MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, February 16, 1901, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated February 12.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; E. Beven, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.; C. M. Fernando, Esq.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on January 19 and of a Special Meeting on January 30 were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.
- 2. The following documents were submitted:—Statement of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1960 to January 31, 1901, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of January.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

- 3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during January and register.
- The Chairman informed the Council that he had received information that Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York will arrive at Kandy on April 12 and will leave Kandy on April 16 next, and desired the Special Committee appointed to consider arrangements for their reception to meet at the Kachcheri at 4 P.M. on 18th instant.
- 5. Read letter dated January 1, from Mr. J. Guthrie, Auditor, reporting that he had audited the accounts to November 30 and found the same in order.
 - The following correspondence was submitted and read:—
 - (a) Letter No. 4, dated January 29, from the Colonial Secretary, intimating the approval by His Excellency the Governor of the grant of a pension to Mr. W. E. Weerasinghe.
 (b) Letter No. 5, dated February 4, from the Colonial Secretary, respecting reports on petitions from inhabitants at Ampitia, complaining against the extension of Municipal limits.
 (c) Letter No. 6, dated February 7, from the Colonial Secretary, stating that His Excellency the Governor highly appreciates the expressions of sympathy contained in Chairman's letter of February 1.
 (d) Letter No. 7, dated February 11, from the Colonial Secretary, intimating the nomination of Mr. J. Mottan to audit the accounts of the Kandy Municipality for 1901

 - Mottau, to audit the accounts of the Kandy Municipality for 1901.
- 7. Mr. Beven, in accordance with notice, asked—With reference to the statement in paragraph 16 of the Chairman's protest read to the Council at its last Meeting, that since July, 1897, the allowance of water has been doubled to private services, by what authority this has been done in the absence of a by-law?

Reply.—The increased allowance took effect in 1900, under authority of by-law 20, chapter XII. of Ordinance No. 19 of 1896, adopted by the Council on December 16, 1899, and confirmed by His Excellency the Governor in Council by Proclamation dated 21st March, 1900.

- With leave of the Council Mr. Fernando, in view of the Colonial Secretary's letter No. 7 of February 11 withdrew his question of which he had given notice respecting appointment of an auditor.
 - 9. In pursuance of notice Mr. Fernando asked :-
 - (a) If water from the street taps is still used for flushing streets.

Reply.—Three carts filled from standposts; one from lake.

- (b) Why street lamps Nos. 164, 165, 166, 167, 168, 169, and 170 were not lighted on the 11th instant at7 P.M.? Reply.—The Resident Engineer, Gas and Water Company, reports that all these lamps were lighted on night of 11th instant. The Municipal Inspector reports that they were lighted when he visited the road.
- 10. In accordance with notice it was moved by Mr. Fernando—That the Attorney-General's opinion be obtained as to the legality of levying Municipal rates in respect of lands situated within the newly extended limits of the Municipality, and that the said rates be not levied pending the receipt of the Attorney-General's opinion.

 Mr. Vanderwall seconded.

The motion was opposed by Mr. Beven.

On being put to the Meeting the following votes were recorded:-

Ayes. Mr. Fernando. Mr. Vanderwall.

Noes. Mr. Creasy. Mr. Beven. The Chairman.

Ayes, 2; Noes, 3. The Chairman declared the motion lost.

11. Considered recommendation by the Health Officer, that the following cesspits be closed and dry-earth closets substituted :-

Cesspit common to premises Nos. 165 A to c, 166, and 167, Trincomalee street, owned by L. Ahamadu Tamby; Nos. 968 to 978, Peradeniya road.

Resolved,—That special authority be granted to the Chairman, in accordance with section 209 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887," as amended by section 33 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, to require the owner of the several premises named to empty and close the cesspit on the said premises and to substitute dry-earth closets therefor.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of January, 1901.

Water Supply .- Good and sufficient.

Food Supply.—Good. Cattle examined and slanghtered this month: cattle 446, buffaloes 91, goats 222, sheep 128.

Alleys.—Most of the alleys in the town have been kept in a better sanitary condition. Nos. 90-91, Brownrigg street, which was one of the worst: the compound has been paved and cemented, but still on my last visit (a few days ago) it was filthy; to light, ventilate, and make any of the alleys what they should be would mean a personal supervision of each alley and each house in that alley (as most are of a different construction) whilst the improvement in ventilating, lighting, &c., is actually being carried on. Better still, pull them down and build alleys, and poor people can live in and my Inspectors can keep clean.

Drains.—In much the same condition as last month and before. One of the most particularly filthy—just outside the Queen's Hotel—has been improved, but even now it is not what it should be. The above and the drain opposite the Police Courts have been reported months ago.

Laundries.—Most of these have been as well kept as their accommodation and surroundings will allow. Nos. 407, 200, 229, 228, Peradeniya road, and 137 E, s, and v, Trincomalee street, are not fit for laundries, and should be closed.

Dairies.-Fairly well kept.

Bakeries .- Frequent inspections are made. Fairly well kept.

Market.—In the earlier part of the month not well kept; showed a great lack of supervision. The market-keeper was spoken to and now quite understands that he is responsible for the cleanliness of his charge.

Slaughter House.-Well kept.

Inspection Shed .- Well kept.

Scavenging.—Not very satisfactory, but this has been reported upon.

Removal of Night Soil has been carried out in a sanitary manner.

Cooly Lines.—Just as they were last month; permanent ones were good. Temporary lines should be pulled down and replaced by permanent buildings.

. Dry Fish Boutiques.—Fairly well kept now. On January 17 six were fined for selling bad fish, viz., Nos. 62, 64, 65, 67, 68, and 78, Colombo street.

Latrines .- Well kept.

- 9. In accordance with notice Mr. Sproule asked the following questions: -
 - (1) What is the number of police constables on beat in Katukelle during day and at night?
 - (2) Is the Katukelle district divided into sectional "beats"? if so, how many sectional beats are there in that district? and how many constables are told off to duty on each such sectional beat by day and by night?

Replies.—Two constables on duty during day and night. Supervised by a section sergeant. In addition two policemen on patrol at night between 10 P.M. and 5 A.M.

Beats are divided as follows :--

- No. 1, from Post Office to junction of Halloluwa road.
- No. 2, from Halloluwa road junction to Mulgampola.
- 10. In pursuance of notice Mr. Sproule moved,—That, in view of the fact that serious hardship is entailed upon, and much dissatisfaction exists amongst, the rate-payers resident therein, as respects the defective police supervision in Katukelle, steps be taken by the Council to increase and strengthen effective police surveillance in the district included.

This was seconded by Mr. Jonklaas.

The Chairman pointed out that the assertions quoted by Mr. Sproule of neglect by the police were unsupported by any fact or cases, but promised to make further inquiry.

With consent of his seconder Mr. Sproule withdrew his motion for the present.
