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VITAL STATISTICS OF CEYLON.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE FIRST QUARTER OF 1900.

I.—Population.

1. The estimated population of the Island on the last day of the quarter was 3,484,035, an increase of 14,811 on the previous quarter, due to an excess of 9,484 births over deaths, and a further excess of 5,327 of arrivals compared with departures of Indian coolies. Table I. in the appendix gives the area of each Province and district of the Island with its estimated population and the number of marriages, births, and deaths registered in the quarter.

2. *Arrivals and Departures of Indian Coolies.*—The number of Indian coolies who arrived in the Island (37,406) was more than double the average for the corresponding quarter in the last five years (17,770), while the number of departures (32,079) was about 43 per cent. higher than the average (22,470). The excess of arrivals over departures was 5,327, while the corresponding period of 1895 to 1899 showed an average deficit of 4,700 of arrivals compared with departures.

II.—Marriages.

3. *Marriages.*—The number of general marriages—i.e., marriages other than Kandyan or Mohammedan—registered in this quarter was 4,155, and of Kandyan marriages 3,983.

Table VI. in the appendix shows the marriages solemnized among the general community in each Province and district of the Island, the civil condition, nationality, the highest, lowest, and mean ages of the parties, the mode of solemnization, the number of bridegrooms and brides who were unable to sign their names in the register, &c.

Table VII. in the appendix gives similar information in respect of the Kandyans.

4. *First Marriages; Re-marriages.*—Of the 4,155 general marriages, 3,629 (equal to 87 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 364 between widowers and spinsters, 94 between bachelors and widows, 64 between widowers and widows, 2 between bachelors and divorced women, 1 between a widower and a divorced woman, and 1 between a divorced man and a spinster. Of the 3,983 Kandyan marriages, 3,091 (equal to 77 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 371 between widowers and spinsters, 177 between bachelors and widows, 155 between widowers and widows, 89 between divorced men and spinsters, 61 between bachelors and divorced women, 16 between widowers and divorced women, 12 between divorced men and divorced women, and 11 between divorced men and widows.

5. *Age at Marriage.*—The mean age at marriage for the general community was 28.8 for males and 21.7 for females, and for Kandyans 29.5 for males and 22.0 for females.

6. *Minors.*—In the general community 4 per cent. of the bridegrooms and 46 per cent. of the brides, and amongst the Kandyans 8 per cent. of the bridegrooms and 47 per cent. of the brides, were under 21 years of age.

7. *Mixed Marriages.*—There were 36 mixed marriages in the quarter: 18 between Sinhalese and Tamils, 9 between Burghers and Sinhalese, 5 between Burghers and Tamils, 2 between Europeans and Burghers, and 2 other mixed marriages.

8. *Signatures in Marriage Register.*—Of the 8,310 persons married among the general community this quarter, 1,111 men and 3,227 women signed the register with marks; that is to say, only 73 per cent. of the men and 22 per cent. of the women were able to write their names. Of the 7,966 persons married among the Kandyans, 1,613 men and 3,823 women signed the register with marks; in other words, only 60 per cent. of the men and 4 per cent. of the women were able to write their names.

III.—Births and Deaths.

9. *Births.*—The births registered in the quarter numbered 34,051 (30 Europeans, 204 Burghers, 25,810 Sinhalese, 5,902 Tamils, 1,971 Moors, 98 Malays, and 36 others), and were in the proportion of 43·2 to 1,000 persons living per annum, as against 34·8, the average for the corresponding period in the ten years 1890–99, and 47·6, the rate in the first quarter of the previous year.

10. *Deaths.*—The deaths registered in the quarter numbered 24,567 (29 Europeans, 121 Burghers, 15,981 Sinhalese, 6,671 Tamils, 1,619 Moors, 103 Malays, and 43 others), and corresponded to an annual rate of 31·2 per 1,000, as against 30·6, the average in the ten preceding first quarters, and 41·8 in the first quarter of last year.

