The Award

The above-mentioned matter in dispute as specified in the statement of the Commissioner of Labour, dated 21st November, 1977, was referred by him to me under section 3 (1)(d) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon (1956 Revised Edition), as amended, for settlement by arbitration, the parties to the dispute having jointly nominated me as arbitrator for the said purpose.

2. The matter in dispute between the aforesaid parties is whether the deferment of the Increment due to Mr. H. A. T. Perera by the Management of Messrs. Walker Sons & Co. Ltd., was justified and to what relief he is entitled.

3. Mr. Upali Cooray, Legal Representative of the Ceylon Mercantile Union (hereinafter referred to as the Union), appeared for Mr. H. A. T. Perera (hereinafter referred to as the workman) and Mr. S. M. Fernando, Assistant Secretary, Employers' Federation of Ceylon, for Messrs. Walker Sons & Co. Ltd., (hereinafter referred to as the Company).

4. My inquiry into the dispute began on 21.12.77 and was completed on 31.08.78 through nine sittings.

5. At the outset of the inquiry a preliminary question raised by the Union in its statement under section 21 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Regulations had to be resolved. The question was whether the imposition of the punishment in question on the workman by the Management was not time-barred under clause 26 (5) of the Collective Agreement No. 5 of 1967 which bound the Union and the Respondent

Company. In terms of the proviso to this clause, if an employer fails, after holding an inquiry into the charges framed against an employee, to make an order on the charges within thirty days of the conclusion of the inquiry, the employee shall not be liable to punishment. It was contended by the Union that the inquiry into the charges against the workman was concluded on 29.03.1976 but the findings of the inquiry and the order of the Management were not conveyed to the workman till 06.05.1976, by which date the prescribed thirty days had lapsed.

6. At my inquiry into the preliminary question Mr. W. Nandasena who was an observer on behalf of the Union at the domestic inquiry, and Mr. H. A. T. Perera, the workman in this dispute, gave evidence. The Company's witness was Mr. E. Ratnayake, the Personnel Officer of the Company, who held the domestic inquiry.

7. It was in evidence that besides the workman there were three other workers of the Company who faced charges in connection with the same matter as the workman—namely, the loss of two coils of cable belonging to the Company on 28.07.75. The Inquiry Officer dealt with each accused in turn, the first one being the workman, and gave his findings on all of them when he had completed hearing the case of all of them. The Union took 29.03.1976, the date on which the hearing of the charges against the workman ended, as the date from which the thirty days' limit should be reckoned; but the Management maintained that 08.04.1976, the date on which the inquiry into the charges against all the accused was concluded, as the relevant date for testing compliance with the prescribed time limit. The decision of the Management on the charges framed against the workman was conveyed to him on 06.05.1976.

8. My ruling on this preliminary question was that the decision of the Management has to be taken as having been communicated to the workman within the thirty days prescribed in the Collective Agreement, taking 08.04.1976 as the date on which the domestic inquiry was concluded. My reason for this ruling was, in brief, that the charges against all the four employees of the Company arose out of the same matter and that there was therefore justification for the case to be treated as one case involving more than one accused and for the verdict to be given at the end of the inquiry into the charges against all the accused.

9. I pass on to the inquiry into the dispute itself between the parties regarding the deferment by the Management of the increment due to the workman. The witnesses for the Company were Messrs. H. G. Cyril, lorry cleaner, and U. G. John, lorry driver—both employees of the Company. The Union's witnesses were Messrs. S. Kodituwakku, Cashier of the Company, and the workman himself, Mr. H. A. T. Perera, who was the Stores Clerk of the Company's Galle Branch at the material time.

10. The dispute arose, as stated above, from the loss of two coils of PVC 1/044 cable (priced at Rs. 40 each, according to the cash sale memo dated 18.07.75) which formed part of a total of eighty coils bought

by the Company from Messrs. E. B. Creasy & Co., Colombo, on 25.07.1975 (Friday) and transported in a Company lorry to the Company's Branch at Galle on the same day. Since the lorry arrived in Galle late in the evening (about 9.30) the goods it carried remained in the lorry in the Company garage, which is opened and shut by the resident Manager of the Galle Branch of the Company, until the next working day, which was Monday 28.05.1975. In the morning of that day the consignment of coils of cable was unloaded into the Company Stores. Some time before noon it was discovered by the workman that the number of coils was short by two. All this is common ground.

11. The loss of the two coils of cable was attributed by the Management to the issue by the workman of six coils instead of four which would have made up the 200 yards of cable required under the requisition brought to him that morning by the electrician, Karunaratne. It was this issue of coils in excess and the issue of coils before he had actually taken them over into the stores that formed the two charges against the workman, which resulted in the deferment of an increment in his salary.

