NOTICE UNDER ORDINANCE No. 1 OF 1897.

[An Ordinance relating to Claims to Forest, Chena, Waste, and Unoccupied Lands.]

Order under Section 2 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1897, declaring Land to be Crown Property.

In the matter of the land commonly called and known as Mahahena or Divigalahena, situate in the villages of Borala, Pallalagama, and Mudugamuwa, in the Matara-Weligam korale, in the Southern Province, and of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1897.

THE notice required by section 1 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1897 having been duly published in the manner described by that section (*vide Government Gazette* of August, 6 1897) in respect of the above-named land, and no claim having been made to the said land or to any interest therein within the period of three months from the said date of the said notice :

I, John Penry Lewis, Special Officer under section 28 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1897, under and by virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf by section 2 of the said Ordinance, do hereby on this 18th day of January, 1898, order and declare that the said land commonly called or known as Mahahena or Divigalahena, situate in the villages of Borala, Pallalagama, and Mudugamuwa, in the Matara-Weligam korale, in the Southern Province, and shown as lot 11,123 in preliminary plan 4,251 of lands situated in the said villages, a certified copy whereof is hereunto annexed, and containing in extent about 43 acres 1 rood and 2 perches, and bounded as follows: on the north by Bataketiawatta claimed by Karagoda Radage Janis, Geegauawattehena claimed by Hewage Babunhamy and others, Hiriwelawattahena claimed by Gamage Punchi Appu and others, Beragodawatta claimed by Leanage, Sianhamy and others, Dolawatta claimed by Gamage Punchi Appu and others, Gamagewatta, Ulugederawatta claimed by Gamage Punchi Appu, Piaddevatta claimed by Migahawattage Don Kornelis; on the east by Udagedarawatta claimed by Dinguru Amadoris and others and Divigalahena Naganairakebella; on the south by Katuimbulahenawatta claimed by Don Carolis and others, Balugahahenawatta claimed by Dollege Babahamy and others, Talgonedgewatta claimed by Dolege Wattuhamy, Thaladeniya claimed by Dolege Wattuhamy, Nalawanneyakoratuwa claimed by Rajapurage Punchi Babeya and others, Nalawanneyawatta claimed by Koggalakuruge Babuwa and others; on the west by Marambawatta claimed by Koggalahakuruge Babuwa and others—is the property of the Crown.