11. The births and deaths and their rates in this quarter are compared in the following statement with the figures for the previous quarter, the first quarter of the previous year, and the average for the first quarters in the years 1890–99; from which it will be seen that while the birth-rate (43·2) has risen more than 8 per 1,000 over its average (34·8), the rise in the death-rate (31·2) over its averages (30·6) is slight (·6 per 1,000). The increase in the rates was due to improved registration since 1897:—

12. Table II. gives information similar to that given in Table A in regard to each Province and district. Table I. gives the births and deaths according to sex, with the marriages, population, and area of each Province and district; Table VIII. the births according to nationality and sex; Table IX. the deaths for each month of the quarter according to nationality in each Province and district. The causes of deaths are shown in Table X. for each district; and, in Table XI., for the estates in the Central, Uva, and Sabaragamuwa Provinces, and in the Colombo and Kalutara Districts of the Western Province; and in Table XII. for the town of Colombo according to wards and nationalities. Table XIII. shows, for the various races, the period of life at which the deaths occurred in each district.

13. *Sex.*—Of the total number of births (34,051), 17,453 were males and 16,598 females, i.e., 1,105 males to 1,000 females. Of the total number of deaths (24,567), 12,415 were males and 12,152 were females. Out of equal numbers living of each sex, there died 907 males to 1,000 females.

14. *Infant Mortality.*—The deaths of infants under one year numbered 6,250, and were in the proportion of 184 to 1,000 births. The rate of infant mortality varied from 343 (for Tamils) in Mullaittivu, 383 (for Tamils and for Moors) in Puttalam, 330 (for Tamils) in Trincomalee, 329 (for Tamils) in Mannar, 323 (for Sinhalese) in Puttalam, 277 (for Sinhalese) in Anuradhapura, 265 (for Sinhalese) in Kurunegala to 144 (for Sinhalese) in Matara, 134 (for Sinhalese) in Galle, 123 (for Sinhalese) in Kalutara, 104 (for Sinhalese) in Negombo and in Chilaw, and 101 (for Sinhalese) in Colombo.

15. *Centenarians.*—Thirty-nine deaths (16 males and 23 females) were reported to be of centenarians, but the ages reported cannot be relied on.

IV.—State of Public Health.

16. The general health of the population during the quarter was not worse than usual, the slight increase in the death-rate from 30·6 to 31·2 being due to improved registration.

17. Tables III., IV., and V. in the appendix show the births and deaths, the birth-rates and the death-rates for all ages and for infants in the several Provinces and districts of the Island, and in the revenue subdivisions of those districts for the quarter under review, for the preceding quarter, and for the corresponding quarter of the previous year, and the average rate for the corresponding period in the last nine years 1891–99. The rates shown are for the Sinhalese only in the districts which are mainly inhabited by the Sinhalese, and for Tamils only where Tamils form the bulk of the population. These separate rates furnish more trustworthy data for comparing the relative sanitary condition of those districts and subdivisions of the Island than if the rates included other nationalities temporarily resident in them. In the Puttalam District, where the Sinhalese and Mohammedans are found in almost equal numbers, and in the Batticaloa District, which is inhabited in almost equal numbers by Tamils and Mohammedans, the rates are given for the different sections of the population.

18. Judged by the mortality of the indigenous population, the healthiest Province in the quarter was, as usual, the Western (23·0); the healthiest district Nuwara Eliya (20·7); and the healthiest subdivision Uda Bulangama of the Central Province (15·7).

19. *Western Province.*—The Western Province, as already stated, ranks as the healthiest Province in the Island. The deaths among the Sinhalese, who form 87 per cent. of the entire provincial population and number according to latest estimate 728,127, were in the quarter under report equal to a rate of 23·0, which, though 2·5 per 1,000 higher than the average (20·5), is 1·1 per 1,000 less than in the corresponding quarter of the previous year (24·1). The mortality of infants under one year of age, which is generally accepted as the most sensitive test of the health of a population, was in this Province at the rate of 107 to a thousand births registered, the lowest rate recorded for any Province in the quarter. Of the three districts of which this Province is composed, Negombo was the healthiest and Kalutara the unhealthiest.

