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## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on July 27, 1901, at 1.30 p.m.

Present:—The Chairman; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G.; Dr. W. G. Keith; H. A. Grant, Esq.; C. P. Hayley, Esq.; D. G. Goonawardena, Esq.; Dr. E. Ludovici; F. Abeyesundera, Esq.; Magdom Ismail, Esq.

- 1. Read and confirmed Minutes of Meeting held on June 15, 1901.
- 2. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved,—That in the opinion of this Council all road work should be done by contract, and that in the exercise of the power vested in the Chairman under the 63rd and following clauses of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance any resolution to that effect adopted by the Council be given effect to by the Chairman in terms of the proviso to section 47 (1) of the same Ordinance as amended by section 12 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1896.

Seconded by Dr. Ludovici.

Mr. D. G. Goonawardena moved as an amendment,—That the matter be deferred for further consideration in view of the legal question involved as to the authority of the Chairman under sections 47 and 63 and 68 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance.

Seconded by Mr. H. A. Grant.

The amendment was put to the vote and carried.

- 3. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved,—That in future, as it is dangerous to public health, the mud from the drains and sweeping of the streets be put into a cart at once, and not left by the side of the street or road as at present to be carted at the convenience of the driver.

  Seconded by Dr. Ludovici.—Carried.
- 4. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Hayley moved,—That more ornamental trees be planted in the Fort and its neighbourhood, and that a Sub-Committee be appointed to confer with the Superintendent of Works upon the description of trees and places where they are required.

Seconded by Dr. Ludovici.—Carried.
Resolved,—That the Sub-Committee be composed of the Chairman, Dr. Ludovici, and Messrs. C. P. Hayley and F. Abeyesundera.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Hayley moved,—That a Sub-Committee be appointed to examine and report on the state of the Municipal roads.

Seconded by Dr. Keith.—Carried.

Resolved,-That Messrs. H. A. Grant, C. P. Hayley, and D. G. Goonawardena form the Sub-Committee.

6. Pursuant to notice Dr. Ludovici asked,—Whether any and what steps have been taken by the Chairman to give effect to the resolution regarding the playing of golf carried at the last Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, as golf playing still continues in defiance of that resolution?

The Chairman replied that he has taken no steps because he considered that any legal action taken by him to give effect the resolution would fail.

7. Submitted letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, dated July 4, 1901, No. 11, returning the revised by-laws for amendment of chapter XXII.

Resolved,—That the following by-law be substituted for chapter XXII.:-

Whoever shall commit any breach of any of the foregoing by-laws by doing any act prohibited or declared to be an offence by any such by-laws, or by neglecting to do any act directed to be done by any such by-laws, or in anywise however, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty rupees, and in case of a continued infringement to a further penalty not exceeding ten rupees a day he continues so to offend.

8. Submitted Chairman's Administration Report for 1900.

Moved by Mr. C. P. Hayley,—That the report be adopted. Seconded by Mr. H. A. Grant.—Carried.

- 9. Read letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, dated June 19, 1901, No. 10, inviting attention to section 7 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1901.
- 10. Read letter from the Secretary of the Galle Reading Room, dated June 19, 1901, stating that it is the wish of the Members who visit the institution regularly that the suriya tree near the Reading Room should be cut down.

Resolved,—That the application to cut down the tree be referred to the Sub-Committee on ornamental shade trees appointed this day.

11. Submitted recommendation from Member of Ward No. 2 to furnish new number plates to houses, and an estimate of the cost of doing this.

Resolved,—That the estimate for providing plates of zinc with numbers painted on them be approved, and that the tax collectors of the different wards be asked to furnish lists of houses which require numbers to be fixed to them.

Record of Reasons for Dr. Anthonisz's Dissent from the Resolution to adopt the Chairman's Administration Report for 1900.

I HAVE to offer a few remarks on what appears in the Chairman's Annual Report of the Municipality regarding roads and their repairs, and beg that they be recorded.

The Chairman states that the state of the roads is satisfactory, and that a steam roller which has been under consideration for several years would be a luxury to the Municipality. I must differ in the opinion expressed by the Chairman. If a steam roller was a necessity to Colombo, how could it be a luxury to Galle? In the same way, when a Municipal institution is considered a necessity to Colombo it ought to be a luxury to Galle. Arguments of this sort are not quite satisfactory to ordinary minds, however acceptable they may be to a few.

The proof that the roads are not properly solidified is that well-rolled roads are to be found where heavy traffic exists, such as the roads where the plumbago, coir, and rice carts are daily driven to and fro. In other roads, as a rule, the metal is either loose or projecting to the great discomfort of foot passengers.

The Civil Engineer in his report on the use of a steam roller has made a few remarks which are not conclusive. He does not give satisfactory reasons why good work should be done in Colombo and not in Galle. I shall now remark on the Civil Engineer's objections, one by one, to show how incomplete and unsatisfactory his objections are. One objection to a steam roller is that the culverts in Galle are not sufficiently well constructed for a steam roller; another is that a steam roller will finish all the work on the roads in three months, and that the steam roller will be idle for nine months in the year; and lastly, he admits that a steam roller will make a better and more solid road than the present system.

The objection to culverts being imperfectly constructed is no reason why better roads need not be made and better culverts as well. Who built the culverts but those trained in the Public Works Department, and is the mortar in Galle less binding than that used in Colombo. Surely the arguments and objections are not satisfactory to prevent better roads being made, and the sooner such bad work is replaced with satisfactory work the better for the tax-payer and the public.

The objection to road work being finished in three months, and the desire that bad road work be continued throughout the year, is an argument which will not be acceptable to most people. The regret seems to be that when road work is so speedily done the steam roller will be idle for nine months during the year, and fed within that time in grease and oil to keep it in working order. Surely, surely such opinions or arguments could not be considered satisfactory. The only way one could be consoled is by agreeing with Lord Dundeary that it is a thing which no fellow could understand.

The Civil Engineer admits that a steam roller will make a better and more solid road than by the present system if all the roads in the Municipality could be rolled by a steam roller and the bridges bear the weight of the roller. The necessity is to have all the roads metalled, as the gravel found in Galle is said to be inferior, and to have the bridges strengthened. The objection to the bridges is done away with having a steam roller of 5 tons in weight which could be transferred in sections over a bridge.

To point out the delay in road work according to the present system, take the Hirimbura Cross road as an instance. This road was in a most unsatisfactory state, and looked like a paddy field ready for sowing. The Chairman's attention being drawn to it, it was proposed to metal the wheel tracks on the road on the 23rd of March, and the work was not completed before the early part of July. The road being about three-quarters mile long, it took more than three months to finish the work. At this rate only three miles of road could be repaired in a year, and as there are about twenty-five miles of road within the Municipality, only three miles will receive attention, and the rest, twenty-two miles, neglected. Could this be considered satisfactory, when by a steam roller all the roads could be repaired in three months. What a comfort to the public, a satisfaction to the tax-payer, and a blessing by suppressing cruelty to both man- and beast-labourers who walk bare feet to go over sharp pieces of broken metal, and the poor beasts of burden to draw heavy carts over roads undergoing repairs all the year round.