12. Cyril, the cleaner of the lorry which carried the coils of cable from Colombo to Galle, was the first witness called by the Company. His evidence was that he went to work on Monday 28.07.75 at 8 a.m. as usual and, a short time after, went in the lorry from the garage to the entrance to the stores to unload the goods. At that time there were three or four labourers waiting there. First, he gave the invoice relating to the consignment to the workman and waited near the lorry to unload the goods. He was then told by the workman to hand over from the lorry two coils of cable to Karunaratne, the electrician, which he did. Driver John who saw him hand over the coils to Karunaratne asked him why he was doing that and he told John that he had been instructed to do so by the workman. Later he was asked by the workman to bring to his table four coils of cable, which also he did. Soon after this he was asked by driver John to count the number of coils in the lorry and he did so and found there were seventy-four. Thereafter the coils of cable were unloaded into the stores. This was at about 9.40 a.m.

13. Cyril also stated in evidence that when the workman came to him at about 12 noon on the same day while he was in the garage and told him about a shortage, he, Cyril, instead that there could be no shortage. Both of them then went to the stores and counted the coils and finding that there were seventy-four he explained to the workman that he, Cyril, had given two coils to Karunaratne and brought four coils to the workman's table, both deliveries as instructed by the workman himself, and there was thus no shortage.

14. Driver John's evidence corroborated the evidence of Cyril in the material points.

15. The first witness called by the Union was Mr. S. Kodituwakku, Cashier at the Galle Branch of the Company. The only point of interest in his evidence was his statement that he heard the work-

man asking someone to bring two coils and that he saw two coils on the workman's table before he asked for two more coils. But I do not attach much importance to this witness's evidence as it was mostly vague. At page 105 of the proceedings of this case, for example, his answers to most the questions were "I cannot remember".

16. According to the evidence of the workman the lorry was brought to the stores a few minutes after 8.30 on the morning of 28.07.75 and the invoice relating to the coils of cable was given to him by Cyril, the cleaner of the lorry. He asked Cyril to wait a little to unload the goods as he had no labourers at that time. By this time Karunaratne, an electrician of the Company, had come up with a requisition for two hundred yards of cable and when it was found that this material which was not available in the stores had arrived just then by that lorry, he asked Cyril to bring two coils to him from the lorry, which Cyril did, but finding that the coils were of fifty yards in length each and not of one hundred yards as he had supposed he called for two more coils, which also were brought to him by Cyril to be given to Karunaratne.

17. The workman also stated that that was the first occasion during his twenty four years' service with the Company he delivered any goods before they were properly taken into stock. Thereafter, he continued, he went into the stores and counted the coils which had by then been unloaded there and found that there were seventy-four whereas there should have been seventy-six, four coils having been taken from the lorry on his instructions to be given to Karunaratne out of a consignment of eighty coils. He then went to the garage to see Cyril and finding him there told him about the shortage. Both of them went to the stores and there was another count but with the same result. When he asked Cyril how was it that there was a shortage he merely "shook his head". The workman promptly reported the loss to the Office Assistant.

18. From the evidence summarised above it will be noted as facts (a) that there were two deliveries of coils of cable from the lorry by Cyril on two orders by the workman, (b) that the workman had not noticed at first that the invoice he had in his hand indicated that these coils were of fifty yards and not of one hundred yards in length and (c) that the requisition for two hundred yards of cable brought to the workman by the electrician Karunaratne was supplied by coils of fifty yards each. Related to these facts but unexplained remains one vital point. Did the workman ask for only two coils separately twice, as he said he did and was given only four coils? If this was what actually happened then the loss of the two coils must have taken place at some place other than his table. But if Cyril delivered two coils first to Karunaratne and then four coils for the workman, as Cyril said he was instructed to do by the workman himself, then it is the workman who has to account for the two coils which were in excess of the requisition. Had Karunaratne been available to give evidence this point might have been clarified; but he was not available. And the evidence led at my inquiry did not establish beyond doubt that the workman issued

two coils extra to Karunaratne, which was the first charge against him, or that Karunaratne took two coils from the lorry and then four coils from the workman.

19. On the other hand, the conclusion that one can justifiably come to in this case is that the workman erred in delivering coils of cable before he as the person in charge of stores had taken them into the stores—the second charge against him. It was stated in evidence given by Cyril that sometimes it has happened that goods have been delivered from an in-coming consignment before they have been taken into stock. It was also urged by the Union that in the absence of a definite rule that in-coming goods should first be taken into the stores before any of it is issued it would not be fair to hold the stores clerk guilty of any deviation from such a rule. I do not agree with this view. It can be taken that there is always such a rule where goods are received into, left in custody in and issued from stores. But it is possible that, owing to urgent need of some article in the stores, there is some laxity in the strict observance of this rule. Nevertheless, if and when a serious consequence flows from such laxity, as it has happened in this instance, then the official in charge cannot escape responsibility. This is because he has in fact drawn out and issued articles which had not come into his custody and were therefore not his to issue.

20. The workman himself said in his evidence that this was the only occasion during his twenty-four years' service on which he had acted in this manner. It can be inferred from this that in his own opinion he had erred in this instance.