20. In the Colombo District the mortality was in the proportion of 22·1 per thousand, or 2·4 per thousand less than in the corresponding quarter of the previous year (24·0), but 2 per thousand more than the average rate (20·1). With the exception of Hewagam korale, in which an improvement is noticeable (19·2 as against an average of 21·2), every division shows a death-rate higher than its average for the corresponding quarter in the nine years 1891–1899. The healthiest division in the district was Siyane korale (18·9), the superior sanitary condition of which is further evidenced by its low rate of infantile mortality, 66 deaths to a thousand registered births—the lowest rate in the quarter. The unhealthiest division in the district was, as usual, the Colombo Municipality (35·1), which is treated of at greater length in chapter VII.

21. The Negombo District, which is usually the healthiest district in the Island, ranks third in point of health in the quarter under review, the first and second places being taken by the Nuwara Eliya and Chilaw Districts

respectively. The health of the district in the quarter was however normal, there being 21·6 deaths to a thousand of the population, while the average for the quarter is 21·8. Two of its three subdivisions show reduced mortality, the exception being the Local Board division (48·6 as against 42·5), where, as in other towns, the rate is exaggerated by deaths in the hospital and jail, and is therefore unreliable.

22. In the Kalutara District the mortality rate (25·9) was 5·2 per 1,000 in excess of its average (20·7), every division sharing in the deterioration. The highest death-rate was, as usual, in the Kalutara town (33·8) and the lowest in the Rayigam korale (22·4). In Pasdun korale the rate 31·1 was abnormally high and exceeded its average (20·9) by over 10 per 1,000.

23. *Central Province.*—The death-rate of the Sinhalese population in the Central Province declined to 26·5 from an average of 32·9, and all the districts shared in the improvement.

24. The Kandy District, with a death-rate of 25·6, as against an average of 29·6, shows a satisfactory improvement in health, and all its subdivisions, except the Kandy Municipality, had greatly diminished mortality. Uda Bulatgama division was the healthiest in the Province, and, in fact, in the whole Island, with a death-rate (15·7) 4·3 per 1,000 below the average (20·0); while in the Kandy Municipality, the unhealthiest division in the district, the death-rate rose to 39·6 from an average of 27·0. The mortality of the estate Tamil population of the Kandy District was equal to a rate of 27·0 per 1,000 and slightly higher than the Sinhalese rate 25·6.

25. In the Matale District there was an appreciable decline in the mortality rate (from 49·8 to 34·2). The improvement extended to all its subdivisions except the Matale Local Board, where, too, the increase was but nominal (from 43·4 to 43·9). Among the estate population of the Matale District estimated at 16,112, there were 36·5 deaths to every 1,000 of the population.

26. Nuwara Eliya District was the healthiest in the Province and in the Island, with a Sinhalese death-rate of 20·7 as against an average of 28·5 and an Estate Tamil mortality rate of 16·4. With the single exception of the town division, where the mortality rose to 41·5 from an average of 21·4, and where the population is too small to yield trustworthy rates, all the divisions had diminished rates. The healthiest division of the district was Kotmale (17·9 as against 22·3), but the greatest improvement was in Walapane (21·1 against 34·6).

27. *Northern Province.*—The Northern Province, which suffered considerably from an epidemic of fever and pneumonia in 1899, and of which the death-rate rose in the first quarter of that year as high as 67·8, has reverted to its normal condition, the death-rate for the quarter under report being 34·4 as against an average of 35·1. In the Jaffna District the death-rate was 2·6 per 1,000 in excess of the average, while the other two districts (Mannar and Mullaitivu) show diminished mortality rates.

28. In the Jaffna District the death-rate rose to 32·8 from an average of 30·2, and the great majority of its subdivisions show increased death-rates. The divisions which show an improvement in health compared with their averages are Vadamaradchi west (29·7), Tenmaradchi (37·7), and Pachchilaippali (33·1).

29. In the Mannar District the health was normal (53·0 as against 53·5). The healthiest subdivision of the district and the only one with a death-rate less than the average was Mannar Islands (41·4 as against 53·9, the rate for the corresponding period of 1891–99), while the unhealthiest was Nanaddan division, where the death-rate rose to 60·9 from an average of 48·0.

