MESSAGE TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

THE Governor has directed the Estimates of Revenue and Expenditure to be laid before the Legislative Council.

The Estimates have been prepared in the form directed by the Secretary of State and after the

manner adopted for several years past.

The Revenue of the year 1900 is estimated to yield Rs. 26,320,000, an increase of Rs. 1,200,000 as compared with the estimate of the current year, and of Rs. 246,000 as compared with the revised estimate of the current year. It exceeds the actual nett revenue of 1899 by Rs. 406,859.

The Customs Revenue is estimated to produce Rs. 6,980,000 as against Rs. 6,752,367 in 1899. Increases are looked for under all principal heads except Grain, in respect of the imports of which there has been some check, and it is not safe to put the revenue at a higher figure than has been estimated for the current year.

The receipts from Port, Harbour, Wharf, and Lighthouse Dues are estimated at Rs. 1,240,000, as compared with Rs. 1,135,101 encashed in 1899; the anticipated increase is due in part to the revised tariff of pilotage dues introduced in the Port of Colombo and in part to the expectation of increased

The receipts from Licenses, Excise, and Internal Revenue are estimated to produce Rs. 5,860,000, an increase of Rs. 228,700 as compared with the estimate of the current year and of Rs. 229,228 as compared with the revenue of 1899. Increased revenue under this head is anticipated from Salt, Arrack Rents, Tolls, and Stamps.

Under the head of Fees of Court, Payments for Specific Services and Reimbursements-in-aid the estimated receipts are put at Rs. 1,664,000, as compared with Rs. 1,642,617 realized in 1899 and Rs. 1,542,800 estimated for 1900; increased receipts are looked for from Medical Aid Dues (Export duties) and Warehouse Rent.

Posts and Telegraphs are expected to yield Rs. 970,000, against Rs. 932,000 estimated as the

revenue of the current year.

The gross receipts from Government Railways are expected to reach Rs. 8,100,000, an increase of

Rs. 500,000 on the estimate of 1900.

The receipts from Rent of Government Property show a decrease—a decrease that is apparent only-and is due to the transfer to other heads of revenue of certain items hitherto accounted for under this head.

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Interest is estimated to realize only Rs. 260,000, the decrease as compared with estimates and encashments of recent years being due to the fact that the cash balances invested in Government securities are being realized to cover the expenditure on Railways and Irrigation now proceeding.

A small increased revenue is hoped for from Miscellaneous receipts as compared with the

estimate of 1900.

The yield from the Sale of Government Property is put at Rs. 364,400, or but Rs. 700 in excess of the estimate of the current year. This somewhat low estimate is due to the alteration introduced last year into the working of the Forest Department, the reduced revenue being accompanied by reduced expenditure.

From Land Sales and Premia on Leases an estimated revenue of Rs. 650,000 is looked for as

compared with Rs. 631,700, the estimate of the current year.

The total of the Estimates of Expenditure in respect of the ordinary Services of Government is Rs. 26,226,814. To this has to be added a sum of Rs. 3,000,000 in respect of works of Railway construction and Irrigation, the grand total to be met from ordinary revenue and surplus balances aggregating Rs. 29,226,814.

The provision to meet charges on account of the Public Debt is the same as for the current year, viz., Rs. 2,813,577. This may have to be supplemented in the event of the contemplated loan being raised early next year for works of Irrigation and Railway construction.

The provision for Pensions is Rs. 1,152,242, being less by Rs. 7,407 than this year's vote.

The provision for His Excellency the Governor is increased by Rs. 500 for labourers, the present provision for labour for the Queen's House, Pavilion, and Queen's Cottage Gardens being insufficient, owing to the gradual extension of Queen's Cottage Gardens and the withdrawal of prison labour.

The provision of Rs. 687,932 for the Civil Service is an increase of Rs. 7,104, required to meet

ordinary increments of salary.

The provision for the Secretariat is Rs. 230,737, the increase of Rs. 12,529 including Rs. 7,200 for the salary of the Inspector of Mines and Rs. 1,920 for four additional Stock Inspectors. Provision

is included also for the travelling allowances and incidental expenses of these officers.

In the provision for the Audit there appears a very small decrease, and in that of the Treasury a small increase, as compared with the provision of 1900. The alteration is due in both cases to ordinary

changes of establishment and increments of salary earned.

