## VITAL STATISTICS OF CEYLON.

### REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE THIRD QUARTER OF 1900.

#### I.—Population.

1. The estimated population of the Island on the last day of the quarter was 3,579,528, an increase of 31,071 on the previous quarter, due to an excess of 4,092 births over deaths and of 26,979 arrivals compared with departures of Indian coolies. Table I. in the appendix gives the area of each Province and district of the Island with its estimated population and the number of births, marriages, and deaths registered in the quarter.

2. *Arrivals and Departures of Indian Coolies.*—The number of Indian coolies who arrived in the Island (52,967) was 48 per cent. higher than the average for the corresponding quarter during the last five years (35,711), while the number of departures (25,988) was 14 per cent. above the average (22,805). The excess of arrivals over departures was 26,979, while the corresponding period of 1895 to 1899 showed an average excess of 12,906 of arrivals over departures.

#### III.—Marriages.

3. *Marriages.*—The marriages registered during the quarter numbered 7,071, of which 4,588 were general (*i.e.*, other than Kandyan or Mohammedan) marriages and 2,483 Kandyan marriages.

4. Table VI. in the appendix shows the marriages solemnized in the general community in each Province and district of the Island, the civil condition, nationality, the highest, lowest, and mean ages of the parties, the mode of solemnization, the number of bridegrooms and brides who were unable to sign their names in the register, &c.

Table VII. gives similar information in respect of Kandyan marriages.

5. *First Marriages; Re-marriages.*—Of the 4,588 general marriages, 4,019 (equal to 87 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 375 between widowers and spinsters, 111 between bachelors and widows, 76 between widowers and widows, 3 between bachelors and divorced women, 2 between divorced men and spinsters, 1 between a divorced man and a divorced woman, and 1 between a widower and a divorced woman. Of the 2,483 Kandyan marriages, 1,916 (equal to 77 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 236 between widowers and spinsters, 141 between widowers and widows, 107 between bachelors and widows, 36 between divorced men and spinsters, 26 between bachelors and divorced women, 13 between divorced men and divorced women, 5 between widowers and divorced women, and 3 between divorced men and widows.

6. *Age at Marriage.*—The mean age at marriage for the general community was 27·1 for males and 20·7 for females, and for Kandyans 28·2 for males and 20·6 for females.

7. *Minors.*—In the general community 5 per cent. of the bridegrooms and 52 per cent. of the brides and among the Kandyans 12 per cent. of the bridegrooms and 61 per cent. of the brides were under 21 years of age.

8. *Mixed Marriages.*—There were 33 mixed marriages during the quarter: 2 between Europeans and Burghers, 7 between Burghers and Sinhalese, 16 between Sinhalese and Tamils, and 8 other mixed marriages.

9. *Signatures in Marriage Register.*—Of the 9,176 persons married among the general community, 1,124 men and 3,516 women signed the register with marks; that is to say, 75 per cent. of the men and 23 per cent. of the women were able to write their names. Of the 4,966 persons married among the Kandyans, 671 men and 2,354 women signed the register with marks; *i.e.*, 73 per cent. of the men and 5 per cent. of the women were able to write their names.

#### III.—Births and Deaths.

10. *Births.*—The births registered numbered 30,242 (39 Europeans, 148 Burghers, 21,158 Sinhalese, 6,794 Tamils, 1,994 Moors, 76 Malays, and 38 others), and were in the proportion of 37·3 to 1,000 persons living as against 33·5, the average of the corresponding period in the ten years 1890–99, and 36·9, the rate in the third quarter of 1899.

11. *Deaths.*—The deaths registered amounted to 26,150 (including 46 Europeans, 152 Burghers, 17,033 Sinhalese, 7,029 Tamils, 1,730 Moors, 92 Malays, and 68 others), and corresponded to an annual rate of 32·3 per 1,000 as against 26·5, the average rate for the corresponding period during the last ten years, and 28·6, the rate in the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

12. The births and deaths and their rates are compared in the following table with the results obtained during the previous quarter, the third quarter of the past year, and the average rate for the third quarter in the ten years 1890 to 1899:—

13. The birth-rate for the quarter (37·3) rose 3·8 per 1,000 over the average for the corresponding quarter of the last ten years (33·5), while the death-rate (32·3) shows a rise of 5·8 per 1,000 above the average for the third quarters during the decade 1890-99 (26·5).