30. The Mullaitivu District fared better with a death-rate of 51·9—a decrease of 7·5 per 1,000 compared with the average (59·4). Karikaddumulai had the lowest death-rate (38·0 as against 61·5), and in Mulliyavalai, the unhealthiest division in the district, the mortality rate rose to 81·1 from an average of 58·7.

31. *Southern Province.*—This Province has not been so healthy as usual, the death-rate recorded for the Sinhalese, who form 95 per cent. of the provincial population, being 29·3, i.e., 2·1 per 1,000 higher than the average 27·2. In both Galle and Matara Districts the death-rates exceeded their averages, while in the Hambantota District a marked improvement occurred.

32. In the Galle District the mortality rate rose to 28·0 from an average of 26·5. Every division, except Talpe pattu and Walallawiti korale, which had maintained their normal health, show enhanced death-rates, notably Four Gravets beyond Municipal limits and Akkimama, which is credited with a death-rate of 26·2 as against 19·6, the average for the corresponding quarter in the years 1891–99. The division of Four Gravets beyond Municipal limits and Akkimama was still the healthiest division of the district. Gangaboda pattu comes next with a death-rate (26·6) 1·8 per 1,000 higher than the average (24·8). Talpe pattu (29·9) was the unhealthiest division in the district.

33. In the Matara District the health was about normal, the increase in the death-rate (to 26·7 from 26·0) being but slight. Three of the seven divisions, viz., Four Gravets beyond Local Board limits, Kandaboda pattu, and Gangaboda pattu, show diminished death-rates. The rest fared worse than usual. The healthiest division in the district was, as usual, Four Gravets beyond Local Board limits (19·7), and the unhealthiest the Local Board division (47·8 as against 31·3).

34. The Hambantota District shows an improvement in the death-rate from 45·6 to 37·6, but the improvement was confined to Giruwa pattu west, the healthiest division in the district. The unhealthiest division in the quarter was, as usual, Magam pattu, exclusive of Four Gravets, with a death-rate of 79·1 against an average of 75·9. In Giruwa pattu east (57·9 as against 47·3) the increase in the death-rate was over 10 per 1,000.

35. *Eastern Province.*—This Province is mainly inhabited by the Tamils and Moors in the proportion of about 9 to 5. The Tamils enjoyed normal health in the quarter, the death-rate being 34·0 as against an average of 34·1, while the Sinhalese of the Province and, in a less degree, the Moors fared badly, the death-rate of the former (54·8) showing an increase of 16·3 per 1,000 and the latter (27·6) of 1·5 per 1,000.

36. The Tamil death-rate in the Batticaloa District declined to 31·7 from an average of 38·3, all its subdivisions but one sharing in the improvement. The exception was the Batticaloa Local Board, which was the unhealthiest division in the District, with a death-rate of 38·1 as against its average 28·9. The lowest death-rate for the Tamils (21·4) was in Chammanturai and Nadukadu, while the greatest improvement (from 59·7 to 25·4) was in Nintavur and Akkarai pattu. The lowest death-rate for the Moors was in Eravur, Rukam, and Korralai (14·1) and the highest in Panawa pattu (37·9).

37. In the Trincomalee District the Tamils returned a death-rate of 45·5, being 6·4 per 1,000 more than the average (39·1). The deterioration was shared by all its subdivisions, of which the healthiest division was Koddiyar pattu (31·3), while the unhealthiest division, Trincomalee town, had a death-rate (53·0) 11 per 1,000 more than its average (42·0).

38. *North-Western Province.*—The Sinhalese death-rate of this Province declined in the quarter under report to 36·2 from an average of 44·7, an improvement towards which all its districts contributed.

39. In the Kurunegala District the mortality rate fell to 39·9 from its average 48·2. All the divisions in the district except the town, where the paucity of the population and the large number of deaths in the hospital exaggerate the rates and render them untrustworthy for purposes of comparison, show reduced mortality. The healthiest division was, as usual, Katugampola hatpattu with a death-rate of 28·0, that is, 1·3 per 1,000 less than its average (29·3). The unhealthiest division was Kurunegala Local Board (201·2).

