PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR

Notification establishing New Toll.

WHEREAS by section 9 of "The Toll Ordinance, 1896," it is enacted that the Governor may by means of any resolution duly passed at any public meeting establish tolls in respect of any public road, bridge, ferry, or canal, and that the tolls set out in the several schedules to the said Ordinance annexed to the said Ordinance shall apply to the tolls so established as fully and as effectually as if they had been enumerated in the said schedules or in some or one of them:

It is hereby notified that in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the said Ordinance conferred, the Legislative Council, at a public meeting on the 8th day of December, 1897, did by resolution establish a toll in respect of the road to Karawanella, in the District of Kegalla, Province of Sabaragamuwa, from the milestone on the said road.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the "The Toll Ordinance, 1896," it is enacted that the provisions and limitations in the said Ordinance contained in the several schedules to the said Ordinance annexed, at such times as may be from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* shall be pleased to make, shall in no case exceed the rates hereinafter specified:

As by section 9 of the said Ordinance it is enacted that the Legislative Council may by resolution duly passed at any public session of the said Council establish tolls in respect of any public road, bridge, ferry, or canal in this Island, in addition to the tolls set out in the schedule to the said Ordinance annexed, and the provisions of the said Ordinance shall apply to any tolls so established as fully and effectually as if such tolls had been enumerated in the said schedule in some or one of them :

And whereas the Legislative Council, at a public session thereof held on the 8th day of December, 1897, by a resolution established a toll in respect of the principal road from Dehiowita to Karawanella, in the District of Kegalla, Province of Sabaragamuwa, viz., at or near the 37½ mile-stone on the said road, as from and after the First day of January, 1898 :

And whereas it is expedient to appoint the rates at which the said toll so established in respect of the said road shall be levied :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf in Us conferred as aforesaid, do hereby appoint that the rates at which the toll so established in respect of the principal road from Dehiowita to Karawanella, in the District of Kegalla, Province of Sabaragamuwa aforesaid, shall be in accordance with those set out in the schedule hereto.

Resolution as to Place of Collection of New Toll.

As by section 10 of "The Toll Ordinance, 1896," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, to determine at what places tolls shall be collected, and to appoint for the collection thereof :

As by a resolution of the 8th day of December, 1897, the Legislative Council in respect of the principal road from Dehiowita to Karawanella, in the District of Kegalla, Province of Sabaragamuwa, viz., at or near the 37½ mile-stone on the said road as from and after the 1st day of January, 1898 :

As it is expedient to determine at what place the toll in respect of the said road shall be collected :

Notified that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has by a notification of the 17th day of December, 1897, determined that such toll shall be collected at the place specified in the schedule hereto as from and after the 1st day of January, 1898.

At or near the 37½ mile-stone on the principal road from Dehiowita to Karawanella.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 15 of "The Toll Ordinance, 1896," it is enacted that every person having once paid toll in respect of himself or of any vehicle, animal, or boat at any place, payment at which shall have been declared by the Governor, by a Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to clear any other place, shall, on the production at such other place of a ticket denoting such payment to have been made, pass the same without any further payment of toll, except where such person, vehicle, animal, or boat shall at such latter place have become liable to a different rate of toll :

And whereas tolls have been established, viz., one in respect of Karawanella bridge and the other at or near the 37½ milestone on the principal road from Dehiowita to Karawanella, in the District of Kegalla, Province of Sabaragamuwa, under the provisions of section 9 of "The Toll Ordinance, 1896" :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim and declare that a payment of toll in respect of Karawanella bridge shall clear the toll at or near the 37½ milestone on the principal road from Dehiowita to Karawanella, and payment of toll at or near the 37½ milestone on the principal road from Dehiowita to Karawanella, shall clear the toll in respect of Karawanella bridge.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 14 (1) of Ordinance No. 15 of 1896 it is enacted that when it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time, that the existence or apprehension of crime and outrage in any district it is desirable to increase the police force in such district, or, should a police force have been already established there, to increase the same, he may by Proclamation, which shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that aforesaid such district requires police or additional police, and may order police or additional police to be employed there :

And whereas it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage in the district defined in the schedule to the said Ordinance it is desirable to quarter police in the said district :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that, by reason of the existence of crime and outrage therein, the North-Western Province requires police, and do hereby order that a police sergeant and five constables be quartered in the said district in the said North-Western Province from and after the Fifteenth day of January, 1898, for a period of six months.

And We do further hereby define the limits of the said district to be those set out in the schedule hereunto annexed.

SCHEDULE.

Limits of the Town of Chilaw.

On the West.—Sea.

On the South.—A line 10 ft. to the south of the new road to the Protestant Church running parallel thereto and continued due west to the sea; the southern boundary of Avaramputtitottam belonging to Varuse Neina Mohamadu

On the East.—The eastern boundary of Avaramputtitottam belonging to Varuse Neina Mohamadu and a line thence to the south-east corner of Anthony Fernando's garden and along the eastern boundary thereof, the southern ditch of the Munnessaram road, the bund of Kunjadappanarkulam, the eastern boundaries marked by a ditch of Palayaditottam belonging to Juan Appu and of Nedunkotuwa belonging to Avu Lebbe Marikar, a straight line from the north-east corner of Nedunkotuwa to the south-east corner of Puliymarattaditottam belonging to the heirs of the late Mr. William Sansoni, and a line along the eastern boundary of the said garden joining the stream running into Uppuatuodai.

On the North.—The Wattakalioidai as far as the Chilaw river and including all the land to the west of the river as far as the mouth.
