PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

W HEREAS by "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things provided that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the said Circuits into which the Island is divided for the purposes of the administration of justice for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Southern Circuit, twice at least at Galle, and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Galle on the 25th day of April and the 15th day of September, in every year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court should be holden at Matara, a place within the said Southern Circuit, in the said Ordinance mentioned:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby direct and appoint that a Sessions of the Supreme Court in its Criminal jurisdiction shall be holden at Matara on or about Monday, the Twenty-seventh day of May, One thousand Nine hundred and One.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Ninth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and One.

WHEREAS by section 2 of "The Small Towns Sanitary Ordinances, 1892 and 1900," it is enseted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be for that purpose published in the Government Gazette, to bring any town or village mentioned in the schedule thereto under the operation of the said Ordinances, and to define the limits of such town or village for the purposes of the said Ordinances:

And whereas it is expedient to bring the towns of Yatiyantota and Dehiowita in the Province of Sabaragamuwa, mentioned in the said schedule, under the operation of the said Ordinances:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the powers in us vested by the said section of the said Ordinances, do hereby as from and after the 15th day of May, 1901, bring the towns of Yativantota and Dehiowita aforesaid under the operation of the said Ordinances, and define the limits of the said towns for the purposes of the said Ordinances, to be those severally set out in the schedule hereto.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Seventh day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and One.

SCHEDULE.

Boundaries of the Yatiyantota sanitary town :-

Bounded on the North by the We-oya from its junction with the Kelani river to a point opposite the half milepost on the l'olatugama grant-in-aid road.

East.—A line drawn from the We-oya at right angles to the Polatugama road and through the half milepost to a point three chains to the south of it, thence running parallel to the Polatugama road to a point three chains from the Yatiyantota-Kitulgala road, and thence running parallel to the latter road till it meets the southern boundary.

West .- The Kelani river.

South.—A line drawn due east and west through the 42½ milepost on the Yatiyantota-Kitulgala road till it meets the east and west boundaries respectively.

Definition of the Dehiowita sanitary town :-

The town of Dehiowita includes an extent of three chains on either side of the high road leading from Atulugama to A'goda from the 351 milepost at Atulugama on the north to the southern boundary of Urupelewwa village on the south.
