PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the Eleventh day of February, One thousand Nine hundred and One, it was appointed that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court for the Northern Circuit should be holden at Trincomalee and at Batticaloa, places included in the Northern Circuit, on dates thereafter to be fixed:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the Thirtieth day of April, One thousand Nine hundred and One, We, the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, did direct and appoint that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court for the said Northern Circuit should be holden at Batticaloa on the Thirteenth day of May and at Trincomalee on the Thirtieth day of May (instead of the Twentieth day of May then next ensuing):

And whereas it is now necessary to correct the said error:

Now know Ye that We do hereby direct and appoint that the Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court for the said Northern Circuit fixed to be holden as aforesaid at Trincomalee shall commence to be holden this year at Trincomalee on the Twentieth day of May, One thousand Nine hundred and One.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Sixth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and One.
