MINUTE BY THE GOVERNOR.

THE following Minute by the Governor in supersession of the Minute dated September 21, 1900, is published for general information:—

It is hereby notified in accordance with instructions received from the Secretary of State that the privilege hitherto enjoyed by Officers of certain Departments under clause 24 of the Pension Minute of 11th December, 1892, of receiving an addition of 5-60ths of their salaries on retirement, provided they retire on pension before attaining the age of 55, is withdrawn in the case of all Officers appointed to the Public Works or Forest Department on or after the 1st January, 1901.

2. This privilege will in future be allowed to Officers of the Survey and Irrigation Departments only, specified in the schedule hereto annexed; but in the case of the Surveyor-General and Assistant Surveyor-General only when those Officers have been appointed in the course of departmental promotion, and not when they have been brought in from outside.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by the 19th section of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885," as amended by the 6th section of Ordinance No. 1 of 1892, it is enacted that whenever the following events have occurred, namely:—

- (a) The period fixed under section 7 of the said "Forest Ordinance, 1885," for preferring claims has elapsed, and all claims (if any) made within such period have been disposed of by the Forest Settlement Officer; and
- (b) If such claims have been made, the periods fixed for appealing from the orders passed on such claims have elapsed, and all appeals (if any) presented within such period have been disposed of by the Supreme Court; and
- (c) All lands (if any) to be included in the proposed forest which may be acquired under section 13 of the last-mentioned Ordinance have become vested in the Crown—the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, specify the limits

of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation:

And whereas all things necessary for declaring the forest hereunder mentioned to be a reserved forest have been fulfilled, and all times hereinbefore recited have elapsed, and it is expedient to specify the limits of such forest:

Now know all men that We, the said Governor, do by this Our Proclamation proclaim the forest, the limits of which are set forth in the schedule hereto subjoined, to be a reserved forest as from and after the 10th day of June, 1901.

And we do hereby further specify the limits of the said reserved forest to be those set forth in the said schedule.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Sixth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and One.

WHEREAS by section 4 of "The Toll Ordinance, 1896," it is enacted that, subject to the provisions and limitations in the said Ordinance contained, tolls shall be levied upon all horses, elephants, oxen, vehicles, and boats in respect of the roads, bridges, ferries, and canals specified in the several schedules to the said Ordinance annexed at such rates as the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, shall be pleased to appoint, provided that the same shall in no case exceed the rates thereinafter specified:

And whereas by section 9 of the said Ordinance it is enacted that the Legislative Council may, by means of any resolution duly passed at any public session of the said Council, establish tolls in respect of any public road, bridge, ferry, or canal in this Island in addition to the tolls set out in the second schedule thereto annexed, and the provisions of the said Ordinance shall apply to the tolls so established as fully and effectually as if such tolls had been enumerated in the said schedules or in some or one of them:

And whereas the Legislative Council at the public session thereof held on the Eleventh day of April, 1901, by a resolution established a ferry toll over the Kelani river at Mapitigama in the District of Kegalla, Province of Sabaragamuwa:

And whereas it is expedient to appoint the rates at which the said toll so established over the said river shall be levied:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf on us conferred as aforesaid, do hereby appoint that the rates at which the toll so established over the Kelani river at Mapitigama, in the District of Kegalla, Province of Sabaragamuwa, shall be in accordance with those set out in the schedule hereto.
