MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, December 15, 1900, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated December 10, 1900.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.; Dr. J. Craib; C. M. Fernando, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on November 17 were taken as read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1899 to November 30 on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of November.

Resolved,—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during November and register.

The Chairman stated that he had inspected with the Health Officer a number of laundries, had condemned eight, and had ordered notices to issue in respect of others for improvement of premises and provision of latrine accommodation.

4. The following correspondence was submitted and read:—

(a) Letter dated December 10, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copies of Plague Regulations.

(b) Letter No. 24, dated December 13, from the Colonial Secretary, stating that the additional by-laws under chapter XIII. of the Ordinance No. 19 of 1896, forwarded with Chairman's letter No. 55 of November 26, had been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

(c) Letter dated December 12, from Dr. Anderson Smith, thanking the Chairman and Members for his appointment as Health Officer.

5. Petition from K. Suppiah, Scavenging Contractor, praying that he be paid an extra rate for coolies and carts working at Katugastota on occasion of the recent outbreak of cholera, instead of on schedule rates as has been paid him.

Resolved,—That the claim for extra payment be rejected.

6. Considered petition from residents of Mawilmada, Siyambalagastenna, Watapuluwa, Aruppola, and other villages, all within the old limits, objecting to the recovery of the consolidated rate on their premises.

The petition had been circulated and seen by all the Members.

Proposed by Mr. Fernando, seconded by Mr. Vanderwall, —That the petition be referred to a Special Committee for report as to whether the Council should approach Government with a view to the re-arrangement of the limits of the Municipality of Kandy.

7. Recommendation of the Special Committee appointed to consider questions connected with water supply, that the proposed by-laws be adopted in lieu of by-laws 20 and 21, chapter XII., No. 19 of 1896, was submitted:—

20. It shall be lawful for the Council to fix a meter on the pipe for private supply of water to every house or premises, and the owner or occupier shall be liable to pay at such rates as may from time to time be determined by the Council for all water shown by the meter to have been consumed in excess of two thousand gallons for every rupee of water-rate assessed in respect of such house or premises. It shall be lawful for the Council to agree with any person to supply water for other than domestic purposes on such terms and subject to such conditions as to the Council shall seem fit.

The Council shall, however, have the right to suspend by resolution the operation of this by-law, so far as it relates to the charges herein authorized to be made when the supply of water in the reservoir justifies such a course.

21. The Council shall provide and fix all meters, and may charge for the use of any such meter such rent as the Council may deem reasonable, but no such rent shall be charged if the consumption of water shall not be in excess of the allowance mentioned in the preceding by-law.

Proposed by Mr. Beven, seconded by Dr. Craib,—That the recommendation of the Special Committee be adopted.

The motion was opposed by Messrs. Fernando, Sproule, and Vanderwall.

Minutes of Proceedings of an Adjourned Meeting of the Municipal Council held in the Town Hall, on Wednesday, December 19, at 4 o'clock p.m., in accordance with Notice dated the 15th instant.

1. In accordance with notice the following motion to provide for amounts due for use of water in excess of allowance was brought forward by Mr. Beven :—That chapter XII. of the by-laws of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 19 of 1896, be amended by adding after section 21, the following :—

21A. The amount recoverable under the foregoing section shall be recovered in the manner provided by sections 281 and 282 of "The Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1887."

The motion on being put to the Meeting, was carried, and it was resolved that the amended by-law be forwarded for purposes of being confirmed by His Excellency the Governor in the Executive Council.

2. Read reports by the Health Officer and recommendations that the cesspits on the following premises be closed and dry-earth closets substituted :—

Nos. 162 and 163, Trincomalee street.
Nos. 35, 36 a, b, c, No. 37, Katugastota road.
No. 211, Trincomalee street.

Resolved,—That the Chairman be specially authorized to issue the necessary notices.

3. In accordance with notice Mr. Vanderwall proposed,—That tenders be invited for renting the open spaces in and out of the market verandahs now used by sellers of vegetables.

This was seconded by Mr. Beven, and after a short discussion on being put to the Meeting agreed to.