The provision for the Provincial Administration shows an increase compared with the votes of 1900 of Rs. 5,322. The provision for 1901 includes a sum of nearly Rs. 20,000, Remuneration to Headmen, transferred from the Police votes; Rs. 1,080 for three probationers who will be posted to the Colombo, Galle, and Kandy Kachcheries for training to fit them for positions as superior Headmen, Presidents of Gansabhawa Courts, and such like; Rs. 5,000 for notice boards for Headmen of the Western Province; Rs. 2,000 additional subsidy to the funds of the Colombo Friend-in-Need Society; Rs. 1,000 allowance to Appraisers of Lands to be acquired in the Colombo District; Rs. 120 for a Peon for the Negombo Treasury; an increase of Rs. 500 for registration of carts and boats, Western Province; Rs. 650 for additional expenditure at Tataparai; Rs. 500 for a new boat for the Superintendent of Immigration, Paumben; and Rs. 1,050 for typewriters for the Hambantota, Matara, and Chilaw Kachcheries. On the other hand, the Provincial votes are reduced by Rs. 1,650, cost of three Medical Officers of the Immigration Department; Rs. 31,500 subsidy to Immigrant vessels; and Rs. 660 for a Superintendent of Cooly Bungalows.

In connection with the Survey Department increased provision is made under the head of Establishments of Rs. 9,730 and under Special Expenditure Rs. 8,000. The increase under Establishments is to meet increments of salary that fall due during the year to certain officers of the Department, and to cover the additional cost of the new classification proposed for the Clerical Branch of the Department; the additional sum provided under Special Expenditure is for tents for the Topographical Surveyors

and three large Triangulation stages on the west coast.

In the provision made for the services of the Customs there is no material change, the small

increase under Establishments being for periodical increments of salary.

The provision for Port and Marine Department (Master Attendant) Colombo, is Rs. 152,482, as compared with Rs. 123,826 for 1900. Most of the increase is under Personal Emoluments, Rs. 14,400 being provided for increased pay to the Pilots and Rs. 6,516 for increased pay to Boatmen under the new scheme by which no allowances or payments for overtime are to be made in future. Provision for an additional clerk at Rs. 300 and a lightkeeper at Rs. 240 is also included. Under Other Charges increased provision has to be made for Lighthouse and Harbour Services, and an addition of Rs. 2,500 for fuel, stores, &c., of second steam launch. A reduction in special expenditure to the extent of Rs. 32,150 is effected.

Under the sub-head of Government Agent provision is included for the employment as Superintendent at Ragama of an officer of higher class at a salary of Rs. 3,000 a year, a charge found to be necessary when quarantine came to be enforced at the camp in consequence of the occurrence of cholera on the coast. The large increase in the number of coolies passing through the camp has necessitated the employment also of an Assistant Superintendent at Rs. 300, and other increased

expenditure in connection with the general services.

Some reduction of expenditure has been found possible in Other Charges under the sub-head of Engineer, Harbour Works; while under the sub-head of Inspector-General of Police increased provision is made for five constables to maintain order and keep off the general public when immigrant coolies are being landed at the root of the Breakwater; increased expenditure has also to be met under Other Charges of this sub-head, more especially in connection with the upkeep of the Police steam launch.

In connection with the votes for Port and Marine other than Colombo some saving has been effected at Galle by the transfer to Lloyds of the Signal Station at that port and the removal from the

Estimates of the amount of a personal allowance to a Pilot. At Trincomalee the cost of the establishment is increased, slightly improved salaries having been granted to the Lightkeepers engaged at that

port in view of the trying and isolated character of their duties.

In connection with the vote for the Botanic Gardens provision is made under Personal Emoluments for increments of salary to the Director and the Curator, for the salary of the Mycologist appointed this year, and for an incremental scale, involving a slightly increased expenditure, for the subordinate staff. Under Other Charges provision is made for a retaining fee of Rs. 3,000 to the Agricultural Chemist, Rs. 1,200 for a house allowance to the Mycologist, the terms of whose appointment include an official residence, Rs. 750 for expenses connected with the publication of a scientific journal to be conducted by the officers of the Department and to be a record of work performed, and small increases of existing votes for travelling, stationery, &c., consequent on the increase in the number of superior officers. Under Special Expenditure a sum of Rs. 1,000 is provided for wire fencing for Hakgala.