14. Table II. in the appendix gives information similar to that given in Table A in respect of each Province and district in the Island; Table I. gives the births and deaths according to sex; Table VIII. the births according to nationality and sex; Table IX. the deaths for each month of the quarter according to nationality for each Province and district. The causes of deaths for each district are shown in Table X.; the causes of deaths on estates in the Central, Uva, and Sabaragamuwa Provinces, and in the Colombo and Kalutara Districts of the Western Province being shown in Table XI.; and for the town of Colombo (according to wards and nationalities) in Table XII.; and Table XIII. shows the period of life at which the deaths of the various races occurred in each district.

15. *Sex.*—Of the total number of births (30,242), 15,661 were males and 14,581 were females, i.e., 107 males to 100 females. Of the total number of deaths (26,150), 13,170 were males and 12,980 were females. Out of equal numbers living of each sex, there died 898 males to 1,000 females.

16. Deaths of infants under one year of age numbered 5,872, and were in the proportion of 194 to 1,000 births registered. The rate of infant mortality varied in different districts as follows: 306 (for Moors) and 291 (for Sinhalese) in Puttalam, 260 (for Sinhalese) in Kurunegala, 248 (for Tamils) in Trincomalee, 247 (for Tamils) in Mannar, 245 (for Sinhalese) in Matale, 242 (for Tamils) in Batticaloa, 148 (for Sinhalese) in Negombo and Nuwara Eliya, 147 (for Sinhalese) in Colombo and Matara and (for Tamils) in Jaffna, 142 (for Sinhalese) in Chilaw, 135 (for Tamils) in Mullaittivu, 127 (for Sinhalese) in Kalutara, and 84 (for Moors) in Batticaloa.

17. *Centenarians.*—Fifty-seven deaths (25 males and 32 females) were reported to be of centenarians, but the ages reported cannot be relied on.

#### IV.—State of Public Health.

18. The general health of the population during the quarter was worse than usual, the death-rate being 32·3 per 1,000 of the population as against 26·5, the average rate for the corresponding quarter during the decade 1890-99, but as compared with the rate of the previous quarter (29·9) the increased mortality was only 2·4 per 1,000 of the population. The increase in the death-rate was due to improved registration and to an unusual outbreak of fever in the North-Western Province and to an outbreak of choleraic diarrhoea in the Central Province.

19. Tables III., IV., and V. in the appendix show the births and deaths, the birth-rates and the death-rates for all ages in the several Provinces and districts of the Island, and in the revenue subdivisions of those districts for the quarter under review, for the preceding quarter, and for the corresponding quarter of the previous year, and the average rate for the corresponding period in the last nine years 1891-99. The rates shown are for the Sinhalese only in the districts which are mainly inhabited by the Sinhalese, and for Tamils only where Tamils form the bulk of the population. In the Puttalam District, where the Sinhalese and Mohammedans are found in almost equal numbers, and in the Batticaloa District, which is inhabited almost in equal numbers by Tamils and Mohammedans, the rates are given for the different sections of the population.

20. The healthiest Province during the quarter was the Northern with a death-rate of 21·5, closely followed by the Western, which had a death-rate of 22·6. The healthiest district was Kalutara (21·0), the healthiest subdivision having been Nuwara Eliya Local Board and outside (14·6), Uda Bulatgama (15·9), Siyane korale (16·0), and Hewagam korale (16·9).

21. *Western Province.*—During the quarter the Western Province was not as healthy as usual, the Sinhalese mortality per mille having been 22·6 against 18·4, the average for the quarter in the years 1891-99, and 21·8, the rate for the second quarter of 1900. The mortality among infants under one year of age, which is generally considered a true test of the health of a population, was in this Province in the proportion of 142 to a thousand births registered.

22. In the Colombo District the death-rate rose to 22·5 from the average 18·1 per mille. Of subdivisions only Hewagam korale (16·9) showed an improvement in the health of its population, the other subdivisions showing enhanced death-rates. The unhealthiest subdivision, as usual, was the Colombo Municipality with a death-rate of 43·1. This division is treated of at greater length in chapter VII.

