*China Sea—Tong King Gulf—Pakkoi Approach—
Shoals reported.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 546 of 1898) that a shoal with 10 ft. on its southern end and

extending N.N.E. for about 2 miles, is reported to exist with the south extreme of Kwantau point bearing N. 5° W., distant 13½ miles, and the summit of Guie chau S. 20° W., or approximately in lat 21° 17' N., long. 109 13' E.

Also, that a shoal, situated 2 or 3 miles eastward of Pak fu tau sha, and locally known as Ti sha, was observed breaking.