40. The Chilaw District was the second healthiest in the Island and had a death-rate of 21·2, or 4 per 1,000 less than the average. All its subdivisions show an improvement except Chilaw town, where the death-rate rose to 37·1 from an average 33·2. The healthiest division was Pitigal korale central and south (18·3), and the unhealthiest Pitigal korale north (39·0).

41. The Puttalam District is mainly inhabited by Moors and Sinhalese, and the Tamils, too, are found in large numbers. The Sinhalose death-rate of the Puttalam District for the quarter was 47·1, being considerably lower than its average 66·8, the Tamil death-rate was 86·2 as against an average of 68·4, and the Moor rate was 44·5 as against an average of 50·2. The death-rate of the Moors, it will be seen, is lower than those of the other sections of the population, and this no doubt is due to the superior social condition of the former.

42. *North-Central Province.*—The health of this Province was good, the death-rate recorded for the Sinhalese (48·8) being (7·3) less than the average (56·1). All its divisions show diminished death-rates except the Anuradhapura town, in which the rate rose from 56·7 to 60·2. Tamankaduwa was the healthiest division in the quarter with a death-rate of 41·9 as against an average of 53·5, and Hurulupulata was the next with 48·0 as against 55·8.

43. *Province of Uva.*—The Province of Uva, too, enjoyed better health than usual (36·9 as against 40·9). The Badulla Local Board (48·6 as against 43·3) is the only division in which the health seems to have deteriorated. In Wellassa division (47·0 as against 46·9) and in Buttala division (55·2 as against 55·2) it was normal, while in the rest of the divisions there was marked improvement. The healthiest divisions were Yatikinda and Udakinda, each with a death-rate of 26·5 as against averages of 35·4 and 30·3 respectively.

44. *Province of Sabaragamuwa.*—In the Province of Sabaragamuwa the death-rate rose to 33·4 from an average of 31·3.

45. The death-rate of the Ratnapura District (38·9) was 1·5 per 1,000 below the average (40·4), and 5 per 1,000 less than in the corresponding period of 1899. In Kolonna korale, the healthiest division in the district, the death-rate fell to 27·9 from an average of 43·3, a decrease of 15·4 per 1,000, while in the Kukulu korale, on the other hand, it rose to 51·5 from an average of 36·7.

46. The death-rate of the Kegalla District declined to 29·0 from its average 37·0, but the improvement was confined to Paranakuru korale and Lower Bulatgama. In the former the improvement would seem to be but nominal, but in the latter there was a decrease of over 3 per 1,000 in the death-rate. The lowest death-rate in the district and in the Province was in the Lower Bulatgama division 19·4.

V.—Causes of Deaths.

47. The causes of deaths registered during the quarter are given in Table X., and are summarized below :—

48. *Fever and Diarrhoeal Diseases.*—Of the 24,567 deaths registered in the quarter, 5,786 were reported as due to various forms of fever and 4,589 to diarrhoeal diseases, i.e., fever and diarrhoeal diseases caused 42 per cent. of the total number of deaths.

49. There were no deaths registered from cholera this quarter. Sixteen deaths were attributed to smallpox, 8 of which were in Colombo, 5 in Kandy, and 1 each in Kalutara, Nuwara Eliya, and Badulla. Influenza proved fatal in 35 cases, measles in 23, whooping cough in 20, and chickenpox in 6.

50. The other chief natural causes of death were infantile convulsions 2,487, debility 993, phthisis 796, pneumonia 718, anaemia 698, worms 691, general dropsy 630, old age 484, puerperal convulsions 315, remittent fever 272, malarial cachexia 267, cancer 56, starvation, want of breast milk 54, parangi 35, leprosy 26, hydrophobia 17.