23. The death-rate in the Negombo District rose to 25·3 per 1,000 from the average 18·4, but showed a slight improvement as compared with the rate for the previous quarter (26·7). The healthiest subdivision in the district during the quarter was Alutkuru korale north with a death-rate of 20·7, and the unhealthiest Negombo Local Board with a death-rate 63·7.

24. The death-rate in the Kalutara District also rose to 21·0 from the average 18·8. All its subdivisions shared in the deterioration. The unhealthiest subdivision was the Kalutara Local Board with a death-rate of 26·7 per mille. Among the Tamils the death-rate was 46·5 as against an average of 49·5.

25. *Central Province.*—The mortality among the Sinhalese in this Province was 38·0 per mille as against the average 30·9, the Kandy district having been mainly responsible for the increased rate of mortality.

In the Kandy District the Sinhalese death-rate rose to 40·1 from an average of 29·1, while among the estate Tamil population of the district (numbering over 110,000) the deaths were in the proportion of 46·7 to a thousand, as against the average 32·3.

26. Seven out of its ten subdivisions showed increased death-rates, especially the Kandy Municipality, where the mortality rate (61·1) more than doubled the average (27·4). The only districts which showed an improvement were Uda Bulatgama, Uduunuwa, and Yatinuwara. Uda Bulatgama was the healthiest subdivision in the district and one of the healthiest in the Island with a death-rate of 15·9 against the average 17·3.

27. The Matale District enjoyed normal health during the quarter, the Sinhalese death-rate having been 40·5 as against the average 40·4. Three out of its four subdivisions showed slightly increased death-rates, the unhealthiest having been Matale east (49·8). In Matale north, the healthiest division in the district, the mortality rate diminished to 28·6 from the average 39·1. The death-rate among the estate Tamil population was 73·5 against the average 36·9.

28. In Nuwara Eliya District also the health of the Sinhalese population was normal, the death-rate for the quarter (27·0) being almost equal to the average (26·6). All its subdivisions showed diminished death-rates except Uda Hewaheta, where the mortality increased to 29·0 from an average of 25·1 per 1,000. The lowest death-rate was in the town of Nuwara Eliya (14·6). The Sinhalese population in this district numbers over 44,000. The bulk of the population is Tamil and resident on the estates, numbering over 7,000. Their health was better than usual, the death-rate being 18·5 as against an average of 28·6.

29. *Northern Province.*—This Province, which is estimated to contain about 325,000 Tamils, maintained its normal health during the quarter, the death-rate being 21·5 as against the average 21·1.

30. In the Jaffna District, which contains about 300,000 of the population, the death-rate was 19·8 per 1,000 as against the average for the last nine years 19·6. Seven of its subdivisions showed enhanced death-rates, the unhealthiest having been Vadamaradchi east (35·0). Valikamam west, Karaichchi, and Punakari showed improved rates, the healthiest subdivision was Vadamaradchi west (14·7), barring Karaichchi (9·6), which is a sparsely populated division and hardly suitable for purposes of comparison.

31. The death-rate in the Mannar District rose to 42·0 from the average 33·6. All its subdivisions shared in the deterioration, the unhealthiest having been the Mantai division with a mortality rate of 50·4 against the average 34·9.

32. The mortality (40·1) in the Mullaittivu District also showed a slight increase above the average (39·1). All its subdivisions also showed an increased mortality, the unhealthiest having been Melpattu with a death-rate of 47·3.

33. *Southern Province.*—The Southern Province, which, next to the Western Province, contains the largest Sinhalese population, showed an increased mortality rate compared with the average. The death-rate recorded for the Sinhalese (28·4) was higher than the average (24·9) by about 4 per mille, an increase towards which all its three districts have contributed.

34. In the Galle District the mortality rose to 27·2 from an average of 25·5. Four out of its seven subdivisions showed enhanced death-rates. Wellaboda pattu, Walallawiti korale, and Hinidum pattu showed an improvement in the health of the people. The healthiest subdivision was Hinidum pattu (22·8) and the unhealthiest was Galle Municipality (30·9).

