GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE attention of Medical Practitioners and others is invited to the following extract from the Regulations of March 16, 1898, published under the provisions of "The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance" (No. 3 of 1897) in *Gazette* No. 5,541 of March 25, 1898:—

Section 26.

Any medical practitioner, or person professing to treat disease, attending any person diseased with plague, cholera, or smallpox, shall within three hours of such attendance give information in writing to the proper authority, stating the name of the diseased person, his residence, and the nature of the disease.

The proper authorities under the above regulations are:—

In the case of a Municipality, the Chairman of the Municipal Council;

In the case of a Local Board, the Chairman of the Local Board;

Where there is no Municipality or Local Board, the Government Agent of the Province, Assistant Agent of the District, Police Magistrate or Colonial Surgeon, or the Chief Medical Officer of the station.
