Notice is hereby given that the above lighthouse, situated on the west bank at the entrance to the Kowie river, in latitude 33° 36' south, and longitude 26° 54' east, near Port Alfred, in the division of Bathurst, Cape Colony, will be removed, and the light will cease to be exhibited after December 31, 1898.

China—Yang tse Kiang—Shaweishan or North Channel— Light established at Drinkwater Point.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 570 of 1898) that a light is now established on Drinkwater point,

Shaweishan or North channel, Yang tse Kiang. Drinkwater point light is a group flashing white light showing two flashes in quick succession every twenty seconds, elevated 89 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 15 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric of the fourth order.

The lighthouse is an iron screw pile structure, 93 ft. in height, painted in alternate black and white horizontal bands, situated 332 yards N. 45° W. from the Drinkwater point beacon.

Approximate position : lat. 31° 27′ 50″ N., long. 121° 48′ 45″ E.

Pacific Ocean—Tonga Islands—Coral Patch South-Eastward of Nomuka Island.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 574 of 1898) of the existence of a coral patch south-eastward of Nomuka island.

This coral patch extends about 150 yards north and south, has a least depth of 21 ft. over it with 18 fathoms around, and lies approximately in lat. 20° 16' 55" S., long. 174° 43' 45" W.

China Sea-Hainan Island, East Coast-Sunken Rock Southward of Tonkon Point.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 575 of 1898) that the rock on which the British steamship Lorne struck, and subsequently foundered in the year 1888, has been discovered, and lies with mount Tonkon, bearing N. $4\frac{1}{3}^{\circ}$ W., distant 12 miles, and Chun lan fort N. 71° W.

Approximate position : lat. 19° 27′ 50″ N., long. 110° 59′ 15″ E.

Variation, $1\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ easterly in 1898.

Pacific Ocean—Fiji Islands—Kandavu—Great Astrolabe Reef—Rocks near 1 ambu Island.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 576 of 1898) of the existence of the under-mentioned rocks near Yambu island, Great Astrolabe reef, Kandavu island :----

1. A rock awash at low water with 5 fathoms close around lies with the south-west end of Yambu island, bearing E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., distant $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables, or approximately in lat 18° 50′ 50″ S., long. 178° 30 10″ E.

2. A circular coral patch, about 50 yards in diameter, with less than 6 ft. over it at low water, lies with the south-west end of Yambu island, bearing N. 63° E., distant 4 cables, or approximately in lat. 18° 50' 55" S., long. 178° 30 0" E.

3. A coral patch, about one cable in length N.N.W. and S.S.E., having a knoll of less than 6 ft. water at each end and from $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 fathoms between, lies with the south-west end of Yambu island, bearing N. 50° E., distant half a mile, or in approximately lat. 18° 51′ 5″ S., long. 178° 29′ 50″ E.

Variation, 10° easterly in 1898.