35. In the Matara District the death-rate rose from 24·3 to 31·1 during the quarter under review. All its subdivisions shared in the deterioration, the unhealthiest having been Matara Local Board (49·3) and Morowak korale (41·2).

36. The Hambantota District was also not so healthy as usual, the death-rate increasing from 24·6 to 26·1 per mille during the quarter. The increase in mortality extended to two of its subdivisions, Giruwa pattu east and Magam pattu, exclusive of Four Gravets, the latter having been the unhealthiest in the district with a death-rate of 57·2 as against the average 37·3. The healthiest subdivision was Giruwa pattu west (24·3 against the average 27·8).

37. *Eastern Province.*—The rate of mortality among the Tamils in this Province was at the annual rate of 30·6, an increase of 3·6 compared with the average 27·0, but a decrease of 8·2 per mille compared with the preceding quarter, when the rate was as high as 38·8. Deaths among the Moors were in the proportion of 31·2 per mille as against an average of 25·6.

38. In the District of Batticaloa the Tamil death-rate rose to 30·3 from an average of 25·9, and the Moor death-rate to 31·5 from an average of 26·3. There was no appreciable increase in the Sinhalese death-rate (32·6) when compared with the average (32·4). All its subdivisions showed increased death-rates except Nintavur, and Akkarai pattu, where the Tamils enjoyed better health than usual. In Panama pattu the Moorish death-rate improved to 24·4 from an average of 27·9.

39. In the Trincomalee District the death-rate declined to 31·8 from an average of 32·2. Two of its subdivisions shared in the improvement, the healthiest having been Trincomalee town with a death-rate of 31·1 as against an average 36·0. The unhealthiest subdivision during the quarter was Kaddukulam pattu with a mortality rate of 53·0 against the average 42·3.

40. *North-Western Province.*—The Sinhalese death-rate of the Province increased to 37·5 from an average of 33·0. Two of its districts—Kurunegala and Chilaw—were responsible for this increased mortality.

41. The death-rate of the Kurunegala District (41·1) was 4·4 per mille higher than the average rate for the corresponding quarter of 1891–99 (36·7). Four of its subdivisions shared in the deterioration. The remaining three subdivisions showed improved rates, the healthiest having been the Dewamedi hatpattu, where the rate diminished to 33·4 from an average of 38·8. The unhealthiest subdivision was Kurunegala Local Board, where the mortality rate (259·9) more than doubled the average (112·3). But the rate in this division, as in most other town divisions which have hospitals and jails, is usually higher than in the rural divisions and is liable to fluctuation, the population being so small that a few deaths more or less in the hospital and jail make a material difference in the rate.

42. The death-rate in the Puttalam District diminished to 34·6 from an average of 37·3 in the case of the Sinhalese, the death-rate among the Tamils was normal, while among the Moors it rose to 28·5 from an average of 26·5 per 1,000.

43. In the Chilaw District the mortality rose to 25· $\frac{1}{2}$  from an average of 19·0. All its subdivisions showed an increased mortality. The unhealthiest subdivision during the quarter was Chilaw town (36·3), as against an average of 18·2.

44. *North-Central Province.*—The North-Central Province appears to have enjoyed normal health during the quarter, the death-rate (32·5) having been almost equal to the average (33·0). The healthiest division was Kelegam palata with a death-rate of 27·4 as against an average of 31·0, and unhealthiest was Tamankaduwa with a mortality rate of 43·0 against an average of 34·9.

45. *Province of Uva.*—The Province of Uva would seem to have enjoyed good health during the quarter, its death-rate having been 37·5 and its average 37·6. This improvement was shared by four of its subdivisions, the healthiest having been Udukinda with a death-rate of 20·6, as against an average of 27·5. The unhealthiest subdivision in the Province was Bintenna, where the mortality rose to 54·3 from an average of 45·5.

46. The mortality among the estate Tamil population of this Province was equal to 29·4 per 1,000, as against the average rate for the corresponding quarter in the years 1891–99 (33·8).

47. *Province of Sabaragamuwa.*—The death-rate for the quarter rose to 35·4 from an average of 29·5, but when compared with the rate of the preceding quarter (37·8) there was a decrease of 2·4 per 1,000.

