MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on August 25, 1900, at 1.45 p.m.

Present :- The Chairman; Dr. W. G. Keith; E. Venning, Esq.; C. L. M. Abdul Carim, Esq.; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G.; N. Dias Abeyasinha, Esq.; D. G. Goonewardene, Esq.; Dr. E. Ludovici; and F. Abeyesundere, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of Meeting held on July 28, 1900.

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2. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved-That as it would be a great convenience to the general public to have funerals taken to the General Cemetery at Dadalla by rail, the Council apply to His Excellency the Governor for a railway station or siding at Bope on the Sea Coast line from Galle to Gintota, near the road leading to the cemetery.

Seconded by N. Dias Abeyasinha, Esq. The Council divided on the motion, when three Members voted for the motion and six against it.

The Chairman declared the motion lost.

3. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved—That scavenging be better done in the Fort, and that the following measures be adopted :-

(a) That the scavenging cart which takes up the refuse of houses from the streets receive the house refuse from the house itself direct into the cart, and that no house refuse be left by the side of the street, drain, or verandah of house.

(b) Householders or inmates of houses to hang a card or board with the letters M.C. in a conspicuous place in the verandah, and the scavenging cart on passing the street to halt at the door of the house and to receive the house refuse into the cart.

(c) That notice be issued to householders and inmates of houses daily to flush and clear the house drains between 6 o'clock A.M. and 12 o'clock noon, and the Municipal water carts to flush the street drains between 12 o'clock noon, and 3 o'clock P.M., and that the number of water carts necessary for the work be obtained. (d) The streets to be kept cleaner than at present. The dung of cattle and any refuse should be collected at

once in a wheelbarrow and carted away in the evening.

(e) The removal of night soil is not properly done, and the present system of removal is a public nuisance, and has been often complained by inmates of houses when the night soil cart passes the street. In continental countries when the night soil is removed the buckets are well closed so as to prevent the escape of air or water. This practice should be adopted, for to work the dry-earth system badly is worse than having cesspits.

Seconded by Dr. E. Ludovici.

The suggestions above made were discussed in detail, with the following result :---

- (a) and (b) Rejected by seven against two.
 (c) and (d) Decided that the existing regulations be enforced.
 (e) Decided that the Superintendent of Works be desired to suggest a method of making the latrine buckets air-tight.

Pursuant to notice the Chairman moved-That resolution 1 carried at Meeting held on July 28 last be 4. re-considered in view of the regulations since published in Gazette No. 5,709 of August 11 by section 26, of which the occupier of any building may be ordered summarily to carry out the work of cleansing and disinfecting drains, sewers, and cesspits, and that the expenditure of Municipal funds on such work in private premises is therefore unjustifiable." Seconded by D. G. Goonewardene, Esq .- Carried by eight against one.

5. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved-That for the convenience of persons following a funeral a shelter be built within the General Cemetery at Dadalla, which at present is very much exposed during the monsoon rains."

Seconded by F. Abeyesundere, Esq. The motion was lost, three voting for it and six against it.

(At this stage of the Meeting Messrs. N. Dias Abeyasinha and D. G. Goonewardene retired.)

6. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved-That the hollows in the cemetery where water lodges after and during heavy rains be filled in to afford better drainage, and that a pit on the left-hand side of the road from Bope to Dadalla and facing the cometery be filled in to some extent to admit of better drainage, and a drain constructed by the side of the road emptying into the sea. Seconded by E. Venning, Esq.

Resolved,-That the attention of the Sanitary Officer be called to this, and that he be required to report on he drainage of the cemetery and the condition of the pit referred to in the motion.

7. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved-That Rs. 100 be voted for the purpose of planting shade trees in the Fort and securing the plants with a suitable fence to prevent the destruction of plants by cattle or other means, and that no tree be cut down in future without the sanction of the Municipal Council."

Seconded by Dr. E. Ludovici,-Carried.

8. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved-That a Head Inspector at a salary of Rs. 100 per mensem be appointed to supervise the work of Inspectors, which at present is done in a most unsatisfactory manner.

Seconded by Dr. E. Ludevici.

The motion was lost, two voting for and four against it.

9. On behalf of Mr. C. P. Hayley, who was unavoidably absent, Dr. Anthonisz put the following question, notice of which had been given :-- To ask whether Ward Inspector Geo. Zilva, who has been dangerously ill with typhoid fever, contracted the disease in the discharge of his duties, and whether he has received full pay during his

illness; if not, what sum has been deducted from his pay. The Chairman replied he was unable to say whether the Inspector contracted the disease in the discharge of his duties; that he received full pay from June 23, when he fell ill, to July 18; that at the latter date a substitute was appointed, who was paid Rs. 7 for his services up to July 31 out of the Inspector's pay.

10. On behalf of Mr. C. P. Hayley Dr. Anthonisz moved—That when Ward Inspector or other servants of the Municipality contract disease in the discharge of their duties, they shall receive full pay until capable of resuming work.

Seconded by F. Abeyesundere, Esq.

Resolved,-That the motion is unnecessary, as section 61 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance lays down the course to be adopted when leave of absence is granted to a subordinate officer of the Municipality.

11. Submitted correspondence with the Honorary Secretary of the Board of Trustees of All Saints' Church with reference to the Draft Ordinance published in the Government Gazette of May 11 for legalizing the by-laws of the Galle Municipality.

Resolved,—That the words "or approved" be introduced after the word "prescribed" in revised by-law, chapter XIX., 6, and that this alteration be submitted for the approval of Government.

12. Submitted the following recommendation from the Standing Committee :-

-That a recommendation be made to the Municipal Council to make a transfer of Rs. 1,849.85 from Resolved. vote for "Acquisition of Black Town" to meet the following excess in expenditure :-
