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MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Town Hall on Friday, May 13, 1898.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated May 7, 1898.

Present :-- Mr. W. E. Davidson, Chairman; Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten; Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper; Dr. A. Perry; Mr. Stanley Bois; Hon. Mr. A. de A. Seneviratna; Mr. C. Perera; Mr. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. Walter Pereira ; and Mr. Arthur Alvis.

The Minutes of April 22, 1898, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,-That the Minutes of April 22, 1898, be confirmed.

1. The following recommendations from the Standing Committee of April 25 and May 4, 1898, were laid before the Council :-

MONDAY, APRIL 25, 1898.

 - (i.) That the Tramways Company shall pay the whole cost of the renewal of the roadway between tramposts when the tramposts are erected in the old metal roadway.

(97) Draft agreement with reference to laying electric main by the Colombo Gas Company from Gas- works to the Grand Oriental Hotel.	 (ii.) That the Tramways Company shall pay two-thirds of the cost of the renewal of the road between the outer rails and the line of the tramposts when the tramposts stand outside the edge of the old metalled area. The Municipal Council shall pay one-third of the cost. (iii.) The Municipal Council shall pay the whole cost of the renewal or raising rendered necessary to the portion of the roadway lying between the tramposts and the ditch or drain or road. (97) The leave should now be granted to the Colombo Gas and Water Company to proceed with their main under ground by either route specified by the Chairman in his letter No. 20 of February 15, 1898, other than the Main street route, and that the draft agreement do embody the regulations regarding the breaking up of streets
	required in laying gas mains. The agreement so drawn up shall be submitted to Council.

Mr. A. Alvis seconded.—Carried. The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper and Mr. S. Bois dissenting.

Civil Medical Officer, Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten, Mr. F. H. Grinlinton, Hon. Mr. A. de A. Seneviratna, Mr. C. Perera, Mr. P. Coomaraswamy, Mr. C. P. Dias, and Mr. Arthur Alvis-three Members to form a quorum.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on May 14, 1898, at 1.30 p.m.

Present :- The Chairman; C. A. Lovegrove, Esq.; Dr. J. Attygalle; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G.; Chevalier W. Abeyasundera,; D. G. Gunawardena, Esq.; W. E. de Vos, Esq.; N. Dias Abeyasinha, Esq.; C. L. M. Abdul Carim, Esq.; and C. P. Hayley, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of last Meeting.

2. Read letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, dated March 28, 1898, forwarding copy of a letter from the Principal Collector of Customs reporting on the hospital and other accommodation proposed for plague patients at Galle ; also letter dated May 4 to the Government Agent forwarded for the information of the Council, intimating that Government will undertake cost of acquisition of 2 acres of land at Dadalla for plague hospital. By leave of Council Mr. C. P. Hayley moved "that this Council do protest against the action of Government in deciding to send all vessels infected or suggested of being infected with plague to Galle and respectfully request

in deciding to send all vessels infected or suspected of being infected with plague to Galle, and respectfully request that a less populous place be selected. If Government still decides to pursue that policy, this Council expects that all expenses connected therewith—*i.e.*, the entire cost of erection of buildings and of the preparations for reception and the maintenance of plague patients—should be borne by Government." Seconded by Mr. C. L. M. Abdul Carim.—Carried. The Chairman and Mr. C. A. Lovegrove notified their dissent from the first part of this resolution, but

supported the latter part thereof.

3. In terms of section 176 (a) (1) of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, the Council empowered the Chairman to cause walls made of inflammable materials in the following houses to be removed :--No. 19, Lighthouse street, Fort ; 5, Rampart street, Fort ; 177, Dangedara ; 140, Mahamodara ; 173, Mahamodara.

4. The vacancy caused in the Standing Committee by the departure of Mr. H. E. H. Hayes was filled up by the election of Mr. C. A. Lovegrove.