48. In the Ratnapura District the Sinhalese death-rate declined to 30·3 from an average of 31·1. Four out of its eight subdivisions shared in the improvement; the other four showed enhanced death-rates, notably Ratnapura Local Board, where the mortality rate (63·8) nearly doubled the average (32·7). Among the estate Tamils to every thousand living there were 67·9 deaths, that is to say, an increase of 27·3 per mille compared with the average rate 40·6.

49. The Sinhalese death-rate of the Kegalla District rose to 39·5 from an average of 28·1, but when compared with the rate (44·8) for the preceding quarter there was a decrease in the mortality of 5·3 per mille of the population. All its subdivisions showed increased death-rates, except Atulugam korale and Panawal korale, in which the people enjoyed better health than usual. The healthiest subdivision was Atulugam korale (23·2) and the unhealthiest was Kinigoda korale (64·6). The estate Tamil mortality in this district was 52·9 per mille against an average of 39·4.

**V.—Causes of Deaths.**

50. The causes of deaths registered in the Island during the quarter are given in Table X., and are summarized below :—

51. *Fever and Diarrhoeal Diseases.*—Of the 26,150 deaths registered in the Island, 5,483 were reported as due to various forms of fever and 6,387 to diarrhoeal diseases, i.e., fever and diarrhoeal diseases contributed nearly 45 per cent. of the total number of deaths.

52. There were 15 deaths from cholera this quarter (8 in Colombo and 7 in Kandy). Three deaths were due to smallpox (one each in Nuwara Eliya, Batticaloa, and Chilaw), 12 to chickenpox (6 in Nuwara Eliya, 5 in Kandy, and 1 in Colombo), and 26 to measles (6 in Jaffna, 5 in Kandy, 4 in Kegalla, 2 each in Batticaloa, Badulla, Nuwara Eliya, and 1 each in Matafa, Mannar, Galle, Ratnapura, and Colombo). Thirty-five deaths (12 in Colombo, 8 in Batticaloa, 5 each in Galle and Kalutara, 2 in Mullaittivu, 1 each in Jaffna, Kurunegala, and Anuradhapura) resulted from whooping cough. Thirty-one deaths were attributed to influenza (8 in Nuwara Eliya, 7 in Kandy, 4 in Kalutara, 3 in Ratnapura, 2 each in Colombo, Matafa, and Kegalla, and 1 each in Negombo, Hambantota and Chilaw). Mumps proved fatal in one case.

53. The other chief natural causes of death were infantile convulsions 2,441, debility 1,083, phthisis 822, worms 759, pneumonia 701, general dropsy 666, anaemia 660, old age 515, malarial cachexia 344, childbirth 275, thrush 260, puerperal convulsions 253, premature birth 167 (73 in Badulla, 24 in Colombo, 17 in Kandy, 13 in Jaffna, 8 in Kurunegala, 7 in Matafa, 5 in Ratnapura, 4 in Nuwara Eliya, 3 each in Kegalla, Anuradhapura, and Negombo, 2 each in Matafa and Mannar, 1 each in Kalutara, Mullaittivu, and Galle), bronchitis 155, rheumatism 150, paralysis 108, tetanus 89, puerperal fever 84, dochmimus duodenalis 64 (28 in Colombo, 14 in Kegalla, 8 in Kandy, 7 in Kurunegala, 5 in Ratnapura, and 2 in Chilaw), cancer 54, scrofula 51, and parangi 32 (16 in Kurunegala, 4 in Batticaloa, 2 each in Kandy, Matafa, Hambantota, and Kegalla, 1 each in Colombo, Matafa, Galle, and Badulla).

54. *Deaths by Violence.*—382 deaths were attributed to accidents, of which 105, that is nearly 30 per cent of the total number, were due to fall from trees ; 85 deaths resulted from drowning ; 48 from snake bite, 30 from burns and scalds, 19 from injury at birth, 13 from gunshot wounds, and 6 from poison ; 12 deaths were due to falls other than from trees, 8 to fall of heavy substances, 2 to sunstroke, 3 to carriage accidents, 2 to an explosion of a boiler, and 1 to fall into a pit ; 2 persons were run over by carts and 1 by a railway train ; 5 deaths were caused by alligators, 4 by hornets, 2 by wasps, 2 by dogs, 2 by buffaloes, 1 by an elephant, 1 by a cow, 1 by a fish, and 1 by a rat bite.