4. Read application by Mr. P. F. Toussaint, Chief Inspector, for an increase of salary.

II.—The items in the Budget for 1901, prepared by the Standing Committee, and of which a copy had been sent to each Member, were then carefully gone through.

General Revenue (No. 1 Account).—Under head Licenses : (*Opium*) the amount was increased to Rs. 7,050, the amount realized at the recent sale.

Lake Silt.—The amount of proposed expenditure was increased to Rs. 1,800.

Office Charges.—The amount for audit was reduced to Rs. 500 ; and it was resolved that Mr. J. W. Mottau be appointed Auditor for 1901, subject to approval of Government.

Public Works : Schedule A.—The amount was increased by Rs. 3,220·97, bringing the total up to Rs. 23,709·88. Estimated cost of a set of cooly lines to be constructed at Mahaiyawa in order that the lines on Castle Hill may be cleared away and the ground laid out as a public garden :—

III.—*Consolidated Account* (Police and Lighting).—The Chairman pointed out the necessity for increasing the rate to meet expenditure and provide extra lamps and additional police within the area assessed, the expenditure having been increased by cost of new electric lighting.

The Budget, as submitted by the Standing Committee, showed a probable deficit of Rs. 8,926 on the year's working.

The Council had been working on a pervious credit balance, but this at the end of the year was estimated to be Rs. 5,322·66 only—a sum insufficient to meet the estimated deficit of next year.

A discussion followed on the reason for increasing the rate.

It was proposed by Mr. Gibbon,—That the rate for 1901 be fixed at 6 per cent., being an increase of 1 per cent. on the present rate.

This would bring in a sum of Rs. 5,827·32, which, with the balance at the end of the year, would cover the estimated deficit of next year.

Resolved,—That the vote for purchase of furniture for the Hermitage be increased to Rs. 1,000, the actual cost of purchase and transport.

With this amendment the other items were approved of.

2. The Council then resumed.

Proposed by Mr. Beven, seconded by Mr. Sproule,—That the following rates and taxes to be levied in 1901 be adopted. (Appendix A.)

On being put to the meeting this was carried.

Proposed by Mr. Vanderwall, seconded by Mr. Jonklaas,—That the Budget for 1901, as amended, be adopted as follows. (Appendix B.)

On being put to the Meeting the Chairman declared the motion carried.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of November, 1900.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town has been satisfactorily carried out during the month. Carts not allowed about Victoria drive after 4 P.M.

Drainage.—Surface drains in fairly good condition; those from end of Trincomalee street to No. 46, Katugastota road, should be cemented. Deep drains in many places are in a very insanitary condition; these have been reported upon.

Water Supply.—Good.

Alleys.—Most of the alleys are overcrowded, badly ventilated, and some in a filthy condition, particularly Nos. 90, 91, Brownrigg street, and Nos. 113 and 155, Colombo street; these have been reported upon, but nothing has been done.

Dairies.—Fairly well kept.

Bakeries.—These have all been inspected by myself and Inspectors, and with the exception of No. 36, Trincomalee street, and No. 865, Peradeniya road (both these cases were fined), all fairly well kept.

Public Market.—Well kept. The holes in the traps in the drainways round the market are not sufficiently large to take off heavy rains. It is a great pity that stalls composed of bits of boxes and old rag cannot be done away with.

Food Supply.—Inspected daily. Good number of cattle slaughtered. Cattle 418, buffaloes 93, sheep 74, goats 167. At first I had the greatest difficulty in getting the butchers to bring even fair cattle. The cattle are better now.

Boutiques.—Fairly well kept. Fish boutiques, with the exception of Nos. 62 to 69 and 102, Colombo street, well kept.

Slaughter House and Cattle Inspection Shed.—Well kept.

Public Latrines.—Well kept.

Private Latrines.—Not sufficient dry-earth used, and in many none at all.

Cooly Lines.—Permanent lines, good; temporary ones, most unsatisfactory, and should be done away with.

Night Soil Depot.—Kept in a sanitary a condition as possible, but, as I have suggested, pits should be used at the top of the hill, not at the bottom, during the wet season.

General Health.—Good. A few cases of chickenpox and fever reported and seen by me.