Such increase as appears under the head of the Colombo Museum is to provide an increase of pay for the Director, whose salary has been fixed at Rs. 7,000 rising to Rs. 8,500, and has been thereby placed on a footing corresponding to the rates drawn by officers of the Government occupying kindred

positions.

In the matter of the Legal Departments the most important addition is one of Rs. 7,720 for the Additional District Judge, Colombo. Small additions are made in the case of some other of the District Courts for transport, inquests, and petty expenses, and Rs. 500 is provided for furniture for Chilaw District Court.

Under the sub-head of Courts of Requests and Police Courts the provision for the Additional Police Magistrate, Ratnapura and Kegalla, is omitted, the post in question having been abolished and it being intended to transfer the holder to Gampola in connection with the re-distribution of jurisdiction in the Central Province. The provision for the Police Court at Galagedara has also been omitted as a result of the same re-distribution of work; and a sum of Rs. 3,000 for the salary of an Additional Magistrate is added to the provision of the Gampola Court, the transport vote of which is reduced by Rs. 500 in consequence of its becoming the Magistrate's headquarters. Nett additions of Rs. 850 for transport, Rs. 230 for inquests, Rs. 305 for furniture, and Rs. 125 for petty expenses are made to the votes of the other Police Courts.

Under the sub-head of Registration of Marriages, Births, and Deaths provision is included for periodical increments of salary to the Clerical Staff, Rs. 900 for a Lady Registrar at Galle, and Rs. 900 for additional clerks at Galle, Kurunegala, and Badulla; under Other Charges increased provision to the extent of Rs. 10,400 is made for allowances to Registrars and Rs. 2,000 for stationery for these officers.

The provision for the Census is transferred to the Treasurer's vote for Miscellaneous Services.

Under the head of Police a decrease of expenditure amounting to Rs. 36,536 is contemplated, more than one-half of which is due to the transfer to Provincial Administration of the provision for remuneration to unpaid Headmen; under Personal Emoluments provision is made for periodical increases of salary to the Superintendents in accordance with the sanctioned scheme. Effect is also given to a revised incremental scheme of salaries for the Inspectors, which, while tending to improve the position of the officers in question, results in an immediate small saving.

A sum of Rs. 1,200 is inserted under Other Charges for a school for policemen, where constables may improve their education and qualify for promotion. One such school is already in existence, being kept up out of Departmental funds. Notebooks, at an estimated cost of Rs. 415, are to be provided for

the use of Police Officers next year.

The Prison vote provides for approved periodical increments to the superior officers and higher branch of the subordinate staff. It is also proposed to put on an incremental scale the post of Assistant Superintendent of the Welikada Convict Establishment, the allowance to him for uniform and medical attendance being struck out. A sum of Rs. 840 has to be added for nursing staff for the Borella Convict Hospital; and small increases have to be provided in several of the jails to meet increased cost of diets.

The provision for the Medical Department is Rs. 373,215, an increase as compared with the

current year of Rs. 4,184.

The officer who held the post of Assistant to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Registrar of the Medical College having resigned, and the arrangement by which both offices were combined in one man being regarded as unsatisfactory, it has been determined to separate the two offices and appoint to them separate officers. The post of Assistant to the Principal Civil Medical Officer will be filled by a Senior Officer of the Department on a salary of Rs. 6,500, while a salary of Rs. 6,000 will be assigned to the Registrar of the Medical College. To meet the additional expenditure thus incurred certain minor economies will be effected, the nett result being an increase of cost of Rs. 1,500.

A new Chief Medical Storekeeper is provided, with a higher salary than the late occupant but

without allowances.

The vote for Hospitals and Dispensaries aggregates Rs. 1,235,320. The provision for working Hospitals under the Medical Aid Ordinance is Rs. 361,038, an increase of Rs. 21,512 over the current year, the whole of which can be accounted for by the opening of new hospitals at Dimbula, Maturata, and Pussellawa.

The sum of Rs. 874,172 is proposed to be spent on Civil Hospitals. This is Rs. 16,417 in excess of the provision of 1900, and, with the exception of a small addition to the staff of Nursing Sisters at the Colombo General Hospital and an increase of Rs. 3,500 for transport of medicines, is due to increases, in themselves comparatively small, of the cost of diets, wages, and other service charges.

in themselves comparatively small, of the cost of diets, wages, and other service charges.