55. *Suicide.*—As many as 29 deaths were attributed to suicide, of which 16 were by hanging, 6 by drowning, 2 by poison, and 1 by a cut. Of these, 4 occurred in Kandy, 5 in Jaffna, 3 each in Colombo and Matafa, 2 each in Negombo, Kalutara, Nuwara Eliya, Ratnapura, and Kegalla, and 1 each in Galle, Chilaw, Anuradhapura, and Mullaittivu.

56. *Homicide.*—Thirty deaths were attributed to murder and other forms of homicide, of which 5 were in the Colombo District, 4 in Kurunegala District, 3 each in Kalutara, Galle, and Kegalla Districts, 2 each in Negombo, Matafa, Ratnapura, and Badulla Districts, and 1 each in Jaffna, Mullaittivu, Hambantota, and Batticaloa Districts. Of these, 25 were Sinhalese, 4 Tamils, and 1 Moor.

57. *Executions.*—Judicial executions registered in the quarter amounted to 9 (2 in Colombo, 2 in Kandy, 3 in Jaffna, 1 in Galle, and 1 in Kurunegala).

**VI.—Health of the Estate Population.**

58. The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Central, Uva, and Sabaragamuwa Provinces, and in the Colombo and Kalutara Districts of the Western Province, was 2,129 (of which 6 were Europeans, 3 Burghers, 42 Sinhalese, 2,052 Tamils, and 21 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 others), and the total number of deaths was 3,028 (1 European, 3 Burghers, 42 Sinhalese, 2,964 Tamils, 17 Moors, and 1 Malay), corresponding respectively to an annual birth-rate of 28.0 and a death-rate of 40.5 per mille. The causes of death are given in detail in Table XI., and may be summarized as follows :—

59. The following Table D gives the estimated population of estate Tamils in each district, its birth- and death-rates for the third quarters of 1899 and 1900, the second quarter of 1900, and the average for the third quarters in 1891-99:—

60. *Kandy District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Kandy District was 855 (of which 825 were Tamils, 13 Moors, 8 Sinhalese, 6 Europeans, 2 Burghers, and 1 Malay), and the deaths numbered 1,334 (of which 1,306 were Tamils, 22 Sinhalese, 5 Moors, and 1 European). The Tamil birth-rate during the quarter was equal to 29·5, as against a mean rate of 27·3 during the third quarters of 1891-99; and the Tamil death-rate was equal to 46·7 per 1,000 as against 32·3, the mean rate for the corresponding period of 1891-99. As usual, the most fatal causes were diarrhoeal diseases, which caused 550 deaths (254 from diarrhoea and 289 from dysentery), or nearly 41 per cent. of the total number of deaths (1,334). The other chief causes of death were debility 200 (mostly deaths of infants from inability to suck milk), malarial cachexia 95, fevers 80, pneumonia 71, general dropsy 61, infantile convulsions 51, old age 36, bronchitis 19, childbirth 18, starvation and want of breast milk 13, dochmias duodenalis 7, and cholera 7.

61. *Matale District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Matale District was 152 (150 Tamils, 1 Sinhalese, and 1 Burgher), and the deaths numbered 326 (323 Tamils, 2 Sinhalese, and 1 Moor), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 34·1 against a mean rate of 27·1 for the corresponding period of 1891-99, and a death-rate of 73·5 against a mean rate of 36·9. Dysentery and diarrhoea caused 137 deaths, i.e., 42 per cent. of the total number of deaths (326), fevers 50, debility 46, malarial cachexia 19, pneumonia 17, infantile convulsions 9, general dropsy 9, and childbirth 8.

62. *Nuwara Eliya District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Nuwara Eliya District was 367 (360 Tamils, 4 Sinhalese, 2 Moors, and 1 Malay), and the deaths numbered 354 (347 Tamils, 5 Moors, and 2 Sinhalese), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 19·2 as against a mean rate of 26·9 in the third quarters of 1891-99, and a death-rate of 18·5 against a mean rate of 28·6. Dysentery and diarrhoea were fatal in 172 cases, or 48 per cent. of the total number of deaths (354). 62 deaths were attributed to debility (mostly of infants from inability to suck), fevers 23, pneumonia 14, old age 11, infantile convulsions 11, and general dropsy 10.

