WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 1 of "The Mohammedan Marriage Registration Ordinance, 1886," it is enacted that the said Ordinance shall come into operation in such district or respective districts as shall be defined, and at such time or respective times as shall be appointed by the Governor in Executive Council, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Ordinance should come into operation in the districts named and defined in the schedule hereto as from and after the date hereinafter mentioned:

Boundaries:—North by Hepeyagama, Sirigampola, Kottaramulla, Koswatta, and Ihala Hundirupola; east by Compasspara; south by Maha-oya; and west by the eastern boundary limit of Kammal pattu

10-Kammal Pattu Division

Boundaries:—North by Medapalata, Mudukatuwa, and Ihala Katuneriya; east by Ginoya, northern and eastern boundaries of Boralessa, and the eastern boundaries of the villages Mirissankotuwa, Maguruwala, Bolawatta, Angampitiya, Bolana, and Kammala Tambarawila; south by Maha-oya; and west by the sea