(b) From Colonial Secretary, No. 17 of April 15, forwarding certain forms applied for.
(c) From Colonial Secretary, No. 18 of April 28, stating in reply to the Council's request that the amounts received by Government from the sale of Crown lands now forming Fairieland, &c., should be deducted from the loan to be granted for acquisition of lands within the reservoir basin, that there seems to be no ground for treating the

Amendment.—Proposed by Mr. A. Philip, seconded by Dr. Keyt, that Messrs. W. D. Gibbon and C. Vanderwall

be appointed a Special Committee to draft a reply.

(d) From Colonial Secretary, No. 19 of May 6, stating that the application of the Council for the establishment of road toll at Katugastota is under consideration.

(e) From Colonial Secretary, No. 20 of May 6, with reference to application for pension from Mr. Van Twest,

pointing out that the certificate of a second medical practitioner is required. (f) From Colonial Secretary, No. 21 of May 7, stating that an Ordinance to amend section 160 of "The Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1887," so as to enable a Municipal Council to enter into a contract in respect of electric lighting, will be brought before the Legislative Council.

(g) From Colonial Secretary, No. 22 of May 9, stating that the by-laws relative to removal of night soil have been sanctioned.

(h) From Colonial Secretary, No. 23 of May 9, requesting the Chairman to nominate a Member of the Council to serve on a Committee which the Governor has decided to appoint to inquire into the sanitary state of

Kandy. The Chairman intimated that he had nominated Mr. J. H. Sproule, the Senior Unofficial Member, as a Member of the Committee.

(j) From Colonial Secretary, No. 24 of May 13, stating that the Military authorities have not yet acceded to the request to grant a portion of the hospital grounds for widening the road round the lake; also memorandum dated May 11, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of letter No. 651 to the Director of Public Works respecting improvement of that portion of Victoria Director adjustic to a state of the Victoria Secretary.

May 11, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of letter No. 651 to the Director of Fublic works respecting improvement of that portion of Victoria Drive adjoining the premises of the Military hospital.
On motion of Mr. L. Creasy, seconded by Mr. A. Philip, it was resolved that the Chairman do inform the Colonial Secretary that the two drains will be altered in accordance with the wishes of the Military authorities, and that any wall required will be built, and that it be requested that the land may be handed over as soon as possible. On being put to the Meeting the motion was carried.

Reply — The letter was first placed before the Special Committee appointed to draw up a reply to the Colonial Secretary's letter No. 2 of January 20 on the sanitary condition of Kandy, and was laid before the Municipal Council, with the Special Committee's report, at the Meeting held on April 3, 1898.

11. In accordance with notice, Mr. Philip drew attention to the Health Officer's report for February, 1898, under the headings Public Latrines, Kachcheri Latrines and their Drainage, New Dry-earth Latrines, Alleys, and asked that an explanatory memorandum be read as to the steps actually taken to deal with the specific complaints made by the Health Officer.

The Chairman replied : The public latrines are in charge of the Health Officer, who explains that the night soil was not properly removed in February, as the coolies were for a time practically on strike. The difficulty has now ceased. The new latrines were used before they were ready notwithstanding the entrances to them were blocked. The subject of the Kachoheri latrines and drains the Government Agent has brought before Government. New bylaws have been passed, which will enable the Council to deal with the latrines in the alleys and the removal of night soil from them.

12. In accordance with notice Mr. Philip inquired, with reference to the Minute No. 19 of the General Meeting on March 19, 1898, what steps have been taken with a view to the sale without delay of the dynamometer engine and boiler belonging the Municipal Council.

Reply.-Inquiry has been made for purchasers, but without success. This dynamo-meter and engine, &c., will now be advertised for sale.

13. In pursuance of notice Mr. Philip inquired, with reference to printed copy of a Supplemental Budget No. 4 for 1897, which has been circulated, whether it is not ultra vires, the Standing Committee for 1897 being functus officio.

Reply .- The Supplemental Budget in question has been passed by the Standing Committee for 1898, and not by the Standing Committee for 1897.

14. Proposed by Mr. A. Philip, seconded by Mr. W. D. Gibbon, that the Health Officer's recent reports to the Chairman regarding dairies and laundries be read; and that a Special Committee of the Municipal Council be appointed to draw up regulations to be issued, when approved under Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of the chapters relating to the supervision and regulation of dairies and the supervision and regulation of laundries. where the real sector

The motion on being put to the Meeting was carried. Resolved,—That Dr. F. Keyt and Mr. A. Philip be appointed a Special Committee, and that the reports be circulated.

