PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 15 of "The Toll Ordinance, 1896," it is enacted that every person having once paid toll in respect of himself or of any vehicle, animal, or boat at any place, payment at which shall have been declared by the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to clear any other place, shall on the production at such other place of a ticket denoting such payment to have been made, pass the same without any further payment of toll, except where such person, vehicle, animal, or boat shall at such latter place have become liable to a different rate of toll :

And whereas tolls have been established in respect of the public roads, (1) from Colombo to Kotte and (2) from Kotte to Kaduwela, in the Western Province :

And whereas it is expedient to declare that every toll paid in respect of the said public road (1) from Colombo to Kotte at or near the junction of Buller's road with the Kotte road, near the 4th milepost, shall clear the toll on the public road (2) from Kotte to Kaduwela at a spot between the 8th and 9th mileposts and *vice versa* :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the First day of January, 1902, payment of toll in respect of one of the said two tolls on the said public roads, namely, (1) on the road from Colombo to Kotte at or near the junction of Buller's road with the Kotte road, near the 4th milepost, in the Western Province, and (2) on the road from Kotte to

Kaduwela at a spot between the 8th and 9th mileposts, within the same day, shall clear the other toll.

WHEREAS by section 4 of "The Local Boards' Ordinance, 1898," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be for that purpose published in the *Government Gazette*, to bring any town or towns under the operation of the said Ordinance, and to define the limits of such town or towns respectively for the purposes of the said Ordinance :

And whereas it is expedient to bring the towns of Hatton and Dikoya, situated in the District of Kandy, Central Province, under the operation of the said Ordinance :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation bring the said towns of Hatton and Dikoya, situated in the District of Kandy, Central Province, under the operation of the said Local Boards' Ordinance, 1898, as from and after the First day of January, One thousand Nine hundred and Two, and do define the limits of the said towns for the purposes of the said Ordinance to be those set out in the schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

The Northern Limit.—The railway crossing near 1¼ milepost on the Dimbula-Dikoya road.

On the West.—A line drawn from that point to Shand's bungalow, thence along the Dunbar estate road to the junction of that road with the Dikoya cart road near the Dunbar cattle galas, thence along the Dikoya cart road with width of 100 feet from centre of road up to the southern boundary of the Dikoya estate.

On the East.—A line from the railway crossing at 1¼ milepost on the Dimbula-Dikoya road to the house occupied by the Secretary of the Police Court, thence to the mill-dam, and thence along the Hatton estate road to the junction of estate roads below Adam's Peak Hotel tennis courts, thence a straight line to the up home railway signal post, and thence a line passing behind Fisher's bungalow to the stream flowing between that bungalow and the cart road, then along the stream to the southern boundary of the Dikoya estate to the point where it joins the Dikoya stream, and thence up the said stream to the point opposite the culvert on the Dikoya-Wanarajah road, including also a distance of 270 yards along the Bathford Valley road as far as the road leading to the Darrawella race-course, and including on the west all lands between the road and the Darrawella-oya up to its junction with the Dikoya stream, and on the east all land, &c., within 100 feet from centre of the road.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by the 1st section of the Ordinance No. 19 of 1886, intituled "An Ordinance to prevent the unnecessary destruction of Fish," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to prohibit the use of certain kinds of nets to be in such Proclamation specified, or to restrict their use to certain places, or to attach such conditions to their use as shall appear expedient to the Governor with the said advice :

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 5th November, 1884, the use of the drag net called Arakkuddi-valai was prohibited within certain boundaries as specified in Schedule B hereto :

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to prohibit the use of the said drag net called Arakkuddi-valai and of certain other kinds of drag and drift nets and any combination of drag and drift nets within a certain specified area :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation prohibit the use of the said drag net called Arakkuddi-valai and of certain other kinds of nets specified in Schedule A hereto along any part of the sea coast within a line drawn from Chankanai to Chundikulam and from Mandativu to the western limit of Pesalai, lying within the boundaries mentioned in the Schedule B hereto, in the Northern Province of this Island.

SCHEDULE A.

1. The drag net called Arakkuddi-valai.
2. The net called "Kuddu-valai" which consists of the drift net called "Vali-valai" to which are attached one or more bags called "Madi-valai" similar to those used with the drag net and weighted or not weighted at the bottom.
3. The drift net called "Vali-valai" in any form, with or without weights and with or without "Madi-valai" or other appendages.

