## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, August 31, 1901, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with notice dated August 27.

*Present*:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; Dr. J. Craib; P. T. Habibu Lebbe, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on July 20 were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1900 to July 31, 1901, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by several Inspectors during, the month of July.

Resolved,—That the several statements, together with the Minutes, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during July and register.

4. Read letter dated August 14 from the Auditor, reporting that he had examined the books for last month and found them correctly posted and in order.

5. Read petition from certain residents praying that the additional levy of one per cent. be removed, and that a graduated scale may be adopted in respect of night soil charges.

Resolved,—That the petition and connected papers be circulated and submitted at the next Meeting.

6. The following questions were put by Mr. Habibu Lebbe, in accordance with notice given:—

(1) If police assessment tax and water-rate are charged and brought to account on the yearly income of the Municipal market, cooly lines, cattle sheds, and other buildings and lands belonging to or taken on rent or lease by the Council?

*Reply*.—No assessment tax or water-rate has been so charged.

(2) Whether rice required for Municipal coolies, bricks, lime, cement, and timber required for Municipal works, are purchased on contracts entered into yearly or at ruling rates in the market?

*Reply*.—Usually purchased at market rates.

(3) Whether the following articles and tools required for Municipal works are purchased on contracts entered into yearly or from the Council store or from private stores, if the prices paid are cheaper than the quotation given by the Controller of Government Stores in his price lists, viz., paints, oils, mamoties, pickaxes, baskets, water buckets, crowbars, axes, saws, and other tools, gunpowder, steel bars, jumpers, sledges, and hammers.

*Reply*.—Most of the articles named, such as tools, paints, jumpers, hammers, are imported from England. Blasting powder purchased locally, as required; one consignment obtained from Colombo by way of trial. Municipalities not authorized to obtain articles from the Government Stores, unless the articles required are not obtainable in the local market, and then on payment of 30 per cent. in addition to the prices of the Government Stores.

7. In accordance with notice, Mr. Beven proposed, Mr. Vanderwall seconded—That a Special Committee be appointed to devise a scheme for recovering market rents due to the Council on days when the grounds of the market are occupied by vendors of produce, and that the following Members of the Council be Members of the Committee:—Messrs. Sproule, Gibbon, Habibu Lebbe, and Beven.

The Chairman put the motion to the Meeting and declared it carried.

8. In pursuance of notice, Mr. Habibu Lebbe moved, Mr. Beven seconded.—That assessors be directed to assess for the current year the bulk petroleum store and the building used by the Colombo Gas and Water Company, Limited, as their generating station at Kandy.

On suggestion of the seconder, Mr. Habibu Lebbe amended the motion by omitting all the words after "petroleum store."

The Chairman pointed out that in terms of the written agreement with the Company they were to occupy the premises "exempt from taxation ordinary payable."

The motion, as amended, was carried as follows:—That assessors be directed to assess for the current year the bulk petroleum store.

9. In accordance with notice, Mr. Habibu Lebbe moved, Mr. Beven seconded—That steps be taken to verify all movable property belonging to the Municipal Council.

Resolved,—That the verification be made in January, and that it be left to the Chairman to arrange.

10. Read the following recommendation by the Standing Committee:—That the land at the villages of Mavilmada and Siyambalagastenna (reported on by Kobbekaduwe Ratamahatmaya and the Health Officer) be acquired for purposes of a burial place for these villagers.

Resolved,—That the recommendation be adopted.

11. Read recommendations by the Health Officer that owing to the unsatisfactory and insanitary state the cesspits on the following premises, viz., cesspit common to premises Nos. 986 to 991, Peradeniya road, cesspit common on premises 252, Colombo street, be closed and dry-earth closets substituted.

Resolved—That special authority be granted to the Chairman, in accordance with section 209 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, as amended by section 33 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, to require the owners of premises Nos. 986–991, Peradeniya road, and 252, Colombo street, to empty, disinfect, and close the cesspits on the said several premises and to substitute dry-earth closets therefor.
