MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, June 29, 1901, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated June 25, 1901.

Present;—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.; Dr. J. Craib; P. T. Habeeboo Lebbe, Esq.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on May 18, 1901, were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.
- 2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1900 to May 31, 1901, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of May.

Resolved,—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

- 3. The following papers were laid on the table :-
 - (a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during May and register.
- 4. Read letter dated June 24, 1901, from the Auditor (Mr. J. Mottau), reporting that he had audited the books for last month and found them correctly posted and in order.

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- 5. The following correspondence was submitted:
 - (a) Letter No. 10 dated June 19, 1901, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, inviting attention to section 7 of the Ordinance No. 8 of 1901.

Resolved,—That an edition of the several by-laws adopted and sanctioned since 1896 be printed and a copy forwarded in January next to the Clerk to the Legislative Council.

- (b) Letter No. 11 dated June 20, 1901, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, stating that the Military authorities cannot accede to the proposal for a right of way through Military land at Mahaiyawa.
- (c) Read letter dated June 14, 1901, from Mr. H. L. Wendt, forwarding his opinion respecting the exemption from assessment, under section 2 of Ordinance No. 16 of 1900, of buildings partly used for educational purposes and partly as dwelling-houses.
- 6. Read petition from certain residents complaining of a combination amongst mutton butchers in the market.

Application having been made by mutton butchers for the stalls Nos. 69 and 70, authority was asked for the cancelling of licenses issued in respect of stalls Nos. 69 and 70 set apart some years back for mutton butchers, but used of recent years by vendors of sundry articles, there having been no use for them by mutton butchers.

Resolved,—That the existing licenses be cancelled in respect of stalls Nos. 69 and 70.

Resolved,—That the petitioners be informed that stalls Nos. 69 and 70 have been made available for use of mutton butchers.

- 7. In accordance with notice, Mr. Beven asked the following questions:-
- (1) If soundings have been taken recently of those portions of the lake used for depositing silt?

Reply.—Soundings were taken in 1898. Plan submitted showing the depths ascertained.

(2) If steps cannot be taken to prevent the rush of storm water, bringing as it does large quantities of silt from Lady Longden's road to the lake near the junction of the road with Victoria Drive?

Reply.—To prevent the great rush of water a cross culvert on Lady Longden's Drive was closed last year. A

further examination and report are necessary.

Resolved,—That the Provincial Engineer be asked to inspect the locality and submit a report, which he under-

took to do.

(3) What sums are due to the Council under the heads of House Scavenging and Water Supplied, and what periods do they cover?

8. Report by Special Committee appointed on January 19 to consider additional by-laws regulating water service was laid on the table.

Secretary reported that two Members had not seen the papers yet.

Resolved,—That the papers be re-circulated.

9. Considered two applications for purchase of the Council's one-sixth share of premises Nos. 86, 86a, and 87, Browning street.

Resolved,—That the Council's share of the above premises be put up for sale at public auction.

10. Read recommendation by Standing Committee that the water analysis case applied for by the Health Officer in his letter of April 19, 1901, be purchased at a cost of Rs. 45.

Resolved, - That the recommendation be approved of and the case be purchased, the cost being provided for in the next Supplemental Budget.

11. Read recommendation by the Health Officer that the cesspits on premises No. 1,006 owned by Mr. E. J. Fernando and on premises No. 1,008 owned by Mr. Wm. Mendis be emptied and closed and dry-earth closets substituted.

Resolved,—That special authority be granted to the Chairman, in accordance with section 209 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, as amended by section 33 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, to require the owners of premises Nos. 1,006 and 1,008, Peradeniya road, to empty and close the cesspits on the said premises and to substitute dry-earth closets therefor.

- 12. The ballot was taken for the election of a Member of the Standing Committee in place of Mr. C. M. Fernando. On the votes being scrutinized, the Chairman declared Mr. J. H. Sproule to have been duly elected as a Member of the Standing Committee.
- 13. The quarterly report by the Auditor (Mr. J. Mottan), which had been circulated, together with notes by the Superintending Officer, and seen by all the Members, was laid on the table.

Resolved,—The Council having read the papers is satisfied with the explanation tendered.
