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PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 3 of Ordinance No. 12 of 1894, intituled "An Ordinance to authorize the destruction of valueless Documents preserved in Courts of Justice," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in that behalf made, to bring any Court of Justice in the Island under the operation of the said Ordinance, and such Proclamation to amend, alter, or revoke as and whenever the Governor shall, with the like advice, determine :

And whereas it is expedient to bring the Police Court, the Court of Requests, and the District Court of Puttalam under the operation of the said Ordinance :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this our Proclamation bring the Police Court, the Court of Requests, and the District Court of Puttalam under the operation of the said Ordinance No. 12 of 1894, intituled "An Ordinance to authorize the

destruction of valueless Documents preserved in Courts of Justice," as from and after the 1st day of November, 1901.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twelfth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and One.
