Pacific Ocean—Tonga Islands—Vavan Group—Neiafu Harbour—Shoal on the Bar.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 582 of 1898) that information has been received from Captain A. M. Field, H. M. Surveying Ship Penguin, that a depth of 3 fathoms has been found on Neiafu bar with sandy point bearing S. 75° E., distant 336 yards, or 70 yards north-westward of the leading beacons in line.

This indicates that Neiafu bar is not now in the position shown on the Chart.

Approximate position: lat. 18° 39' 0" S., long. 174° 0' 15" W.

Variation, 9½° easterly in 1898.

India, West—Malabar Coast—Arc of Illumination of Hangarkota Light.

In continuation of Notice to Mariners No. 180, dated August 20, 1898, issued by this office, the Acting Presidency Port Officer, Madras, has given further notice that the arc of illumination of Hangarkota light is as follows:—

Visible from all points at sea, except when between the bearings of (magnetic) north and N. 6° E., N. 12° E. and N. 15° E., and on the bearings of N. 19½° E.

Obscured by Saint Mary's isles, also obscured from south to S. 9° E. by cocoanut trees.

Australia—Brisbane River—Leading Marks and New Red Buoy for New Cutting above Lytton.

The Port Master, Brisbane, has given notice (No. 17 of 1898) that the old pair of leading beacons and lights above Lytton have been removed, and that the new dredged cutting there is marked as follows:—

A pair of white triangular beacons on the first mangrove islet above Lytton and a pair of post lights near

Lytton wharf mark the downstream portion of the cutting, and a pair of triangular beacons on the Lytton flats, carrying lights at night, mark the upper portion, a red buoy being placed at the turn in the cutting.

Directions.—A vessel ascending the river must, after passing Lytton wharf, bring in line a pair of triangular beacons bearing S. 29° W. in line ahead, or a pair of lights at night must be brought in line astern bearing N. 29° E., and keep them so until another pair of beacons bearing N. 58° E., carrying lights at night, come in line astern, passing a red buoy on the starboard hand.

This last lead passes 300 ft. off the Queensland Meat Export Company's wharf, and may be kept until the latter is neared, when proceed as hitherto.

A plan of the locality may be seen at the Harbour Master's Office.

*New Zealand, North Island—East Cape—Light on
East Cape Island.*

The following extract from the *New Zealand Gazette*, dated October 6, 1898, is republished:—

Notice is hereby given that about the month of August, 1899, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse now being erected on East Cape island, near East Cape, in lat. 37° 40' S. and long. 178° 36' E., as measured from the Admiralty Chart. The light will be 362 ft. above the level of the sea at high water, and will be a second order dioptric light, revolving to show a white flash at intervals of every ten seconds.

The light will be seen seaward over an arc of 280 degrees of the horizon (or as far round as the land will allow), and in ordinary clear weather it will be visible twenty-two nautical miles from the deck of a vessel 15 ft. above sea level.

Further particulars, together with the date of lighting, will be given in a future notice.