51. *Accidents.*—Of the 361 deaths attributed to accidents, 81 were reported as due to fall from trees, 74 to drowning, 38 to snake-bite, 30 to burns and scalds, 28 to injury at birth, 19 to gunshot wounds, 14 to fall of heavy substances, 8 to poison, 7 to being run over by carts, 6 to fall from heights other than trees, 4 to injuries caused by bulls, 3 to falling into pits, 3 to lightning, 3 to injuries caused by elephants, 4 to cuts, 3 to being run over by trains, 2 to sunstroke, 2 to injuries caused by wild boars.

52. *Suicide.*—Thirty-five deaths were attributed to suicide, of which 20 were by hanging, 7 by drowning, 2 by poison, 2 by gunshot, 2 by cut, stab.

53. *Homicide.*—Thirty deaths were attributed to homicide, 10 in Colombo, 4 in Kalutara, 3 each in Kurunegala, Badulla, and Kegalla, 2 each in Matara and Ratnapura, and 1 each in Matale, Jaffna, and Hambantota.

54. *Executions.*—Eleven persons (9 Sinhalese and 3 Tamils) were judicially executed (6 in Kandy, 4 in Colombo, and 1 in Jaffna).

VI.—Health of the Estate Population.

55. The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Central, Uva, and Sabaragamuwa Provinces, and in the Colombo and Kalutara Districts of the Western Province, was 1,795 (of which 4 were Europeans, 5 Burghers, 67 Sinhalese, 1,698 Tamils, 17 Moors, 1 Malay, and 3 others), and the total number of deaths was 1,982 (1 European, 1 Burgher, 32 Sinhalese, 1,929 Tamils, 15 Moors, 1 Malay, and 3 others), corresponding respectively to an annual birth-rate of 24·0 and a death-rate of 27·3 per 1,000. The causes of death are given in detail in Table XI., and may be summarized as follows:—

57. *Kandy District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Kandy District was 653 (of which 618 were Tamils, 18 Sinhalese, 8 Moors, 3 Europeans, 2 Burghers, 1 Malay, and 3 others), and the deaths numbered 696 (of which 681 were Tamils, 9 Sinhalese, 5 Moors, and 1 other). The Tamil birth-rate in the quarter was equal to 24·5, as against a mean rate of 25·8 in the first quarter of 1891-99; and the Tamil death-rate was equal to 27·0 per cent. as against 27·3, the mean rate for the corresponding period of 1891-99. As usual, the most fatal causes were diarrhoeal diseases, which caused 218 deaths (98 from diarrhoea and 120 from dysentery), or 31 per cent. of the total number of deaths (696). The other chief causes of death were debility 126 (mostly deaths of infants from inability to suck milk), pneumonia 50, malarial cachexia 46, infantile convulsions 41, fevers 35, general dropsy 28, old age 21, bronchitis 12, dochmias duodenalis 11.

58. *Matale District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Matale District was 103 (100 Tamils, 2 Sinhalese, and 1 Burgher), and the deaths numbered 149 (145 Tamils, 2 Sinhalese, 1 European, and 1 Moor), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 25·2 against a mean rate of 25·9 for the corresponding period of 1891-99, and a death-rate of 36·5 against a mean rate of 32·8 in the first quarters of 1891-99. Dysentery and diarrhoea caused 33 deaths, i.e., 22 per cent. of the total number of deaths (149), debility 27, malarial cachexia 24, pneumonia 16, fevers 7, and general dropsy 6.

59. *Nuwara Eliya District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Nuwara Eliya District was 394 (388 Tamils, 7 Sinhalese, and 2 Moors), and the deaths numbered 318 (311 Tamils, 5 Sinhalese, 1 Moor, and 1 Malay), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 20·3 against a mean rate of 22·0 in the first quarters of 1891-99, and a death-rate of 16·4 as against a mean rate of 20·0. Here, as elsewhere, the diarrhoeal diseases were responsible for the majority of deaths, the total number attributed to these causes being 80, i.e., 25 per cent. of the total number (318). 72 deaths were attributed to debility, 37 to pneumonia, 24 to fevers, 18 to old age, 14 to general dropsy, 14 to bronchitis, and 11 to infantile convulsions.

