Regulations under Section 3 of " The Insect Pest and Quarantine Ordinance."

The importation of Cacao "plants" from any part of the Dutch East Indian

Colonies is prohibited.

2. The Principal Collector of Customs shall destroy all Cacao "plants" imported from any part of the Dutch East Indian Colonies, and no compensation shall be payable in consequence of such destruction.

T is hereby notified for general information that 161,647 acres of surveyed lands are available for sale in the under-mentioned Provinces :-

In the Western Province, 18,909 acres, situated in Siyane, Hewagam, Salpiti, and Alutkuru korales of the Colombo District, consisting of forest, chena, and jungle lands.

THE following rules made by the Government Agent of the Province of Uva, under the provisions of Ordinance No. 9 of 1893, in respect of public slaughter-houses and to places appointed for the slaughtering of cattle within the said Province, and confirmed by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

Rules and Regulations made by the Government Agent of the Province of Uva, under section 23 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1893.

1. No licensed butcher or other person shall slaughter cattle at any place other than the public slaughter-house proclaimed as such, or, in towns where no slaughter-house has been proclaimed, at the place notified to him in writing by the Government Agent as having been appointed for slaughter.

Slaughtering shall not take place except between the hours of 3 and 5 P.M.

2. The place appointed for the exposure of cattle before slaughter shall be for-

^{3.} No licensed butcher shall slaughter any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, unless he shall have previously exposed the same to public view at the appointed place for a period of not less than twenty-four hours.

^{4.} Every licensed butcher, and any person slaughtering under a special license, shall produce for inspection before the Medical Officer appointed by the Government Agent any animal or cattle he desires to slaughter.

5. The Medical Officer inspecting shall keep a register of all animals exposed for nspection in the following form :-

6. For each animal passed fit for slaughter the inspecting Medical Officer shall demand the sale voucher, or, if bearing the butcher's brands a certificate from a headman.
7. The inspecting Medical Officer shall endorse on this "Pass as fit for slaughtering"

with his signature and date, and pass the document to the Police Officer or headman in charge of the slaughter-house or place of slaughter.

8. The slaughter-house or place of slaughter shall be in charge of such Police Officer or headman as the Government Agent may from time to time by writing under his hand appoint, he shall keep a register in the following form:—

In the case of sheep or goats a written permit to slaughter signed by the inspect-

ing Medical Officer shall be produced with each animal brought for slaughter.

10. It shall be the duty of the officer in charge of the slaughter-house or place of slaughter or his deputy authorized by the Government Agent, to see that the animal so passed and no other is slaughtered. He shall require the production of the voucher or certificate under rule 6 or permit under rule 9, and shall not allow any animal to be be additioned the result of the shall require the production of the voucher or certificate under rule 6 or permit under rule 9, and shall not allow any animal to be slaughtered until such documents have been delivered to him. He shall endorse on the same "Slaughtered in my presence" with signature and date, and at the end of each month send the vouchers, certificates, and permits, with a copy of the register under rule

8 to the inspecting Medical Officer.

11. The permission for slaughter shall only be valid for seven days from the date of the inspecting Medical Officer's passing the cattle or animal.

12. The inspecting Medical Officer shall check the endorsed voucher, or certificate, or permit, and copy of register received under rule 10 with the register kept by him under rule 5 and report any discrepancy to the Government Agent to whom he shall transmit rule 5 and report any discrepancy to the Government Agent to whom he shall transmit the documents received by him.

13. Every butcher or person using the slaughter-house or place appointed for slaughter shall pay to the officer in charge fees according to the schedule annexed, before the animal is removed to the slaughter-house or place of slaughter :-

14. It shall be the duty of the officer in charge to recover the due fee for every animal before he permits slaughter, and to note on the day of slaughter the date of such slaughter in the register under rule 8.

15. The officer in charge shall remit, within seven days after the end of each month, to the Government Agent, the fees collected by him in respect of such month.

16. It shall be the duty of every licensed butcher or person holding a special license under section 14 of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1893, within two hours of the slaughter, to cause to be removed and buried, at such place as shall be appointed by the officer in charge, all entrails, offal, blood, and refuse of any animal slaughtered at the slaughterhouse.

17. Should the meat of any animal slaughtered appear to the officer in charge to be unfit for human food, it shall be his duty to at once secure the lungs and liver, and cause the butcher to produce them before the Medical Officer, and, if such Medical Officer, shall be of opinion that the meat is unfit for human food, to cause the same to be forthwith buried or destroyed, and report the matter to the Government Agent.

18. The Medical Officer shall make daily inspection of meat of all cattle passed by

him for slaughter or exposed for sale by any butcher.

CEYLON TECHNICAL COLLEGE.

DEPARTMENT OF DRAWING AND ART.

(A)—Classes for Training Teachers of Drawing.

Applications are invited from persons who wish to become teachers of drawing for admission to a special course of training at the Ceylon Technical College. The course will be for one year at least. specified in the Schedule of the Code for 1902, viz., ordinary grants will be paid for passes in drawing if none of the masters or mistresses teaching that subject in the school holds a qualifying certificate, and enhanced grants will be paid for passes in drawing in each stage if one of the masters or mistresses holds the drawing certificate of the Ceylon Technical College, or other qualifying certificate or diploma to teach drawing. Drawing will be a special subject for the Teachers' Certificate Examination, and a special certificate for passing in that subject will be issued, which will entitle the holder to earn enhanced grants for the school where he or she is teaching drawing.]

The course of raining at the Ceylon Technical College will consist of both the theory and practice of drawing and also the methods of teaching, and will include the following:-

First Year's Course.

- Practice and teaching of freehand drawing from flat examples, and the design and preparation of such patterns (including elementary brushwork).
 - Practice and teaching of drawing from models and objects in outline and in light and shade. Practice and teaching of geometrical drawing and instruction in the use of instruments and scales.
 - 4. Practice and the proper use in teaching of drawing in chalk on the blackboard.

Second Year's Course.

Practice and teaching of freehand drawing from casts of ornament.

Practice and teaching of drawing from models and objects in outline and in light and shade, the proper arrangements of such groups, and of classes for drawing the same.
 Practice and the preparation of designs and patterns for the use of teaching freehand drawing (including
