*China—Pe chi li Gulf—Sha lui tien Island—Decreased depth to the Eastward.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 522 of 1898) that the Master of the ss. Yung Ping reports having on June 22, 1898, obtained a depth of 2½ fathoms at half ebb about 15 miles eastward of Sha lui tien island, on the bank marked on the Admiralty Charts "7 to 9 fathoms."

A note to this effect has been placed on the Admiralty Charts.

Approximate position: lat. 38° 57' 30" N., long. 118° 50' 30" E.

*China—Yang tse kiang—Shaweishan Island—Soundings to the Northward.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 524 of 1898) that soundings of 1½ and 2 fathoms have been obtained with Shaweishan lighthouse bearing S. 10° E., distant about 4 miles, or approximately in lat. 31° 29½' N., long. 122° 13' E.

The three-fathom and five-fathom lines extend about 1½ and 3¼ miles respectively eastward of this position.