The provision for Education is Rs. 916,587, being Rs. 86,730 in excess of the provision in the Estimates of the current year. Under Personal Emoluments some alterations are introduced with a view to placing the Sub-Inspectors of the Department on an incremental scale of salaries. The

Teachers of the Royal College have also been graded and placed on an incremental scale on the basis of the classification granted to the Clerical Service, and provision is made accordingly. Two additional Instructors—one for Drawing, the other for Civil and Mechanical Engineering—have been added to the Technical College Staff, and provision for their salaries appears for the first time in the Estimates.

Increments are provided for Schoolmasters in accordance with the Code. The increased expenditure of the Department is mainly under Other Charges, due to automatic expansion of the votes for grants-in-aid. An addition of Rs. 4,000 is made to the travelling vote in view of the arrangement to have an annual Conference of Inspectors at Colombo. Under Special Expenditure provision is made of Rs. 6,000 to provide additional accommodation at Maggona Reformatory for sixty boys. When the boys were transferred to Maggona in 1896 it was considered necessary to provide accommodation for sixty only; since then the numbers have grown—they are now ninety—and further provision has become a matter of some urgency.

Under the head of Military Expenditure the provision for the Military contribution is based as usual on the estimated revenue of the year; the increased expenditure contemplated in connection with the Volunteers is due chiefly to the Rifle Corps started this year. A reduction in Special Expenditure is effected by the omission of the provision for fortifications; but new items that appear are Rs. 2,273 for passage money of Volunteer officers on the expiration of their term of service; Rs. 14,894 for arms for the new Rifle Corps; and Rs. 46,886 cost of the erection of certain buildings for the Troops in Colombo,

of which Rs. 22,762 represent the value of certain buildings to be taken over.

In the Treasurer's vote for Miscellaneous Services the vote of Rs. 200,000 for payment to the Irrigation Fund under Ordinance No. 6 of 1892 is omitted, the amount being transferred to the vote for the Irrigation Department and included in the sum of Rs. 700,000 there provided; the provision for the supply of currency notes is reduced from Rs. 18,000 to Rs. 5,000; the provision for payment of interest to the Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund is increased by Rs. 15,000 as a consequence of the growth of the Fund; and the provision for inspection of mines is transferred to the Colonial Secretary's vote. An item of Rs. 16,000 is provided to meet the expenses of the Commissioner proposed to be appointed under the provisions of the Buddhist Temporalities Ordinance. Under Special Expenditure the provision for Plague expenses is increased from Rs. 50,000 to Rs. 100,000, not by reason of increased expenditure incurred or contemplated, but as a result of the present provision having proved to be insufficient; and a sum of Rs. 110,000 appears for expenses in connection with the Census of 1901.

Such increased expenditure as is provided for in connection with the Colonial Store, apart from the increments of salaries to clerks, is to meet increased charges on account of transport and labour.

In connection with the Forest Department an incremental scale of salaries has been approved for the Executive Officers of the Department, the Forest Rangers, and suitable provision is made. Increased provision for construction of roads and buildings and for demarcation is also made.

The expenditure of the Post Office continues to increase and to be in excess of the revenue of the Department. Under Personal Emoluments provision is made for the approved periodical increments of the officers of the Department. Provision is made (Rs. 3,000) for an Assistant Accountant to strengthen the Accounting Branch of the Department, hitherto admittedly weak, and for additional clerks, sorters, and postmen to cope with the increased business of the Colombo Office. An addition is also made to the number of probationers in view of the opening of certain new Post Offices determined on

In the Telegraph Branch provision is made for approved annual increments to the Staff, and for payment of the Telegraph and Telephone Inspectors and Telephone operators on incremental lines. The number of Telegraph Inspectors is increased by one. Ten additional signallers are provided for the Colombo Office and three for new offices to be opened in the course of the year.

Under Other Charges some increase of expenditure is being incurred in the matter of conveyance of mails; a sum of Rs. 2,040 is added for new Receiving Offices; and the travelling vote of the Department is increased to Rs. 15,000.

Under Special Expenditure provision is made for Telegraph Extension to Deltate and Telegraph

Under Special Expenditure provision is made for Telegraph Extension to Deltota and Teldeniya, for re-arrangement of the Kandy local wire and the Nuwara Eliya direct wire, and for completion of the metallic Telephone Circuit in Colombo.

