WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 4 of "The Tolls Ordinance, 1896," it is enacted that, subject to the provisions and limitations in the said Ordinance contained, tolls shall be levied upon all horses, elephants, oxen, vehicles, and boats in respect of the roads, bridges, ferries, and canals specified in the several schedules to the said Ordinance annexed, at such rates as the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* shall be pleased to appoint, provided that the same shall in no case exceed the rates thereafter specified:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf on Us conferred as aforesaid, do hereby appoint that the rates at which the toll so established in respect of the Battulu-oya bridge, North-Western Province, shall be in accordance with those set out in the schedule hereto.

3. Clerks belonging to the Fourth Class of the Clerical Branch of the Public Service, who have completed three years' satisfactory service, and those employed by Provincial and District Road Committees, whose appointments date prior to July 1, 1875, are eligible for examination irrespective of age and without fee. Their applications (in the same form, Schedule A) for admission to the examination should be forwarded to the Director of Public Instruction through the heads of their Departments. When forwarding the application forms of Clerks who are employed under them in the Fourth Class of the Clerical Service, Heads of Departments are requested to note the following particulars on the back of the application forms of the candidates:—

6. Examinations will be held at Colombo and Jaffna only, in the places and under the supervision of the officers specified in Schedule B. Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments, whose applications to present themselves for examination have been returned to them approved by the Director of Public Instruction, leave to present themselves at the most conveniently situated station at which the examination is to be held.

7. The examination will be competitive. The number of places assigned for competition shall be thirty.

8. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule C to this notice. The examination shall be held in two parts: the first part, a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic. Any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds of the marks allotted for Handwriting and half those allowed for Spelling and Arithmetic respectively shall be excluded from the remainder of the examination. The second part of the examination shall be in the remaining subjects in Schedule C. Should a candidate obtain less than one-fourth marks in any of the subjects other than Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic, or, if he be a Sinhalese or Tamil, less than two-thirds marks in his native language, such marks shall not be counted in his favour. In all the written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling.

9. Officers who have served continuously in the Fourth Class of the Clerical Service for over six years will be allowed to compete amongst themselves and be eligible if they obtain a minimum of 33 per cent. in the compulsory subjects for two-ninths of the appointments offered for competition. One-ninth of the appointments will be reserved as prizes for deserving officers of the Fourth Class of not less than ten years' service to be selected irrespective of examination. No service under the age of sixteen years will be reckoned for this purpose.

Buddhist Temporalities.

RULES framed by the Provincial Committee of the Province of Uva, in terms of section 36 of "The Buddhist Temporalities Ordinance," No. 3 of 1889, as amended by section 10 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1895:—

