"Until further notice all the lights on the coasts and harbours of the Archipelago will be extinguished except the light at Cape Melville. Neutral vessels bound to Manila will take a Pilot at the Corrigidor to avoid dangers in the narrows."

Persian Gulf—Kuweit Harbour—Shoal North-eastward of Ras al Ajuza.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 250 of 1898) that information has been received from Commander C. J. Baker, H.M.S. Sphinx, dated March 30, 1898, of the existence of a patch, with a depth of 3 fathoms on it, situated in a position with the north-eastern extremity of Ras al Ajuza, bearing S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., distant $2\frac{7}{10}$ miles; and extremity of Ras al Arz S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.

Approximate position: lat. $29^{\circ} 24' 50''$ N., long. $48^{\circ} 4' E$.

Also, that from the entrance of Kuweit harbour up to the anchorage considerably less water was found than

shown on the plan, and a note to that effect has been placed on the plan.

China Sea—Tong King Gulf—Kuai Shin Mun—Shoal southward of In Chi Shan.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 256 of 1898) that the Commander of the despatch vessel *Alouette* reports having obtained soundings on a sandy shoal, over which the water is discoloured, about $1\frac{1}{2}$ cable in extent east and west, with a depth of 9 ft. on it at low water springs, situated in a position with the northern point of Singes island bearing S. 83° W., distant $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles; and western extreme In Chi Shan N. 15° W.

Approximate position on Chart No. 776: lat. $21^{\circ} 14' 15''$ N., long. $107^{\circ} 45' 20''$ E.

Australia, East Coast—Pioneer River—New entrance.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 118, dated May 9 last, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 259 of 1898) that the breach made in the east point spit is beaconed and lighted, and that the old entrance is no longer marked.

The Fairway buoy is moored in 3 fathoms off the edge of shoal water, and lies with Slade islet bearing north and Flat Top island S.E., distant 5 cables. Beacons painted white mark the new channel into the river, but it is inadvisable to enter without local knowledge. At night fixed white lights are shown from the beacons.

Approximate position, Flat Top island: lat. $21^{\circ} 9\frac{1}{2}'$ S., long. $149^{\circ} 15'$ E.

China East—Korea, West Coast—Rock in Flying-fish Channel.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 265 of 1898) of the existence of a rock in Flying-fish channel, approach to Chemulpho.

This rock, which dries 8 ft. at low water, lies with Button islet, bearing N. 42° W., distant $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables, and the summit of Clumb islet S. 3° W.

Approximate position: lat. $37^{\circ} 11' 45''$ N., long. $126^{\circ} 12' 45''$ E.