60. *Badulla District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Badulla District was 282 (274 Tamils, 7 Sinhalese, and 1 Moor), and the deaths numbered 241 (235 Tamils, 3 Moors, 2 Sinhalese, and 1 Burgher), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 31·5 as against a mean rate of 33·6 in the corresponding period of 1891–99, and a death-rate of 27·0 as against a mean rate of 35·1. Diarrhoea and dysentery were fatal in 64 cases, i.e., 27 per cent. of the total number of deaths (241), debility in 62, pneumonia in 26, fevers in 20, convulsions in 12.

61. *Ratnapura District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Ratnapura District was 78 (68 Tamils, 7 Sinhalese, 2 Moors, and 1 European), and the deaths numbered 73 (68 Tamils, 4 Sinhalese, and 1 Moor), and corresponded respectively to an annual birth-rate among the Tamils of 32·2 and a death-rate of 32·2, as against averages of 32·6 and 45·2 respectively. The most fatal causes were as usual diarrhoeal diseases, which caused 20 deaths (10 from diarrhoea and 10 from dysentery), or nearly 21 per cent. of the total number of deaths (73). The other chief natural causes were infantile convulsions 7, pneumonia 7, and malarial cachexia 4.

62. *Kegalla District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Kegalla District numbered 215 (190 Tamils, 19 Sinhalese, 6 Moors), and the deaths numbered 273 (260 Tamils, 7 Sinhalese, 4 Moors, and 2 others), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 23·9 as against 23·2, the average for the corresponding period of 1891–99, and a death-rate of 32·7 as against the mean rate of 38·7. The largest number of deaths in this district, as elsewhere, was due to diarrhoeal diseases, to which 100 deaths, i.e., 37 per cent., were attributed. The other principal causes were fevers 25, malarial cachexia 21, debility 20, infantile convulsions 17.

63. *Colombo District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Colombo District, by which is meant the Avisawella division of the district, was 19 (17 Tamils and 2 Sinhalese), and the number of deaths was 100 (all Tamils), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 13·4 and a death-rate of 78·5, as against averages 19·8 and 72·5 respectively. The birth- and death-rates among the Sinhalese inhabitants of the division were 43·7 and 19·2 respectively. Diarrhoea and dysentery were fatal in 51 cases, i.e., 51 per cent. of the total number of deaths. Fifteen deaths were attributed to fevers, 4 to phthisis, 4 to anaemia, and 4 to infantile convulsions.

64. *Kalutara District.*—The total number of births registered from the estates of this district numbered 51 (46 Tamils and 5 Sinhalese), and the deaths numbered 132 (129 Tamils and 3 Sinhalese), corresponding to an annual birth-rate of 18·1 and a death-rate of 50·9, as against the averages 14·4 and 41·9 respectively. Diarrhoea and dysentery were fatal in 53 cases. 13 deaths were attributed to debility, 12 to fevers, 10 to pneumonia, 8 to general dropsy, 7 to malarial cachexia, 5 to childbirth, 4 to infantile convulsions.

VII.—Health of the Town of Colombo.

65. The deaths registered in the town of Colombo during the quarter numbered 1,135. This, added to seven deaths of town residents which occurred in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Kanatta (outside the town), and were registered by an extra-urban registrar, makes a total of 1,142, corresponding to a rate of 32·1 per 1,000 per annum, being a decline of 1·6 per 1,000, compared with the mean rate for the first quarter in the last seven years (33·7).

66. The births registered in the quarter numbered 942, representing an annual rate of 26·5 per 1,000, which is an increase of 5·5 per 1,000 on the mean rate for the quarter in the last seven years (21·0).

67. As usual, the deaths exceeded the births, due mainly to the preponderance of males over females (chiefly among the Europeans, Indian Tamils and Mohammedans), to the presence of hospitals, which add to the mortality of the town, and to an improvement in the registration of births, which, however, is still defective, especially among the Moors.

68. The subjoined Table E gives the births and deaths and their rates for each nationality in the first quarter of this year and for the first quarter of last year and the average rates for the first quarters in 1893–99:—

69. The birth- and death-rates given in the above table for the Europeans, Malays, and "Others" are not reliable, owing chiefly to their population being too small for purposes of rate calculation.