63. *Badulla District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Badulla District was 271 (263 Tamils, 6 Sinhalese, 1 Moor, and 1 Malay), and the deaths numbered 244 (243 Tamils and 1 Sinhalese), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 31·8 against a mean rate of 32·8 in the corresponding period of 1891-99, and a death-rate of 29·4 against a mean rate of 33·8. Dysentery and diarrhoea were fatal in 86 cases, or nearly 25 per cent. of the total number of deaths (244), debility in 39 cases (mostly of infants from inability to suck), pneumonia in 30, fevers in 22, infantile convulsions in 9, malarial cachexia in 8, general dropsy in 8, and bronchitis in 6.

64. *Ratnapura District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates of the Ratnapura District was 112 (107 Tamils, 3 Sinhalese, and 2 Moors), and the deaths numbered 156 (154 Tamils, 1 Burgher, and 1 Moor), and corresponded respectively to an annual birth-rate of 47·2 and a death-rate of 67·9, as against averages of 32·2 and 40·6 respectively. Dysentery and diarrhoea were fatal in 65 cases, or nearly 41 per cent. of the total number of deaths. 22 deaths were attributed to debility, 17 to infantile convulsions, 7 to malarial cachexia, 7 to fevers, 6 to pneumonia, and 5 to old age.

65. *Kegalla District.*—The total number of estate births reported for registration was 293 (276 Tamils, 15 Sinhalese, and 2 Moors), and the deaths numbered 423 (403 Tamils, 13 Sinhalese, 5 Moors, and 2 Burghers), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 36·3 as against 22·0, the mean rate for the last eight years 1891-99, and a death-rate of 52·9 against the mean rate of 39·4 for the corresponding quarter of 1891-99. Here, as elsewhere, the most fatal causes were diarrhoeal diseases 173 (98 diarrhoea, 80 dysentery), or nearly 40 per cent. of the total number of deaths (423). The other chief natural causes were fevers 40, debility 36, infantile convulsions 30, malarial cachexia 27, pneumonia 17, old age 14, dochmias duodenalis 14, general dropsy 10, and want of breast milk 8.

66. *Colombo District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates of the Colombo District, by which is meant the Avisawella division of the district, was 43 (39 Tamils, 2 others, 1 Sinhalese, and 1 Moor), and the number of deaths was 69 (68 Tamils and 1 Malay), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 28·8 and a death-rate of 50·2, as against averages of 24·1 and 70·7 respectively. The birth- and death-rates among the Sinhalese inhabitants of the division were 30·8 and 16·9. Diarrhoea and dysentery were fatal in 37 cases. Twelve deaths were attributed to fevers, 4 to infantile convulsions, 4 to old age, 3 to debility, and 3 to pneumonia.

67. *Kalutara District.*—The total number of estate births registered in the Kalutara District was 36 (32 Tamils and 4 Sinhalese), and the deaths numbered 122 (120 Tamils and 2 Sinhalese), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 12·4 and a death-rate of 46·5, as against averages of 14·1 and 49·5 respectively. The largest number of deaths in this district, as elsewhere, was due to diarrhoeal diseases, to which 52 deaths, i.e., nearly 43 per cent., were attributed. The other principal causes of death were debility 17, fevers 7, general dropsy 7, pneumonia 5, old age 5, infantile convulsions 4, and phthisis 4.

## VII.—Health of the Town of Colombo.

68. The deaths registered in the town of Colombo during the quarter numbered 1,458, corresponding to a rate of 39·9 per mille per annum, being a rise of 22 per cent., compared with the mean rate for the third quarter of the last seven years (32·6).

69. The births registered in the quarter numbered 758, representing an annual rate of 20·7 per mille, which is a decline of 2 per cent. on the mean rate for the same quarter during the last seven years (21·1).