1. Three members of the Provincial Committee shall form a quorum.
2. In the absence of the President from a Committee Meeting one of the members present shall be chosen to fill his place, and he shall have for the time being all the privileges vested in the President.
3. In the event of a vacancy in the Provincial Committee, it shall be filled up at a General Meeting of the Provincial Committee and the District Committee of the principal District.
The President shall grant to the member thus selected a certificate in terms of the 34th section of the Ordinance No. 3 of 1889.
4. The meetings of this Provincial Committee shall be held once in three months, and all proceedings shall be conducted and recorded in Sinhalese.
5. The Provincial Committee shall be empowered to appoint one or two clerks for the performance of the work of the Provincial Committee of Uva.
6. All correspondence in connection with this Ordinance between the incumbents and the trustees or Basnayake Nilames, and this Committee shall be carried on through the District Committees, except such as the writers find it necessary to address to the Provincial Committee direct.
7. When it is found necessary to spend a sum exceeding Rs. 50 on any building or repairs to a temple, the consent of the Provincial Committee shall be obtained through the District Committee.
8. The President shall have the power to cause the production of any papers or books in charge of a trustee or a Basnayake Nilame whenever he finds it necessary, as well as to settle all disputes amicably without the full Committee.
9. Every District Committee Member of the respective divisions shall, on or before the 28th February, collect from each of the trustees or Basnayake Nilames in his division, as a contribution towards the expenses of carrying out the provisions of this Ordinance, a sum calculated at the rate of 5 per cent. from the annual income of all the temples in his division, giving the trustees or Basnayake Nilames formal receipts for the sums paid, and forward the same before 31st March with his counterfoil of receipts to the President of the Provincial Committee, and obtain a formal acknowledgment from the President for the collections thus tendered.
10. The President shall deposit the money thus received in the Bank of Uva, and spend the same as directed by the Committee, keeping an account thereof, which shall be laid before each Committee meeting.
11. On a representation with specific charges made against a trustee or a Basnayake Nilame to the President of the Provincial Committee by a number of lay members (such number to be not less than three interested in the temple), or by the priests of the temple, the President shall call upon the District Committee to inquire into the charges.
12. If the District Committee shall find a trustee or a Basnayake Nilame guilty of the charges preferred against him, he shall be removed from his office by the Provincial Committee, and a suitable person shall be appointed by the Provincial Committee to act as trustee or Basnayake Nilame until a successor is appointed, as provided for by section 17 of Ordinance No. 3 of 1889.
13. On a representation with specific charges made against an incumbent to the President of the Provincial Committee by the priests of his temple or by a number of lay members, such number to be not less than three interested in the temple, the President shall by a writing issued by him notify to the incumbent the time and place at which inquiry into the representation will be held. This intimation shall be made at least fourteen days before the date determined for the inquiry.
14. Inquiries as to the removal of incumbents from office shall be held by a Committee composed of a chapter of five Buddhist monks versed in the doctrines, and of the sect to which the incumbent belongs, and the members of the Provincial Committee. If the majority of the members of the Committee composed as above shall find an incumbent guilty of the charges preferred against him, he shall be removed from his office.
15. If from amongst the resident priests of the temple an incumbent possessing the qualifications specified in the twelfth clause cannot be selected another priest from the same sect and from the community of monks to which the temple appertains, whose appointment shall be approved of by five of the lay members interested in the temple, shall be selected by the Provincial Committee and the five priests versed in the doctrines.

Preliminary Examination.

THE Preliminary Examination for Medical Students of either sex will begin on March 17, 1902. The last day for entry is March 1, 1902.

The following is an extract from the Examination Regulations :—

The Preliminary.—This examination is held once a year in the third week in March. Before admission to the preliminary the candidate must present to the Registrar not later than March 1 the following certificates :—

- (1) Certificate of having attained 16 years of age.

Subjects of the Examination.

1. English Language, including Grammar and Composition.
2. Latin, including Grammar, translation from specified author (the author selected is Livy, Book XXII.), and translation of easy passages not taken from such author.
3. Mathematics, comprising Arithmetic ; Algebra as far as simple equations inclusive ; Geometry, the subject-matter of Euclid, Books I., II., and III., and easy deductions.
4. One of the following optional subjects : Greek, French, German, Italian, Sinhalese, Tamil. The questions on optional subjects include Grammar, easy translation from and into English.

Scheme of the Examination.

First Day ...	{ 9-12 A.M. English Language. 2-4 P.M. English Essay.
Second Day ...	{ 9-12 A.M. Latin, prescribed book. Unseen translation. 2-4 P.M. Latin Grammar, English into Latin.
Third Day ...	{ 9-12 A.M. Arithmetic and Algebra. 2-4 P.M. Geometry.
Fourth Day ...	9-12 A.M. Optional subjects.

Results of the Examination.

In publishing the results the names of the candidates will be placed in two classes, first and second. Those in the first in order of merit ; and those in the second alphabetically.

The Preliminary Examination Prizes.

The highest candidate in the first class, provided he obtains a sufficient number of marks, shall be awarded a Government scholarship entitling him to three years' free education at the Ceylon Medical College ; the second shall receive a medal.