70. Excluding the rates for these sections, the lowest death-rate was, as usual, among the Burghers (24·7, against an average of 27·2 in 1893–99), and the highest among the Tamils (43·9, against an average of 42·9). The Sinhalese and Moorish death-rates 35·1 and 35·9 respectively were about their averages (35·0 and 35·2).

71. The Malays are credited with the highest birth-rate (43·7), nearly double their average (23·6), followed closely by Burghers (42·2) as against an average of 20·3. The Sinhalese birth-rate (32·9) is an improvement of 42 per cent. over the average (22·3), the Tamil birth-rate (19·3) is more than double the average (9·2), but the Moors show a lower birth-rate (28·9) than their average (37·7).

72. The number of births and deaths of the different races in the different wards of the town, their rates per 1,000, the principal zymotic causes of death, &c., during the first quarter of 1900, are shown in the following table:—

73. The low birth- and death-rates of the Fort and Galle Face and the Pettah Wards are due to their population being chiefly a floating male adult one. Excluding these two divisions, the healthiest division in the town was the Kollupitiya Ward, with a death-rate of 24·4 per 1,000 per annum, and the unhealthiest the New Bazaar Ward, whose death-rate was 38·6. The highest birth-rate was in New Bazaar Ward (35·8), and the next highest in St. Sebastian (35·2).

74. There were no deaths from cholera. One death from smallpox occurred in the town and six others in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Kanatta, to which the patients were removed from the town. Whooping cough, mumps, and diphtheria each had a victim.

75. Phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia were fatal in 199 cases (against an average of 213 in the corresponding period of the last five years), diarrhoea and dysentery in 185 (average 183), debility in 121 (average 93), infantile convulsions in 94 (average 122), old age in 67 (average 62), diseases of the circulatory system in 39 (average 16), remittent fever in 36 (average 68), simple and ill-defined fever in 34 (average 46), parturition in 28 (average 24), dochmias duodenalis in 27 (average 6), premature birth in 23 (average 30), worms in 19 (average 41), malarial cachexia in 19 (average 40), enteric fever in 19 (average 25).

76. Seventeen deaths were attributed to accidents, of which 3 were due to burns and scalds, 2 to gunshot wounds, 1 to drowning, 1 to fall from a height, 1 to fall of a heavy substance, 1 to explosion of gunpowder, 1 to a kick from a horse. Two men were run over by carts and killed.

77. Five deaths were attributed to homicide and three to suicide (1 by poison, 1 by drowning, and the other by hanging).

VIII.—Health of other Towns.

78. The total number of births registered in the principal towns (exclusive of Colombo) during the quarter numbered 2,119 and corresponded to an annual rate of 37·7 per 1,000, an increase of about 6 per 1,000 over the average for the corresponding period in 1891–99 (31·9).

79. The deaths numbered 2,318 and were at the annual rate of 41·3 per 1,000, an increase of nearly 5 per 1,000 over the average (36·5).

80. The following Table G shows the birth- and death-rates in each of the principal towns of the Island for the first quarters of 1900 and 1899 and the average rates for the first quarters in 1891–99.

81. For the towns of Moratuwa, Panadure, Gampola, Nawalapitiya, Mannar, Mullaittiva, Vavuniya, Tangalla, and Kegalla the rates from 1891–97 are not available for comparison with the present rates.

82. The death-rates are given inclusive of hospital and jail deaths as well as exclusive of them. In some of the towns which attract large numbers of estate coolies and destitute poor to the hospitals, the difference between the two rates is striking, e.g., Matale 104·4 and 21·3, Kurunegala 86·3 and 23·9, Gampola 84·5 and 20·4, Nawalapitiya 79·8 and 16·0. Excluding hospital and jail deaths, the highest death-rate in the quarter was in Hambantota (53·3), followed by Anuradhapura (46·9), and Trincomalee (43·8), and the lowest (excluding Vavuniya, where the population is too insignificant to yield a reliable rate) in Ratnapura (14·9), followed by Kegalla (15·5), Nawalapitiya (16·0), Gampola (20·4), Nuwara Eliya (20·8).