70. As usual, the death-rate exceeded the birth-rate, due mainly to the preponderance of males over females (chiefly among the Europeans, Indian Tamils, and Mohammedans), to the presence of hospitals, which add to the mortality of the town, and to the registration of births, being still defective, especially among the Moors.

71. The subjoined Table E gives the births and deaths and their rates for each nationality in the third quarter of this and last year and the average rate for the third quarters during the period 1893-99:—

The rates for the town are calculated on an estimated population amounting at the middle of 1900 to 145,143, while the rates for races and forwards (in the next table) are calculated on the census population.

72. The birth- and death-rates given in the above table for Europeans, Malays, and "Others" are not reliable, owing chiefly to their population being too small for purposes of rate calculation.

73. Excluding the rates of these sections of the population, the lowest death-rate was, as usual, among the Burghers (30·8, against an average of 29·0 in 1893-99), and the highest among the Tamils (57·9, against an average of 41·9). The Sinhalese death-rate (43·1) shows an excess of about 9 per mille, and the Moorish death-rate more than 6 per mille.

74. The birth-rates during the quarter, though higher than the average among every race except Moors, were lower than the rates for the third quarter of last year, except among Moors, who show a fair improvement, and among Malays and others, whose rates have not undergone any change.

75. The number of births and deaths of the different races in the different wards of the town, their rates per 1,000, the principal zymotic causes of death, &c., during the third quarter of 1900, are shown in the following table:—

Deaths of Children under One Year.

Deaths.

76. The unhealthiest division of the town was the New Bazaar Ward, with a death-rate of 42·4 per 1,000 per annum, followed by Slave Island (39·0) and Kotahena (38·6). The low birth- and death-rates of the Fort and Galle Face and the Pettah Wards are due to their population being chiefly a floating male adult one. Excluding these two divisions, the healthiest division of the town was the Kollupitiya Ward, with a death-rate of 22·7, a little more than half the rate for New Bazaar Ward.

77. There were no deaths from cholera or smallpox in the town, and but one from measles and 2 from whooping cough.

78. Diarrhoea and dysentery were fatal in 275 cases (against an average of 185 in the corresponding period of the last five years), phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia in 270 (average 191), infantile convulsions in 133 (average 124), debility in 133 (average 81), old age in 92 (average 52), simple and ill-defined fever in 60 (average 55), enteric fever in 46 (average 29), remittent fever in 43 (average 64), diseases of the circulatory system in 36 (average 14), malarial cachexia in 33 (average 33), dochmias duodemalis in 28 (average 6), worms in 27 (average 37), parturition in 19 (average 17), anaemia in 18 (average 13), paralysis in 13 (average 13).

79. Seventeen deaths were attributed to accidents, of which 6 were due to drowning, 2 to burns, 1 to poison. One death is assigned to homicide and two to suicide.

#### VIII.—Health of other Towns.

80. The total number of births registered in the principal towns (exclusive of Colombo) during the quarter numbered 1,824, corresponding to an annual rate of 31·8 per 1,000, a decline of 1·3 per 1,000 over the average for the corresponding period in 1891–99 (33·1).

81. The deaths numbered 2,577 and were at the annual rate of 44·9 per 1,000, an increase of 10·4 per 1,000 over the average (34·5).

82. The following Table G shows the birth- and death-rates in each of the principal towns of the Island for the third quarters of 1900 and 1899 and the average rates for the third quarters in 1891–99.

83. For the towns of Moratuwa, Panadure, Gampola, Nawalapitiya, Mannar, Mullaittivu, Vavuniya, Tangalla, and Kegalla the rates from 1891–97 are not available for comparison with the present rates.

84. The death-rates are given inclusive as well as exclusive of jail deaths. In some of the towns which attract large numbers of estate coolies and destitute poor to the hospitals, the difference between the two rates is striking, e.g., Gampola 133·3 and 36·0, Nawalapitiya 131·1 and 6·2, Matale 121·0 and 37·8, Kegalla 64·4 and 17·7. Excluding hospital and jail deaths, the highest death-rate in the quarter was in Negombo (48·0), followed by Kurunegala (46·8), Mullaittivu (45·8), and the lowest in Nawalapitiya (6·2), followed by Nuwara Eliya (16·0) and Kegalla 17·7.
