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MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, November 17, 1900, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated November 12, 1900.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; E. Beven, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.; Dr. J. Craib.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on October 20 were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1899 to October 31 on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of October.

Resolved,—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during October and register.

The Chairman undertook to inspect the several laundries with the Health Officer.

4. Read letter No. 96, dated October 23, from the Government Agent, submitting an offer of Rs. 3,112 for the Peradeniya and Eriyagama road tolls for 1901. The papers had been circulated, and in accordance with recorded opinion of Members the offer had been accepted.

Resolved,—That acceptance of the offer be confirmed.

5. Read letter No. 100, dated November 6, from the Government Agent, submitting an offer of Rs. 10,020 for the Katugastota bridge and road toll for 1901.

Resolved,—That the offer be accepted.

6. The Chairman laid on the table a petition, received this day from inhabitants of Mavilmada, Siyambalgastenna, and other villages, within Municipal limits, complaining of the imposition of a police and lighting rate.

Resolved,—That the petition be circulated.

7. Read petition from Mr. W. E. Weerasingha, applying for three months full pay leave on retiring on pension, as was granted to Mr. Poulter.

Resolved,—That the application be refused.

8. Petition dated October 16, from members of the Municipal clerical staff and other employes of the Municipal Council, asking that they may have the medical services of the Health Officer in cases of illness, submitted at last Meeting, was laid on the table, together with a copy of the Government Circular No. 77 of July 23, 1888,

annexing a scale of charges for medical attendance on public servants drawing salaries of less than Rs. 3,000 per annum at stations other than Colombo, Kandy, Galle, and Jaffna.

Resolved,—That the papers be referred to the Standing Committee for consideration.

9. Read report by Chairman on petition from residents of a portion of Katugastota road, Nos. 6 to 38, who were noticed to close the cesspits on their several premises and to introduce the dry-earth system.

Resolved,—That the petitioners be informed, in reply, that the existing cesspits must be closed, and that owners must make the necessary arrangement for dry-earth closets at each house, unless they agree to have one or more latrines on the dry-earth system common to several premises.

10. Read report by Chairman on petition from residents in portions of Colombo street and Castle Hill street, who were noticed to close the cesspits on their several premises and to introduce the dry-earth system.

The Chairman's recommendation that a strip of land be acquired to form a passage along the back of the premises was approved of, and it was resolved that application be made to Government for a survey of the land necessary, prior to its being acquired.

11. Draft by-laws, submitted by the Standing Committee to provide for the keeping of supplies of dry earth, &c., on premises where cesspits have been closed, were submitted.

Proposed by Chairman, seconded by Mr. Beven,—That the by-laws be adopted and forwarded to His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council to be confirmed.

Resolved,—That the by-laws be included under chapter XIII. of Ordinance No. 19 of 1896, and numbered 1a, 1b, 1c, 1d, 1e, and 1f. (Appendix A.)

12. The recommendation by the Special Committee appointed to consider questions connected with water supply, that the amendments proposed by Mr. Beven of by-laws 20 and 21, chapter XII. of Ordinance No. 19 of 1896, a copy of which had been sent to each Member, was submitted.

On motion of Mr. Vanderwall it was resolved that consideration of the proposed amendments of by-laws remain over for next Meeting.

13. Read recommendation of the Special Committee appointed to consider questions connected with water supply, that meters be fixed, under by-law 20, chapter XII. of Ordinance No. 19 of 1896, on the following premises: Colombo street, Nos. 30, 33, 38, 181, and 221.

Resolved,—That the recommendation be adopted and meters fixed on the usual conditions.

14. With leave of Council Mr. Beven's motion—that an additional by-law, 21a to chapter XII. of Ordinance No. 19 of 1896, be added—was deferred to next Meeting to be considered with the draft by-laws under same chapter of the Ordinance proposed by the Special Committee.

15. In accordance with notice Mr. Vanderwall asked whether the condition on which the pork butcher obtained his license requiring him to slaughter only stall-fed pigs is being enforced.

Reply.—Pigs are slaughtered on estates and brought into town, or live pigs are brought and stilled here and subsequently slaughtered. This privilege was allowed by the late Health Officer.