WHEREAS by section 17 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," it is amongst other things enacted that whenever the Government Agent shall forward an application of the nature described in sections 15 and 16 of the said Ordinance to Government, together with his report as to the necessity for locating a police force in any district, and as to the number of men to compose such force, and the amount in money required for its upkeep, it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to establish a police force in such district from such time as shall be therein named, and to introduce therein such of the clauses of the said Ordinance as the Governor and Council shall consider expedient :

And whereas the Government Agent of the Central Province did forward to Government an application of the nature described in sections 15 and 16 of the said Ordinance, together with his report as to the necessity for locating a police force in the district of Matale in the Central Province, and as to the number of men to compose such force, and the amount in money required for its upkeep, as required by the said section 17 of the said Ordinance :

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby establish a police force in the said district of Matale in the Central Province, as from and after the Fifteenth day of November, 1901, and we do hereby introduce the following clauses of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," in the said district: viz., all the clauses of Ordinance No. 16 of 1865, except 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 49, 80, and the following up to 97 inclusive, and the said

district shall, for the purposes of the said Police Ordinance, 1865, consist of and comprise all lands and high roads included within the external boundaries of the estates specified in the schedule hereto.

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

NOTICE is hereby given that an examination for candidates wishing to enter the Third Class of the Clerical Branch of the Public Service will take place on Monday, January 27, 1902, and following days.

2. Applications for admission to the examination by persons not now in the Public Service must be addressed to the Director of Public Instruction, must bear a duly cancelled stamp of Rs. 10 with the words "Ceylon Stamp Duty," only, without the words "Judicial" or "Warehouse Warrant" printed thereon, and must be in the form (Schedule A) attached to this notice. Forms are to be obtained at any Post Office on application, or within four days' notice. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be on the 1st January, 1902, between the ages of 18 and 21, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person,* to the satisfaction of the Director of Public Instruction, must be attached to the form of application. If a certificate of birth for a previous examination was sent in, reference may be made to it by mentioning name and date of examination. Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted.

3. Clerks belonging to the Fourth Class of the Clerical Branch of the Public Service, who have completed three years' satisfactory service, and those employed by Provincial and District Road Committees, whose appointments date prior to July 1, 1875, are eligible for examination irrespective of age and without fee. Their applications (in the same form, Schedule A) for admission to the examination should be forwarded to the Director of Public Instruction through the heads of their Departments. When forwarding the application forms of Clerks who are employed under them in the Fourth Class of the Clerical Service, Heads of Departments are requested to note the following particulars on the back of the application forms of the candidates:—

- (1) The appointments held by the candidates and salaries.
- (2) Whether the appointments were permanent or temporary.
- (3) Whether the salary was paid from vote for Personal Emoluments or Other Charges or from certain fees.

4. Applications are to reach the Director of Public Instruction not later than 12 noon on Monday, January 6, 1902; any applications received after that hour, by whatever cause delayed, will be absolutely rejected.

5. The Director of Public Instruction will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved application shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination at the station at which they present themselves their forms of application, approved by the Director of Public Instruction. A candidate not producing such form, whatever may be the reason for his not so doing, will be refused admittance to the examination.

6. Examinations will be held at Colombo and Jaffna only, in the places and under the supervision of the officers specified in Schedule B. Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments, whose applications to present themselves for examination have been returned to them approved by the Director of Public Instruction, leave to present themselves at the most conveniently situated station at which the examination is to be held.

7. The examination will be competitive. The number of places assigned for competition shall be thirty.

8. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule C to this notice. The examination shall be held in two parts: the first part, a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic. Any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds of the marks allotted for Handwriting and half those allowed for Spelling and Arithmetic respectively shall be excluded from the remainder of the examination. The second part of the examination shall be in the remaining subjects in Schedule C. Should a candidate obtain less than one-fourth marks in any of the subjects other than Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic, or, if he be a Sinhalese or Tamil, less than two-thirds marks in his native language, such marks shall not be counted in his favour. In all the written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling.

9. Officers who have served continuously in the Fourth Class of the Clerical Service for over six years will be allowed to compete amongst themselves and be eligible if they obtain a minimum of 33 per cent. in the compulsory subjects for two-ninths of the appointments offered for competition. One-ninth of the appointments will be reserved as prizes for deserving officers of the Fourth Class of not less than ten years' service to be selected irrespective of examination. No service under the age of sixteen years will be reckoned for this purpose.

THE following Regulations under section 9 of "The Fertilizers Ordinance, 1901," made by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

Commencement.

1. These regulations are to take effect on the First day of January, 1902, and to remain in force until altered or revoked.

Definitions.

2. In these regulations :—

"Analyst" means any person duly appointed as an Agricultural Analyst under the provisions of section 5 of the Ordinance.

"Authorized representative" means any person authorized by the Analyst to take samples, with the approval of the Governor.

"Buyer" and "seller" include their respective agents.

"Fertilizer" means any article sold for use as a fertilizer of the soil, which has been prepared or subjected to any artificial process in Ceylon or imported from abroad.

Other terms have the same meaning and scope as in the above-mentioned Ordinance.

Appointment of Agent.

3. An appointment of an agent by the buyer may be in the Form A set forth in the Schedule hereto or in a form to the like effect; and the provisions of these regulations relating to a buyer shall apply to an agent appointed by the buyer for the purposes of the above-mentioned Ordinance.

Proceedings by Buyer to procure Samples.