15. In accordance with notice Mr A. Philip drew attention to the non-publication in the *Government Gazette* up to date of the Minutes of Proceedings of the General Meeting held on March 19, 1898, while the Minutes of the Special Meetings held in March and April have been published, and moved that the attention of Government be drawn to the omission with a view to its being remedied forthwith. This was seconded by Mr. C. Vanderwall. The Chairman stated that the Secretary had been informed unofficially that the Minutes would be published

in the Gazette of Friday, the 20th instant. Mr. Philip, however, pressed the motion, which on being put to the Council was carried.

16. In accordance with notice the Chairman moved, and Mr. E. Beven seconded, that Mr. L. Creasy be appointed to the Special Committee on (1) water supply and (2) latrines for alleys, additional depôts for rubbish and night soil, in place of Mr. MacDonnell. - 1 . N

The motion was carried nem. con.

17. The Meeting then proceeded to elect by ballot a Member of the Standing Committee in place of Mr. MacDonnell.

On scrutinizing the votes the Chairman declared that Mr. L. Creasy had been elected.

18. The Chairman submitted the report by the Special Committee appointed to consider the Jubilee celebration accounts.

19. Supplemental Budget No. 4 for 1897, as approved by the Standing Committee, was laid on the table, and on motion of the Chairman passed, (Appendix A).

20. The Chairman submitted his Annual Administration Report for 1897.

Proposed by Mr. A. Philip, seconded by Mr. E Beven, that the report be referred to a Special Committee with instructions to suggest observations to be appended thereto, in terms of section 80 (c) of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, and that the Members of the Committee be Messrs. E. Beven, C. Vanderwall, R. W. Jonklass, and A. Philip. On being put to the Meeting the motion was carried.

Health Report for April, 1898.

Water Supply.—The remaining portion of the land from which the water supply comes not yet having been purchased the water supply is still open to sources of pollution. Latrines.-The public latrines have been kept in a sanitary condition during the month. Latrines attached to District Court were in a most insanitary condition when I inspected them. I reported especially about them. Dry-earth Latrines in Alleys.—Considering the number of the alleys, only very few of these latrines have been built. The ones built were constructed according to no sanitary rules, nor under the supervision of any proper authority. I did not see dry-earth or antiseptics in use in any of them, the ones I saw were filthy. Night Soil Depôt at Katugastota.-This place was kept in a sanitary state. Scavenging .- Scavenging of Kandy was extremely badly done during the month. Alleys.-The alleys are overcrowded, badly ventilated, and disgracefully drained. Laundries .- At Ampitiya latrines are urgently required for the laundries, also at Deyannewela. The dhobie have whitewashed some of their houses. New washing places in various parts of the town are urgently required I still think the laundries are very far from being in a sanitary condition. Public Market.—This building is not in a sanitary state. I stated my reasons for saying so in a special report to the Chairman on May 6, 1898. . Dairies.-As a rule, the dairies have been kept in a sanitary state. Bakeries.-All the bakeries in Kandy are now in a sanitary condition. Gala Stands are all in a sanitary condition, or are being made so, except those in the cooly lines at Mahaiyawa, where there is no attempt made to carry out the by-laws. Cooly Lines have been kept fairly clean. The cattle stands and gala sheds in them are the worst in Kandy. Fish Boutiques.--Much rotten fish was found exposed for sale during April. Several boutique owners were heavily fined. Slaughter Houses .- These buildings were kept in a sanitary state during April. Cattle.-I had great difficulty in getting the butchers to produce cattle and sheep suitable for being slaughtered, and I had daily to reject large numbers. Infectious Diseases. - Chickenpox was extremely prevalent in the Police barracks during April. I sent the Chairman a special report concerning the sanitary condition of these barracks. Drainage.-The drainage of Kandy is disgraceful. W. HALLARAN, Surgeon Captain, A.M.S., Kandy, May 8, 1898. Health Officer.
