overall charge of the factory. Mr. Pieris had put his finger into every pie, but should not put it into every paste where he had no taste or experience.

Mr. Mananwatte is not an expert in giving evidence on machine-minding and its intricacies, but he undertakes to do so with the air of an expert. I could hardly accept it.

The failure to call the direct witnesses, Patrick and Mr. Pieris, militates against the management. The court is deprived of the best evidence, and secondary evidence has been given in its place.

The applicant has had 25 years practical experience in the handling and maintenance of machinery. It is hardly necessary for me here to recapitulate his past services in various engineering establishments. Suffice it to say, he knows his job. If the Management was so minded, to contradict his evidence, they should have done so with the superior knowledge and experience. I have had the benefit of his experience in his explanation given to these charges, and he has considerably impressed me. It has to be borne in mind that the charges framed are not for acts of misconduct but for negligence and unpreparedness in the mechanical operation of machinery. If one examines the charges disclosed in the evidence, it appears to be more or less sins of omission. It is cruel to think that a workman of the applicant's standing has been dismissed on flimsy grounds on the basis of a screw loose from the wasted end of a shaft or the absence of a hole in the extruder pipe. The Management has failed to establish the charge of negligence against the applicant. The applicant has done the best he could do in the circumstances, as a reasonable man of prudence. Neither law nor commonsense recognises a duty in the air. So then the charge of negligence must end in 'fumus and umbra'.

Finally, I hold that the termination of the services of Mr. W. S. C. Fernando is unjust and unjustified.

Therefore, I make award—

1. That Mr. W. S. C. Fernando be reinstated from the date of termination of his services (10.10.1968);
2. That Mr. W. S. C. Fernando be paid all his back wages up to the date of this award.

The applicant, Mr. W. S. C. Fernando was drawing a salary of Rs. 585 per month at the time of termination of his services. Therefore, his back wages up to date, 10.3.1975, aggregate to Rs. 45,045.

This was a protracted inquiry and therefore the applicant will be entitled to Rs. 1,000 as costs.

The aforementioned amounts, totalling Rs. 46,045 (Rupees Forty Six Thousand and Forty Five), shall be deposited by the Respondent Company with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo South, within one month of the date of publication of this award in the *Gazette of the Republic of Sri Lanka*.
