#### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, May 18, 1901, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with notice dated May 14.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklass, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on April 20 were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.
- 2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1900 to April 30, 1901, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of April.

Resolved,—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

- 3. The following papers were laid on the table :-
  - (a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during April and register.
  - (b) Analysis of a sample of drinking water supplied to the town from a standpost in Ward street.
- 4. The following correspondence was submitted and read :-
  - (a) Letter dated April 28 from the Lady Superior of the Convent of the Good Shepherd thanking the Council for having authorized, under Ordinance No. 16 of 1900, the exemption of the premises of the Convent, which are used for educational purposes from police and lighting are
  - the Convent, which are used for educational purposes, from police and lighting rate.

    (b) Letter No. 9, dated May 6, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, observing that there has been an increase in "imprisonments" of 12, as compared with the corresponding period of the previous year, of commutation rate defaulters.
  - (c) Read letter dated May 7 from Mr. C. M. Fernando resigning his seat as an elected Member of the Municipal Council.
    - Proposed by Mr. Sproule, seconded by Mr. Yanderwall,—That Mr. Fernando's resignation is received with regret, and a vote of thanks be accorded him for services rendered to the Council.
    - The Chairman intimated that he proposed holding an election on June 22 for election of a Member for No. 4 Ward in place of Mr. Fernando, resigned.

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(d) Letter from Mr. J. Mottau, dated May 17, reporting that he had audited the accounts for April and found them correctly posted and in order, was read.

Submitted letter dated May 17 from Auditor with report for first quarter. Resolved that these be circulated.

5. Read petition dated April 29 from stall-holders in the market respecting the recent appointment of Mr. Weerasingha to collect market rents, with report by Secretary; also letter from Mr. Weerasingha, dated May 11, stating that stall-holders refuse to pay rent till the end of the month, as they state they have deposited security for each month's rent.

Resolved, on motion of Chairman, that the appointment of Mr. Weerasingha, as Collector, be confirmed.

The motion was carried. Mr. Beven dissenting.

6. Report by the Special Committee appointed on January 19 to consider additional by-laws regulating water service was submitted.

Resolved,—That the papers be circulated and considered at next Meeting.

7. The Chairman asked that the consideration of the statement of expenditure incurred in connection with the Royal visit be postponed till next Meeting.

This was agreed to.

8. In accordance with notice Mr. Gibbon asked,—Why the expenditure on Fairieland and Hermitage to March 31, 1901, is so far in excess of revenue, and if there was a corresponding excess in expenditure at same date in 1900?

\*\*Reply.\*\*—The expenditure to April included Rs. 1,500 paid as an advance on account May. The receipts equal Rs. 4,022-32, leaving an apparent over-expenditure of Rs. 2,066-37. It is probable that there is sufficient crop in store to cover this.

#### Health Officer's Report for the Month of April, 1901.

Water Supply.—Good and sufficient. A very good quantity of water in the reservoir considering the time of the year.

Alleys.—Much as they were (see my report for January, 1901).

Draws.—In much the same condition: back drain at No. 346, Trincomalee street, still in a filthy state; this has been reported on; yet nothing has been done. Fresh notice has been signed by me to-day asking that it may be seen to at once. It is a source of danger to the town.

Laundries.—Fairly well kept; those in Peradeniya road (Nos. 407, 230, 229, and 229) are still open; these were

condemned by the Chairman months ago.

Dairies .- Fairly well kept.

Bakeries.—Fairly well kept.

Market.—Better kept this month. Cattle passed this month: cattle, 461; buffaloes, 128; sheep, 351; goats, 153.

Slaughter House.—Well kept. Inspection Shed.—Well kept.

Scavenging.—Satisfactory.

Cooly Lines.—Same as last month and before.
Fish Boutiques—Better kept than last month.
Latrines.—Well kept.

General Health. - Very good.

#### Examination of a Sample of Drinking Water.

Source and possibility of contamination: standpipe in Ward street. No possibility of contamination.

#### Chemical and Physical Examination.

- 1. Colour in 6-in. column: colourless.
  - Turbidity: perfectly clear and bright.
- Odour: none.
- Residue left on evaporation: very slight; white; did not char.
- Free ammonia: no evidence of.
- Chlorine: less than 2 grains per gallon.
- Equivalent of common salt: about 3 grains per gallon.
- Nitrites: none.
- Nitrates: none.
- Hardness: about 4 degrees.
- Lead: none.
- Zinc, iron, and copper: none. 10.
- Oxygen absorbed in 15 minutes at 212° F.: not more than 05 grain per gallon. 11.

From the examination of the source of the water herein referred to, and the results obtained by analysis, I am of opinion that it is admirably adapted for all domestic purposes. It exerts little or no effect on permanganate of potassium, and is therefore a very pure water.
