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BOARD OF TRADE NOTICES.

THE following notices of the Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department) are published for general information:—

(F. & H. 12,966.) London, September 20, 1900.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Representative at Berlin, intimating that the entry into Germany of body linen, old clothes, &c., from Glasgow is prohibited.

(F. & H. 12,998.) London, September 20, 1900.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Representative at The Hague, intimating that Aden has been officially declared free of plague and sanitary measures in regard to arrivals thence repealed.

(F. & H. 13,016.) London, September 20, 1900.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Representative at Madrid, intimating that Glasgow has been declared foul on account of plague.

(F. & H. 13,017.) London, September 20, 1900.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of certain Sanitary Regulations issued by the Spanish Government. These Regulations can be inspected at the Fisheries and Harbour Department of the Board of Trade any week day between 11 and 5.

(F. & H. 13,018.) London, September 20, 1900.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Representative at Madrid, intimating that Alexandria has been declared foul.

(F. & H. 13,067.) London, September 20, 1900.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Telegram from the Governor of Malta, intimating that passengers from Alexandria or Glasgow are subjected to fourteen days' quarantine, unless they declare on oath that they have not been in either place within fourteen days from the date of arrival at Malta.

(F. & H. 13,097.) London, September 20, 1900.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Representative at The Hague, intimating that the ports of Colony of Senegal officially infected with yellow fever, and that sanitary regulations for yellow fever will be applied to any vessel having left the ports of Senegal ten days or less before September 18.

(F. & H. 13,098.) London, September 20, 1900.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram, dated 19th instant, from Her Majesty's Representative at Therapia, intimating that 48 hours' quarantine is imposed on arrivals direct from Glasgow which have not undergone quarantine during voyage. Only medical visit if quarantine has been undergone during voyage.

(F. & H. 13,099.) London, September 20, 1900.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Representative at St. Petersburg, intimating that the Vice-Consul at Archangel reports imposition of quarantine against arrivals from Glasgow.

(F. & H. 13,104.) London, September 21, 1900.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Representative at Therapia, intimating that medical inspection against Syrian and Anatolian ports is abolished.

(F. & H. 13,105.) London, September 21, 1900.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Representative at St. Petersburg, intimating that the Vice-Consul at Archangel reports that vessels from Glasgow are only admitted with quarantine certificates from Christiansund. Vessels from other United Kingdom ports admitted immediately after medical inspection.

(F. & H. 13,109.) London, September 21, 1900.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Representative at Madrid, intimating that healthy ships bound from Glasgow for northern ports of Spain are sent for disinfection to lazaretto of Santandar, Corunna, or Vigo, whichever nearest to port of arrival.

Australia—Torres Strait—Inner Route—Discoloured Water between Percy and High Peak Islands.

The Port Master, Brisbane, has given notice (No. 14 of 1900) that on August 11 discoloured water was observed between the south-east islet, Percy Group, and High Peak Island, extending in a west north-west and east south-east direction for about a mile and in a north north-east and south south-west direction for about half-a-mile.

A line drawn from the north-east extreme of the south-east islet to High Peak Island passes over the discoloured water, from which High Peak bears south 60° east; South-east islet, northern extremity, bears north 60° west; Steep island bears south 4° west. The locality will be examined at an early date.