16. In accordance with notice Mr. Vanderwall asked whether an efficient check is being exercised by the Inspectors who are on duty at the market in respect of tickets issued to sellers of vegetables other than stall holders who occupy spaces in and out of the verandahs, and the recovery of daily fees from these persons.

Instructions given some time back to the Inspectors on duty at the market were to ascertain what stalls and places were occupied daily, and to report in their diaries. Three of the Inspectors discontinued this practice in May last, Mr. Senanayake alone continuing it up to date.

17. In pursuance of notice Mr. Vanderwall asked whether the Chairman's order exempting from seizure unmuzzled dogs wearing Municipal collars has been communicated to the Police authorities, and whether the seizure of any dogs on Sundays is to be continued.

The Chairman promised to communicate with the Police authorities on the subject.

18. In pursuance of notice Mr. Vanderwall moved for a return showing the income derived from the sellers of vegetables other than stall holders who occupy spaces in and out of the market verandahs from January 1, 1899.

19. Considered recommendation by the Health Officer that the cesspits on following premises be closed and dry-earth closets substituted:—

Cesspits common to premises Nos. 127 and 128, Trincomalee street, and Nos. 34 and 35, Lady Torrington's road; cesspits on premises Nos. 135, 136, 376A to E, 377A to E, Trincomalee street; No. 55, King street; No. 147, Colombo street; No. 47, Peradeniya road.

Resolved,—That special authority be granted to the Chairman, in accordance with section 209 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, as amended by section 33 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, to require the owners of the several premises named to empty and close the cesspits on the said premises and to substitute dry-earth closets therefor.

APPENDIX A.

Keeping supply of Dry Earth, &c., in Dry-earth Closets.

Chapter XIII. of Ordinance No. 19 of 1896.

1a. The owner of every house or premises on which there is a dry-earth closet shall furnish the earth closet with a receptacle of suitable construction and of adequate capacity for dry earth or some other deodorising substance, and he shall construct, fix, or place such receptacle in such manner as to admit of ready access to such receptacle for the purpose of depositing therein the necessary supply of dry earth or other deodorising substance.

1b. Every owner of every house or premises on which there is a dry-earth closet shall cause every earth closet and every receptacle for night soil provided or used in connection with such earth closet, and also the receptacle for keeping a supply of dry earth, to be maintained at all times in good order and in a sanitary condition.

1c. The lessee or occupier of every premises, and in case of alleys the owner or lessee, on which there is a dry-earth closet shall provide or cause to be provided a sufficient quantity of dry earth, together with a scoop or implement for applying the same, to be kept in the receptacle provided for the same.

1d. The lessee or occupier, and in case of alleys the owner of any premises, on which there is a dry-earth closet shall provide a sufficient quantity of disinfectants, to be kept in a suitable vessel, should the Health Officer deem it necessary and direct him to do so.

1e. The owner or lessee of every alley shall apply or cause to be applied frequently and effectually dry earth and disinfectants in each closet on such premises.

1f. The owner of every house or premises on which there is a dry-earth closet shall furnish the necessary buckets in the proportion of one bucket for every twelve adult occupants or residents (two children under ten years of age to be taken as one adult) in the said premises, and maintain the said bucket in good and sound order.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of October, 1900.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to submit my report for the month of October.

Scavenging.—The town and suburbs within Municipal limits were kept particularly clean and the scavenging was satisfactory.

Drains.—The superficial side drains were clean and well kept, but the deep barrel drains continue to be in an unsatisfactory and insanitary condition.

Alleys.—In a fairly satisfactory state, but capable of improvement, so far as accommodation and ventilation are concerned.

Markets.—Satisfactory and well kept.

Food Supply.—Sufficient and of good quality. 421 cattle, 143 buffaloes, and 309 sheep and goats were slaughtered or the food of man. All the animals were healthy and fit for food.

Water Supply.—Ample and of good quality.

Bakeries.—Clean and well kept.

Laundries.—In good order.

Cooly Lines.—In the same condition as when last reported upon.

Boutiques.—In good order, and the articles exposed in them for sale were of good quality and fit for food.

Dairies.—Clean and well kept.

General Health.—The health of the town was exceptionally good.