21. I hold therefore that the workman is guilty only under the second charge in the charge sheet dated 04.03.1976 issued to him by the Management—namely that he had irregularly issued coils of cable before taking charge of them. In view of this finding and my finding that the first charge against him has not been proved (para 18 above) it is necessary to alter the punishment imposed on him by the Management as a result of its finding that he was guilty of both charges. I consider that under the circumstances

the deferment of his increment for one year is unjustified and the consequent relief to be granted to the workman should be suspension of his increment for a year instead of the deferment of his increment for a year.

22. According to the details of the salary of the workman, given to me by the Management, the incremental rate applicable to the workman is Rs. 15 per month. The increment which fell due to him following the domestic inquiry against him and the punishment resulting therefrom was from June, 1976. It was this increment which was deferred for a year; the deferment would not have affected the grant of the annual increments falling due to him in June, 1977, and in June 1978. By reason of the conversion of the deferment into a suspension of the increment, indicated in the previous paragraph, the increment which fell due in June 1976, but was not paid should be restored to him. Consequently he has to be paid as arrears of salary Rs. 180 (Rs. 15 × 12 months) in respect of each of the years 1976-1977 and 1977-1978 and also at the rate of Rs. 15 per month from incremental date, June 1978, until the salary is regularised by the payment of the suspended increment. The sum payable to the workman will thus amount to Rs. 400 up to the end of September 1978 (Rs. 180 + 180 + 40).

23. My award in this dispute then is that the deferment of the workman Mr. H. A. T. Perera's increment for one year being held unjustifiable it should be replaced by the suspension of his increment for a year from June 1976. The respondent Company Messrs. Walker Sons & Co. Ltd., are hereby directed to pay Mr. H. A. T. Perera as arrears of salary Rs. 400 and to add to his present monthly salary from October 1978, the increment of Rs. 15. This payment of Rs. 400 should be made within fifteen working days of the publication of this award in the *Gazette of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka*.

AWARD

The Honourable the Minister of Labour by virtue of the powers vested in him by Section 4 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon (1956 Revised Edition), as amended by Acts, Nos. 14 of 1957, 62 of 1957, 4 of 1962 and 39 of 1968 (read with Industrial Disputes (Special Provisions) Act, No. 37 of 1968) has referred the aforesaid dispute to me for settlement by arbitration.

The matter in dispute between the aforesaid parties is whether the quantum of wages and other allowances paid to Mr. S. Hettiarachchi by Mr. A. S. M. Jeganathan, in respect of his services under him is justified and to what relief he is entitled.

This matter was taken up for inquiry on 2.8.1978 after having noticed the parties. On this day the Applicant was present in person. Neither the Employer nor any one on his behalf was present in Court. Therefore the case has to proceed ex parte.

According to the statement of the Applicant and what he stated in Court—he joined the services of the Employer in 1968 and worked under the brother of the Respondent as a Bull-dozer Driver. From January 1970 he worked under the Respondent up to July 1972. He has produced his salary particulars marked 'A' according to which the salary due to him for the period January 1970 to July 1972 was Rs. 5,774.75 and the batta for the period 19.7.71 to 25.3.1972 in respect of work done on behalf of the Company was Rs. 1,446.15 totalling in all to Rs. 7,220.90. He states that he was paid by the Respondent a sum of Rs. 2,425.00 and that less this sum of Rs. 2,425.00 out of the total sum of Rs. 7,220.90 due to him, there is now due and owing to him from the Respondent Employer a sum of Rs. 4,795.90 which amount the Respondent Employer has failed to pay.

I make award granting to the Applicant Rs. 4,795.90 being the amount due to the applicant from the Respondent Employer. This amount to be deposited by the Employer—Respondent in favour of the Applicant with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo North, Labour Secretariat, Colombo 5, within one month from the date of the publication of this Award in the *Gazette of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka*.

2. Licensees are required to produce all firearms before the Divisional Assistant Government Agents for their inspection together with the licence for 1979 or a certificate of loss of gun licence. No renewal will be effected if the firearms are not so produced.

3. Stamps are not accepted in payment of Gun Licence fees. When licences are lost, a certificate of loss of gun licence should be obtained from the Divisional Assistant Government Agent concerned on payment of One Rupee before renewal falls due. Licensees who fail to renew their licences on or before 31st December, 1978 will be liable to a penalty equal to the licence fee payable. The Divisional Assistant Government Agents will continue to renew licences till 31st March, 1979 on recovery of this penalty. Licensees who fail to get their licences renewed on or before 31st March, 1979 will be prosecuted.

4. If a firearm has become unserviceable it should be surrendered along with the licence for 1978 to the nearest Police Station or to the Kachcheri direct or through the Grama Sevaka, and a receipt obtained therefor before 31st December, 1979, otherwise the licensee will be required to obtain a licence for 1978 on payment of the usual charges.

5. The issue of licences for the year 1979 will be continued till 31st December, 1978 without recovery of any penalty.
