Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, August 9, 1901.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated August 3, 1901.

Present :—Mr. A. S. Pagden, Chairman ; Mr. A. Perry ; Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten ; Mr. A. de A. Seneviratna ; the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G. ; Mr. D. W. H. Skrine ; Mr. Chas. Perera ; Mr. Chas. P. Das ; Mr. R. H. Morgan ; and Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen.

The Minutes of July 12, 1901, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of July 12, 1901, be confirmed.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, July 20, 1901, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with notice dated July 16, 1901.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.; P. T. Habeeboo Lebbe, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on June 29, 1901, were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1900 to June 30, 1901, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of June.

Resolved,—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—

- (1) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during June and register.
- (2) Return of burials in the General Cemetery during the first six months of the year.
- (3) Report by the Auditor for second quarter of 1901.

4. Read memorandum No. 68, dated July 5, 1901, from the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province forwarding copy of letter dated July 1, 1901, addressed to him by the Colonial Secretary, respecting the cost of widening the bridge near the Library.

The Chairman stated that the bridge had been widened temporarily in anticipation of the recent Royal visit, and it was now proposed to carry out the work permanently.

It was resolved that the Government Agent be informed that the Municipal Council will be prepared to contribute one-third of the estimated cost of widening the bridge ; that it be pointed out that the bridge is situated on a main thoroughfare.

5. Report by the Special Committee appointed on January 19, 1901, on proposed additional rules and regulations respecting water service.

Resolved,—That consideration of the report stand over for a fuller Meeting.

6. In accordance with notice, Mr. P. T. Habeeboo Lebbe asked the following questions :—

7. In the absence of Mr. Beven, it was resolved that the notice of motion for the appointment of a Special Committee to devise a scheme for recovering market rents stand over for next Meeting.

8. The following recommendations of the Standing Committee were submitted :—

- (a) That the land known as Wahalewela, and situated at Getambe, be registered as a burial ground.
- (b) That an annual retainer of Rs. 31.50 be paid to Mr. H. P. Borrett, Solicitor and Proctor.

Resolved,—That the recommendations be adopted.

9. Read report by the Inspector of the district on the insanitary state of a cesspit on premises Nos. 400-403, Trincomalee street, owned by Pina Veda Henaya, and recommendation by the Health Officer that the cesspit be closed and a dry-earth closet substituted.

Resolved,—That special authority be granted to the Chairman, in accordance with section 209 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, as amended by section 33 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, to require the owner of premises Nos. 400-403, Trincomalee street, to empty, disinfect, and close the cesspit on the said premises and to substitute a dry-earth closet therefor.
