MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, April 20, 1901, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with notice dated April 16.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.; and Dr. J. Craib.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on March 30 were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.
- 2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1900 to March 31, 1901, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of March.

Resolved,—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of March, 1901.

Water Supply.-Good and sufficient.

Alleys .- Much as they were.

Drains.—In much the same condition as last month.

Laundries.—Fairly well kept; those, viz., Nos. 407, 230, 229, 228, Peradeniya road, are still open in spite of notices having been served on them to close as unfit for the purpose; further steps have now been taken to enforce their closing.

Dairies .- Fairly well kept.

Bakeries .- Fairly well kept.

Market.—After almost constant supervision by myself, better kept. Various food supplies. Good cattle passed this month: cattle, 417; buffaloes, 75; sheep, 116; and goats, 216.