4. When the buyer of not less than a hundredweight of a fertilizer desires to have the same analysed in pursuance of the 6th section of the above Ordinance, he is, within ten days after delivery of the article to him or receipt of the invoice, whichever is later, either to give notice to the seller that he intends to take samples of the article himself, or to give notice in writing to the Analyst or authorized representative, stating that he desires that the samples shall be taken by the Analyst or authorized representative, as the case may be.

Regulations as to Samples taken by Buyer.

5. When the buyer intends to take the samples himself, he is to give at least three days' notice in writing of such intention to the seller, with particulars as to the place, day, and hour of sampling. If the seller does not attend, the samples are to be taken in the presence of a witness, who is to initial each sample.
6. The buyer is forthwith to deliver or send by post to the Analyst one of such samples, with the invoice or a copy thereof.
7. One of the remaining samples is to be delivered or sent by post to the seller and the other is to be retained by the buyer.

Regulations as to Samples taken by Analyst or authorized Representative.

8. When the buyer or the seller desires that the samples shall be taken by the Analyst or authorized representative, he is to give notice in writing to that effect to the Analyst or authorized representative, as the case may be. Such notice is to contain the names and addresses of the buyer and the seller, and such particulars as may be necessary to enable the Analyst or authorized representative to identify the article to be analysed, and may be in the Form B set forth in the Schedule hereto or in a form to the like effect. A copy of any such notice given by the seller is to be sent at the same time to the buyer.

9. The Analyst or authorized representative, as the case may be, is to give at least three days' notice in writing to the seller and to the buyer as to the place, day, and hour of sampling, to enable them to be present at such sampling, if they so desire.

10. One of the samples taken by the Analyst or authorized representative is to be retained for the use of the Analyst in making this analysis, another delivered or sent to the seller, and the third delivered or sent to the buyer.

11. Any notice or sample required by these regulations to be given or sent by the Analyst or authorized representative to the buyer or the seller may be sent by post to the respective names and addresses stated in the notice to be given under Regulation 8.

12. The Analyst, or authorized representative, as the case may be, is, at or before the time of sampling, to be supplied by the buyer with the invoice or a copy thereof.

13. The Analyst or authorized representative is to provide any receptacle or other thing required by him for the samples.

General Regulations for taking Samples.

14. When the fertilizer is delivered in bags or other packages, a number of bags or packages are to be selected as follows, viz. :—

Not less than 2 bags or packages where the quantity does not exceed 1 ton

 " 3 " " " 2 tons

 " 4 " " " 3 tons

and one additional bag or package for every additional ton or part of a ton ; provided that in no case need more than ten bags or packages be selected.

15. The selected bags or packages are to be emptied separately on a clean and dry stone or wooden floor, worked up with a spade, and one spadeful from each set aside. The separate spadefuls are then to be thoroughly mixed, and any lumps broken up by the hand or spade. From this mixture three samples, each from half pound to one pound in weight, are to be taken and carefully and securely packed.

16. When the fertilizer is delivered in bulk, then, in like manner, portions are to be taken from different parts of the fertilizer and thoroughly mixed together, and the samples taken from a portion of such mixture.

17. When the fertilizer consists of bulky material, uneven in character and likely to get matted together, such as shoddy, wool, refuse, hair, &c., portions are to be taken from the selected bags or packages, or from different parts of the fertilizer, if in bulk, the matted portions torn up, and the whole mixed as above directed, but no sample is to be less than one pound in weight.

18. As an alternative method, where neither the seller nor the buyer signifies objection thereto, samples of a fertilizer delivered in bags or other packages may be taken by a sampling pale or spear or pipe or tube, which shall not be less than twenty-four inches in length and two inches in diameter. The total quantity so abstracted for the samples shall be not less than five pounds where the quantity of the fertilizer does not exceed five tons, and not less than ten pounds where the quantity exceeds five tons, and shall be drawn from at least double the number of bags or packages required to be selected under Regulation 14.

General Directions.

19. In every case the sampling is to be done as quickly as is possible consistently with due care, and the material is not to be allowed to be exposed any longer than is absolutely necessary.

20. The object of the person taking the samples is to obtain samples fairly representing the bulk from which they are drawn, and therefore no bag, package, or cask is to be selected which has apparently been damaged while in the possession of the buyer.

21. Each sample is to be packed in a dry clean bottle or jar, or in some other suitable manner, so that the original composition of the fertilizer may be preserved.

22. The samples are to be so packed and secured that they cannot be tampered with, and are to be sealed and initialled by the person taking the sample. They may also be sealed by the buyer and the seller, if present and so desiring. Each sample is to be marked with the name of the article, the date and the place of the sampling, and with some distinguishing number.

Regulation as to Samples sealed by Seller and Buyer.

23. Where any samples are taken in the presence of, and sealed by, the seller as well as the buyer, such samples are to be deemed, as between the buyer and seller, to have been taken in accordance with these regulations.

Short Title.

24. These regulations may be cited as "The Fertilizers Regulations, 1902."