In the Railway Department provision is made for an improved classification on incremental lines of the senior officers of the Department, whose present rates of remuneration are said to compare unfavourably with those of officers occupying similar positions elsewhere. An improved incremental scheme has also been prepared in connection with the stationmasters, clerks, and certain subordinate officers of the Department, which will come into force from the 1st January, 1901, and for which suitable provision is made. Provision is included for an Assistant Accountant, a new post, on a commencing salary of Rs. 3,600, for two additional stationmasters, two additional guards, and four clerks. With these changes and the increments earned by drivers and guards the cost of the establishment is increased from Rs. 1,093,325 to Rs. 1,135,809.

Under Other Charges the Ways and Works Department asks for Rs. 1775,000 for permanent way materials. It is asserted that the expenditure of this sum next year is absolutely necessary in connection

with renewals on the line.

The Locomotive Department requires increased provision for its workshops, for coal, and for stores and materials, all of which must be provided.

The expenditure of the Traffic Department also shows some increase, and some small items are

provided under Special Expenditure.

The expenditure on new works has been limited as far as possible, but yet amounts to the apparently large sum of Rs. 911,857. The list of new works includes provision for enlargement of the workshops at Colombo; and as this will enable the rolling stock for the extensions now under construction to be undertaken locally, it is proposed to charge one-half the cost to Construction Account. Provision is also made for the building of additional rolling stock for the lines now open, an addition said to be urgently necessary.

In the course of this year the Secretary of State has sanctioned a revised classification and scheme of salaries on an incremental basis for the Provincial and District Engineers of the Public Works Department. The necessary provision is included. It is also proposed to grade the Draughtsmen of the Department with the Draughtsmen of the Survey Department, and to place them on an incremental scale. The provision hitherto made for Irrigation is transferred to a separate heading—Irrigation Department.

The provision under the head of the Irrigation Department for salaries and other charges amounts to Rs. 323,258; and the amount proposed to be appropriated from surplus balances for works of

construction during the year is Rs. 700,000.

The vote for Public Works Annually Recurrent shows a still further increase, the amount required for 1901 being put at Rs. 1,952,430, as compared with Rs. 1,861,532 voted in 1900. The whole of the provision asked for is represented as being necessary for the efficient maintenance of existing roads, bridges, and buildings.

For Public Works Extraordinary a vote of Rs. 2,059,707 is proposed, the details regarding which will be found in the explanatory report from the Director of Public Works which accompanies this Message.*

A statement of the Expenditure proposed from Loans on works of construction during 1901 is appended to the Estimates.

DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance for making provision for the Contingent Services for the Year 1901.

WHEREAS the Contingent Expenditure required for the service of the Government of this island for the year One thousand Nine hundred and One, and not otherwise provided for, has been estimated at the sum of Twenty-two million Five hundred and Nine thousand and Four hundred and Forty-seven rupees: It is enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

1 A sum not exceeding Twenty-two million Five hundred and Nine thousand and Four hundred and Forty-seven rupees shall be and the same is hereby charged upon the revenue and other funds of this island for the Contingent Services for the year One thousand Nine hundred and One, and the said expenditure shall be in conformity with the details of the Estimates specified in the schedule hereunto annexed, whereof the following is an abstract:

2 And whereas by the 31st section of the Ordinance No. 31 of the year 1884, intituled "An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 10 of 1861, entitled "An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Public Thorough-fares in this Colony," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to propose the estimates prepared in pursuance thereof, or such of them as to him may appear expedient, in the Ordinance for making provision for the contingent expenditure of the colony for the ensuing year, to be dealt with in like manner as any other estimate to be so proposed: And it is thereby also provided that the amount of labour to be supplied under the provisions of the said Ordinance No. 31 of 1884, for the performance of any work or works for which an estimate or estimates may have been so proposed by the Governor, and approved of by the Legislative Council, shall be distinctly stated in the Ordinance enacted for the same, and that the same shall not exceed two-thirds of the whole amount of labour due from the district or districts within which it may be required to be performed: It is enacted that the amount of labour to be supplied under the provisions of the said Ordinance shall be in conformity with the estimates specified in the schedule hereunto annexed.

Treasurer to ; ay the above at such times at the Governor by warrant shall order.

- And to receive cradit in his accounts for the payments made in pursuance thereof.
- 3 The Treasurer of the said island shall issue and pay the said several sums to such persons, for the purposes hereinbefore-mentioned, upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time being, by any warrant or order in writing to be signed by him, shall from time to time order and direct; and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the revenues of the said island.
- 4 The said Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid; and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned; and he shall and may receive credit for the same accordingly.
