Bay of Bengal-Burma Coast-China Buckeer Light.

In continuation of Notice to Mariners No. 123, dated May 12, 1900, issued by this office, the Port 193-

Officer, Rangoon, has given further information, dated August 31, 1900, that the light on China Buckeer will be discontinued on November 15, 1900, and a light will be exhibited from a lightvessel anchored 2 miles to the south-east (true) of the present China Buckeer lighthouse.

The light will be group flashing alternate red and white flashes every 45 seconds, each flash being of 5 seconds' duration and visible 12 miles.

The lightvessel will be painted red with one mast, at which is hoisted a black cone and the words "China

Buckeer" painted on each side.




